IN pursuance of instructions contained in a Circular Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated the 9th August, 1883, His Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Despatch for the guidance of Educational Officers in the Civil Service of the Colony, with regard to Vacation Leave under Section 133 of the Colonial Regulations.

CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 9th August, 1883.

SIR,—My attention has been called to the position of Educational Officers with regard to vacation leave under Section 133 of the Colonial Regulations; and I think it desirable, for the convenience of such Officers as well as of the Public Service, that the period of their vacation leave should correspond with the vacation of the Institutions in which they are employed, as in the case of Judicial Officers.

I request, therefore, that you will insert the following alteration in any copies of the Colonial Regulations in the possession of your Government, and inform the Officers affected by the change.

Instead of "any vacation not exceeding, in the case of "Civil Officers, three months in any two years, or, in the "case of Judicial functionaries the ordinary vacation of the "Court to which such functionary may belong," insert "any vacation not exceeding, in the case of Judicial or "Educational Officers, the ordinary vacation of the Court "to which they belong, or the Institution in which they "are employed, and, in the case of other Officers, not "exceeding three months in any two years."

The commanding geographical position of Western Australia, Commanding geographical upon the seaboard of the continent nearest to India, to Europe, and position of Western Aust to England, cannot fail to give that Colony a more important place tralia. in the Australian system of the future than its present resources and population would seem to indicate. The fortification of King George's Sound has lately been declared to be part of the general scheme of Continental defence, and this excellent harbour has for many years been the first and last port of call of the steamers of the Peninsular First and last port of call and Oriental Company, which carry the principal European mails of the Eastern Colonies. Since 1877, the arrival and departure of these mails has been notified to Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney, and Brisbane by means of the Eucla telegraph, a work of Federal im-The object of these notes, which I take the liberty of transmitting to the Australasian Convention through the representative of this Government, is to draw attention to some other West Australian undertakings, also of high intercolonial value.

> The chief of these, and one which may be called a truly Federal work, is the projected Eucla railway, by which it is proposed to connect Fremantle with South Australia. The total length of this line will be 840 miles, of which a section of 90 miles, from Fremantle to York, is now in course of completion, and will shortly be The construction of the remaining 750 miles, with borrowed capital, would be an enterprise quite beyond the present resources of Western Australia, and would probably have to remain in abeyance until it could be undertaken by the Federal Government of the future, were it not for a proposal to proceed with it on the Land Grant System. A syndicate of capitalists now offers to build and work the entire railway, in consideration of a grant of 12,000 acres of land per mile. The scheme has been approved; and, if the syndicate be as prepared as would appear, the whole line may be completed in ten or twelve years. In conjunction with this railway, the West Australian Government propose to construct at Fremantle harbour works which will render that port safe and commodious for the largest steamers, and plans for these works have been prepared by Sir John Coode. The estimate of cost is £638,000 or £242,000, according as a larger or smaller scheme be

The continental advantage of this Eucla line of railway is so Continental advantage of great and manifest that its construction, even should the present scheme fall through, can only be a matter of time. Coming first to Fremantle from Čeylon, the European mail steamers would reach Australia at a saving of three degrees of southing, and of about 300 miles of distance, as compared with the present arrival at King George's Sound. Passengers landing at Fremantle would avoid the rough and cold weather of the voyage round the Leeuwin and across the Australian Bight; and both mails and passengers—presuming the railway to be continued from Eucla, in the same manner as the intercolonial telegraph, by the South Australian Government—would reach the Eastern Colonies from two to four days sooner than at present, after a land-journey through the most temperate regions of Australia. The time thus economised would be a most valuable saving in the business of the continent.

The West Australian Government have just taken a step which will, it is hoped, solve the difficulties arising out of the Submarine Cable to Ceyexisting monopoly of the Eastern Telegraph Company. They have lon or Singapore. granted a concession to Sir Julius Vogel, for 21 years, for the laying of a Submarine Cable from a point on the North-west coast to Ceylon or Singapore. The inland lines of the Colony will in a few months form a second trans-continental telegraph, another a second trans-conti-They will be completed over a nental Telegraph. work of intercolonial value. distance of 2,113 miles, from Eucla to Roebourne, where the new cable will probably be landed. The distance from Roebourne to Ceylon is about 2,600 miles, to Singapore about 1,300 miles, and it is a condition of the concession that the cable is to be laid and ready for use within five years. It is scarcely necessary to point out that this additional submarine line will be of the highest advantage to all the Australian Colonies, placing them, as it will, in more certain, and probably considerably cheaper and speedier telegraphic communication with the world than at present.

