AN ACT to legalise the use of the Totalisator under certain circumstances.

[Assented to, 3rd November, 1883.]

WHEREAS it is expedient, under certain circumstances, to legalise the use of the Totalisator: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THAT from and after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for any *bonâ fide* Club established for the purpose of promoting horse-racing, and for any person or persons duly authorised by any such Club, to have, use, and play with, on the race-course of such Club, during the days of any race-meeting, the instrument known as the Totalisator.

2. THIS Act may be cited as "The Totalisator Act, 1883."

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.

MINUTE.

To the Honorable the Colonial Secretary,—

In connection with the Bill for the legalisation of the "Totalisator," passed during the late Session of the Legislative Council, I have, as I promised the Council, made inquiries as to the use of that machine on race-courses in other colonies. I find that the Totalisator, though recently prohibited in South Australia—where it had for some years been allowed—is legally used on race-courses in other parts of this continent, as well as in colonies and communities under British Government elsewhere.

I find that, whether legally or not, the Totalisator has been allowed on the Perth Race-course; and the Superintendent of Police informs me that, in his opinion, "its use has led to no harmful results."

The Bill is not a measure which the Government would have brought forward; but it has received the sanction of the Legislature, and looking to the circumstances above stated, I do not feel called upon to disallow it.

I have therefore assented to the Bill. Should experience of its operation prove unfavorable, no doubt the Legislative Council will be ready to repeal it.

CHAPTER 30.

AN ACT to authorise Companies registered under the Companies Act, 1862, to keep Local Registers of their Members in British Colonies. [20th August, 1883.]

WHEREAS many companies registered under the Companies Act, 1862, carry on business in British colonies, and dealings in their shares are frequent in such colonies, but delay, inconvenience, and expense are occasioned by reason of the absence of any legal provision for keeping local registers of members, and it is expedient that such provisions as this Act contains be made in that behalf:

Be it therefore enacted, by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Short Title and Construction.

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as the Companies (Colonial Registers) Act, 1883; and this Act shall,

so far as is consistent with the tenor thereof, be construed as one with the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1880, and the said Acts and this Act may be referred to as the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1883.

Definitions.

2. In this Act the term "company" means a company registered under the Companies Act, 1862, and having a capital divided into shares; the term "shares" includes stock; the term "colony" does not include any place within the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, but includes such territories as may for the time being be vested in Her Majesty by virtue of an Act of Parliament for the government of India, and any plantation, territory, or settlement situate elsewhere within Her Majesty's dominions.

Power for companies to keep colonial registers.

3. (1.) Any company whose objects comprise the transaction of business in a colony may, if authorised so to do by its regulations, as originally framed or as altered by special resolution, cause to be kept in any colony in which it transacts business a branch register or registers of members resident in such colony.

(2.) The company shall give to the registrar of joint stock companies notice of the situation of the office where any such branch register (in this Act called a colonial register) is kept, and of any change therein, and of the discontinuance of any such office in the event of the same being discontinued.

(3.) A colonial register shall, as regards the particulars entered therein, be deemed to be a part of the company's register of members, and shall be *prima facie* evidence of all particulars entered therein. Any such register shall be kept in the manner provided by the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1880, with this qualification, that the advertisement mentioned in section thirty-three of the Companies Act, 1862, shall be inserted in some newspaper circulating in the district wherein the register to be closed is kept, and that any competent court in the colony where such register is kept shall be entitled to exercise the same jurisdiction of rectifying the same as is by section thirty-five of the Companies Act, 1862, vested, as respects a register, in England and Ireland in Her Majesty's superior courts of law or equity, and that all offences under section thirty-two of the Companies Act, 1862, may, as regards a colonial register, be prosecuted summarily before any tribunal in the colony where such register is kept having summary criminal jurisdiction.

