AUSTRALIA-EAST COAST.

PORT JACKSON-LEADING LIGHTS FOR EAST CHANNEL.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 36 (1), of 21st February, 1882, on the exhibition of leading lights from lighthouses erected in the vicinity of Vaucluse bay, eastern side of entrance to Port Jackson.

Information has been received, that the above-mentioned lighthouses are situated on the following bearings:—

Southern lighthouse—with Outer South Head lighthouse bearing N. 58° 20' E., distant 6 and 6-10ths cables.

Northern lighthouse—with Outer South Head lighthouse bearing S. $74^9\,40'$ E., distant 6 and 3-10ths cables.

The lighthouses, each exhibiting a fixed red light, kept in line bearing S. ½ E., lead through the eastern channel, which has been dredged, in not less than 27 feet at low water spring tides.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 9° 10' Easterly in 1883.)

SUNKEN ROCK OFF PINE ISLETS, NORTHUMBERLAND GROUP.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a sunken danger ("Edith Rock") has been reported by Mr. Till—who lives on No. 2 Percy Island—to lie about 1 mile N.W. \(\frac{1}{2} \) N. from the extreme N.E. point of the Pine Islets, and with that point in line with the first high hill North of Hixson Point.

At low-water springs, the rock has only 2 feet of water over it, with 10 fathoms alongside to the northward. It is about 60 feet across the top, and slopes away to the southward.

This danger is in the track of vessels from the northward beating up to the anchorage under No. 2 Percy Island, and there are indications of more foul ground further to the northward.

HEREAS the attention of His Excellency the WW Governor has lately been drawn to the fact that certain vessels are in the habit of navigating the waters near the coast of Western Australia without carrying or showing at night the lights required by law to be carried and shown by such vessels; And whereas great danger of collisions has arisen from this neglect: Notice is hereby given, that no vessel will be permitted to clear out or proceed to sea from any of the ports or harbors of the Colony unless such vessel shall be provided with proper lights; and that if any vessel shall be found at night not carrying and showing the proper lights required as aforesaid, the master or owner of such vessel will be duly prosecuted according to law.

Timber Licenses for Special Area on the Darling Range.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to order and direct, in virtue of the powers vested in him, that all that portion of Crown Land situate in the Swan District, and bounded on the Westward by the Western face of the Darling Range; on the Northward by the Newcastle Road; on the Eastward by Worriloo Brook, and by a line running South from near where the said Brook crosses the Northam Road to the Helena River; and on the South by the Helena River-shall be subject, in so far as the felling, cutting, splitting, and removing of timber is concerned, to the following Regulations.

Within the above defined area a block of 3 square miles will be retained by the Crown specially for the use of persons engaged cutting up timber by hand, commonly known as "Pit Sawyers."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Applications will be received at the Crown Lands' Office for special licenses to cut over timber forest lots fronting on the railway or otherwise. Lots fronting on the railway shall have a mean breadth of one mile or thereabouts, and a mean depth of three miles or thereabouts. Upon approval of an application, the lot comprised therein will be offered by Public Auction.
 - 2. The conditions of sale shall be:-

(a) An upset rent of £100 per annum, for a term of

14 years for each lot.

(b) The Crown to reserve the right to reserve or sell any portion not exceeding one sixth of the area let, on giving two months notice of the the intention so to do; and further to reserve the right to reserve or sell the whole or any portion beyond the one-sixth before stated, on giving twelve months notice of the intention so to do; provided, however, that such notice shall be in writing, and that during the said terms of two months or twelve months the licensee shall be at liberty to remove the timber from the land to be

reserved or sold.

3. Applications for licenses, under Clause 110 of the Land Regulations, for permission to fell, cut, split, and remove timber from Crown Lands within the beforenamed area, upon land not included in any reserve, or in any special license, shall only be received at the Crown Lands Office, Perth, and shall be subject to the following con-

ditions

(a) All logs felled shall be cut across into one or more lengths, and not merely felled and left with

the top and branches on.

(b) All logs so cut across shall be removed to the mill, or to a platform alongside the Railway, or, in the event of the person felling being a person engaged "Pit sawing," to his sawpit, within are worth from the data of felling one month from the date of felling.

(c) Any breach of the above regulations, besides being punishable under Act 36 Vic. No. 8, shall also render the license of the offender, together with any timber remaining unremoved, liable to forfeiture; and a renewal of the license shall not be granted except on the special approval of the Governor.

4. Present holders of licenses to cut timber on Waste Crown Lands, issued under Clause 110 of the Land Regulations, shall be permitted, upon application, to cut within the area to which these regulations apply; but subject,

nevertheless, to the foregoing conditions and regulations.
5. The Land Regulations of the 11th October, 1882, shall be held to apply to the beforementioned area, in so far as the said Regulations are not inconsistent with the present Regulations.

FROM THE YORK MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

To His Excellency Frederick Napier Broome, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,—

The Council of this Municipality give Your Excellency and Lady Barker a most hearty welcome upon this your first visit to York.

Your Excellency will not find many large buildings nor extensive works of any kind, consequently our assessments are small in amount; but we endeavor to do the best we can with the limited means at our disposal. The Municipal boundaries are widely extended, the length of the streets are out of all proportion to the number of inhabitants, and thus a visitor is led to believe very little has been done.

The Northern bridge has been repaired altogether from the Loan money, and a foot bridge added, towards the building of which the Municipal Council contributed rather more than one half of the cost. The South bridge requires to be treated in the same way. Your Excellency will observe the want of a new Post Office, the present structure having been built when the business was very limited, and the dwelling house is by no means suited for the accommodation of a family.

The Police quarters and Public Offices require remodelling upon a scale more in accordance with the increased business of this large district. The dilapidated fences which will be noticed by Your Excellency were put up either before the townsite was laid out or before it came within the provisions of the Municipal Act. A resolution has been passed by the Council calling upon holders of allotments in certain streets to put up fences of a better class; the work is progressing slowly but will in all probability be completed within a few months.

The site selected for the York Terminus of the Eastern Districts Railway is, we think, well chosen, and will tend to increase very much the value of surrounding cultivated land, and eventually be the cause of filling up a very unseemly gap in our main street.

It is the sincere wish of all that this visit may conduce to the health and enjoyment of Your Excellency and Lady Barker, as in all probability it will to the material benefit of the district, and that we may have the honor of meeting Your Excellency and Lady Barker in this town as often as circumstances will allow.
