LIGHTSHIP OFF THE PROUDFOOT SHOAL AT THE WESTERN ENTRANCE TO TORRES STRAITS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in the early part of November it is proposed to place a Lightship about 1 mile South-west from the Proudfoot Shoal.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric, comprising three 5th order lenses, and the light—which will be at an elevation of 40 feet, and visible some 11 miles from the deck of a small craft—will be occulting, being eclipsed for 4 seconds, at intervals of 10 seconds.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following By-Laws passed by the Dardanup Commonage Board, and which have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.

1. That a fee of not less than 2s. 6d. per head per year be levied on all cattle and horses depasturing on the Commonage; such fee to be paid quarterly to the person appointed by the Board to collect.

2. That as the Commonage is so limited in extent, not more than one hundred sheep shall at any time be allowed to depasture on the Commonage, and that such depasturing shall be subject to a fee of 8d. per head per year.

3. That these By-Laws shall come into force on the first day of January, 1884, and that in the meantime the Commonage board make inquiries with a view of selecting a suitable person to act as Commonage ranger, and to collect fees; and that such appointment be made at a meeting hereafter to be held.