(4.) The company shall transmit to its registered office a copy of every entry in its colonial register or registers as soon as may be after such entry is made, and the company shall cause to be kept at its registered office, duly entered up from time to time, a duplicate or duplicates of its colonial register or registers. The provisions of section thirty-two of the Companies Act, 1862, shall apply to every such duplicate, and every such duplicate shall, for all the purposes of the Companies Acts, 1862 to 1880, be deemed to be part of the register of members of the company.

(5.) Subject to the provisions of this Act with respect to the duplicate register, the shares registered in a colonial register shall be distinguished from the shares registered in the principal register, and no transaction with respect to any shares registered in a colonial register shall, during the continuance of the registration of such shares in such colonial register, be registered in any other register.

(6.) The company may discontinue to keep any colonial register, and thereupon all entries in that register shall be transferred to some other colonial register kept by the company in the same colony, or to the register of members kept at the registered office of the company.

(7.) In relation to stamp duties the following provisions shall have effect:—

(a.) An instrument of transfer of a share registered in a colonial register under this Act shall be deemed to be a transfer of property situated out of the United Kingdom, and unless executed in any part of the United Kingdom shall be exempt from British stamp duty.

(b.) Upon the death of a member registered in a colonial register under this Act, the share or other interest of the deceased member shall for the purposes of this Act so far as relates to British duties be deemed to be part of his estate and effects situated in the United Kingdom for or in respect of which probate or letters of administration is or are to be granted, or whereof an inventory is to be exhibited and recorded in like manner as if he were registered in the register of members kept at the registered office of the company.

(8.) Subject to the provisions of this Act, any company may, by its regulations as originally framed, or as altered by special resolution, make such provisions as it may think fit respecting the keeping of colonial registers.

NORTH ISLAND—HAURAKI GULF.

(1) **MOKO HINOUI ISLANDS—FLASHING LIGHT ON BURGESS ISLET.**

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 165 (2), of 21st June 1883 on the postponement of the exhibition of the light from a lighthouse in course of construction on Burgess islet, Moko Hinou islands, northern entrance to Hauraki gulf; and of a red sector to be shown from Tiri Tiri lighthouse.

The Government of New Zealand has given further Notice, that on the 18th June 1883, the light would be exhibited from Burgess islet:

The light is a *flashing white light*, showing a flash every ten seconds, elevated 385 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of 26 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the first order.

The lighthouse is 46 feet high, and painted white.

Position, lat. 35° 55' 15" S., long. 175° 8' 47" E.

(2) **RED SECTOR FROM TIRI TIRI LIGHTHOUSE.**

Also gives Notice, that on 18th June 1883, a red sector of about 23 would be shown from the light on Tiri Tiri island, between the bearings S. ¼ E. and S.S.E. ¼ E.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 13½° Easterly in 1883.)

The following information relating to portions of the northern coast of Australia; and to reefs in the Arafura sea, is derived from various sources, 1881-2.

[All bearings are Magnetic. Variation 2½° Easterly in 1883.]

TIMOR LAUT.—Bajar Sadie reef.—This reef, over which there is a depth of 4 feet at spring tides, lies with the south-west point of Timor Laut bearing S. 68° E., the north extreme of Siera island N. 52° E., and the west extreme of Selu island, N. 9° E.*

About 3 miles southward of this reef, depths of from 7½ to 10 fathoms, coral bottom, were obtained.

WATERGENS REEF, having a depth of 3½ fathoms over it, lies with the west extreme of Siera island bearing S. 44° E., and the east extreme of Soekler island bearing N. 80° E.*

MERAPI REEF.—This reef, 3 miles long in a N.N.W. and S.S.E. direction, and one mile wide, consists of rocks which partly dry at low water, and lies with East point of Timor Laut bearing N.N.W. ¼ W., and the southernmost high land northward of Lavera (Laoura) S.W. by W. ¼ W. †

DUNDAS STRAIT.—Renard Reef.—Captain Sinclair, of the steam-vessel *Claude Hamilton*, reports this reef to lie with the north-east extreme of Cape Keith bearing N. by E., distant about 8 miles, and a peaked hill on Melville island bearing W. ¼ N. †

CLARENCE STRAIT.—Beacon.—A beacon, 41 feet high, pyramidal in shape and painted white, is erected upon Charles point, western side of entrance to port Darwin. †

Buoys.—A large cheese-shaped buoy, having pyramidal open frame work surmounted by a ball, and painted black, is moored in 17 fathoms off the north-west extremity of Henry Ellis reef.

A buoy similarly shaped, and painted red, marks the end of the spit extending to the westward from the south-west point of East Vernon island. ‡

WHEREAS the attention of His Excellency the Governor has lately been drawn to the fact that certain vessels are in the habit of navigating the waters near the coast of Western Australia without carrying or showing at night the lights required by law to be carried and shown by such vessels; And whereas great danger of collisions has arisen from this neglect: Notice is hereby given, that no vessel will be permitted to clear out or proceed to sea from any of the ports or harbors of the Colony unless such vessel shall be provided with proper lights; and that if any vessel shall be found at night not carrying and showing the proper lights required as aforesaid, the master or owner of such vessel will be duly prosecuted according to law.

Timber Licenses for Special Area on the Darling Range.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to order and direct, in virtue of the powers vested in him, that all that portion of Crown Land situate in the Swan District, and bounded on the Westward by the Western face of the Darling Range; on the Northward by the Newcastle Road; on the Eastward by Worrioolo Brook, and by a line running South from near where the said Brook crosses the Northam Road to the Helena River; and on the South by the Helena River—shall be subject, in so far as the felling, cutting, splitting, and removing of timber is concerned, to the following Regulations.

Within the above defined area a block of 3 square miles will be retained by the Crown specially for the use of persons engaged cutting up timber by hand, commonly known as "Pit Sawyers."

REGULATIONS.

1. Applications will be received at the Crown Lands' Office for special licenses to cut over timber forest lots fronting on the railway or otherwise. Lots fronting on the railway shall have a mean breadth of one mile or thereabouts, and a mean depth of three miles or thereabouts. Upon approval of an application, the lot comprised therein will be offered by Public Auction.

2. The conditions of sale shall be:—

(a) An upset rent of £100 per annum, for a term of 14 years for each lot.

(b) The Crown to reserve the right to reserve or sell any portion not exceeding one sixth of the area let, on giving two months notice of the intention so to do; and further to reserve the right to reserve or sell the whole or any portion beyond the one-sixth before stated, on giving twelve months notice of the intention so to do; provided, however, that such notice shall be in writing, and that during the said terms of two months or twelve months the licensee shall be at liberty to remove the timber from the land to be reserved or sold.

3. Applications for licenses, under Clause 110 of the Land Regulations, for permission to fell, cut, split, and remove timber from Crown Lands within the beforenamed area, upon land not included in any reserve, or in any special license, shall only be received at the Crown Lands Office, Perth, and shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) All logs felled shall be cut across into one or more lengths, and not merely felled and left with the top and branches on.

(b) All logs so cut across shall be removed to the mill, or to a platform alongside the Railway, or, in the event of the person felling being a person engaged "Pit sawing," to his sawpit, within one month from the date of felling.

(c) Any breach of the above regulations, besides being punishable under Act 36 Vic. No. 8, shall also render the license of the offender, together with any timber remaining unremoved, liable to forfeiture; and a renewal of the license shall not be granted except on the special approval of the Governor.

4. Present holders of licenses to cut timber on Waste Crown Lands, issued under Clause 110 of the Land Regulations, shall be permitted, upon application, to cut within the area to which these regulations apply; but subject, nevertheless, to the foregoing conditions and regulations.

5. The Land Regulations of the 11th October, 1882, shall be held to apply to the beforementioned area, in so far as the said Regulations are not inconsistent with the present Regulations.