In connection with the subject of telegraphs, it may be mentioned that the West Australian Government, having been in Breaksea Island Cable and communication with the Committee of Lloyds' on the matter, are now Signal Station. laying a short submarine cable from Breaksea Island, off King George's Sound, to the main land. This signalling station will be very useful to Australian shipping, as Breaksea Island is the first land made after passing the Leeuwin.

A light of the first order, and an ocean signal station, on Cape Leeuwin itself would be most desirable, and a work of Federal Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse importance. It would cost about £12,000. The West Australian and Signal Station. Government have not felt justified in incurring this expense, since it considers that the cost of such a lighthouse should be contributed to by the other Colonies, or that the general boon to shipping would warrant, as in the case of the Great Basses and other lights, the levying of a due, guaranteed by Imperial and Local Acts. the matter could be arranged on this basis, Western Australia would be glad to contribute its share of the expense, and to execute the work.

It has been proposed to organise a Federal Quarantine Station at King George's Sound. The Government of the Colony are Federal Quarantine Staready to give every facility, and it may be hoped that a basis of tion at IKing George's action on this and other Federal matters of pressing need will be Sound. settled or suggested during the sitting of the Convention.

The systematic Marine Survey of the coasts of Western Australia, begun ten years ago, is a work of Federal value. The expense Marine Survey of West is borne jointly by the Admiralty and the Colony. The survey is Australian Coast. steadily progressing, and a great extent of coast line, from King George's Sound and Cape Leeuwin in the South, to the new port of King Sound in the far North-entered a month or two ago by a merchant steamer for the first time—has been carefully mapped, and sounded out to the 100 fathoms edge. One important result of the survey is that the Rambler and Beaver reefs, so long a cause of anxiety to seamen, have been conclusively proved not to exist. The West Australian seaboard embraces nearly half the

continent, but she has kept pace with the sister colonies in providing mariners with full and accurate charts. Taking into account her small means, she has probably spent a larger proportionate sum than any other state of the continent in perfecting the knowledge of Australian waters.

Object of these Notes.

These few notes may serve to show how the geographical position of the Western colony already connects it in no small degree with works and projects of continental concern, promising to make it the thoroughfare of the European mails, passengers, and telegrams of the federated Dominion of the future; and how its Government and Legislature are occupying themselves with undertakings which must tend to knit the Colony more closely to the rest of Australia.

GOVERNMENT IMMIGRATION.

FREE PASSAGES

NOMINATED IMMIGRANTS.

THE Board of Immigration are prepared to receive Applications from Colonists desirous of obtaining Free Passages for Emigrants from the United Kingdom to this Colony.

All such applications to be made on printed forms, which may be obtained at any Magistrate's Court or Police Station.

In all cases the trade or occupation of the person sought to be introduced must be stated. Applications to be forwarded to the Secretary to the Immigration Board, Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, not later than 1st February next.

The following are considered to be the most desirable class of Immigrants:—

Agricultural Labourers, Shepherds, Blacksmiths, Carpenters, Masons and Bricklayers, Brickmakers,

Gardeners, Wheelwrights, Sawyers, Dairy women and Domestic Servants.

The Board of Immigration desire to ascertain, as far as possible, at an early date, the actual number of labourers, &c., required by the Colonists for the ensuing year. This knowledge can only be arrived at by the prompt co-operation of those who may be intending to apply for free passages for their relations or friends from the United Kingdom, or who may otherwise be in want of labourers, &c.

All such persons are accordingly invited to send in applications as above. The applications may be of three classes, as follows :-

First.—The names and addresses of the Immigrants it is desired to introduce may be given, the trade or occupation, &c., of each proposed Immigrant being stated, as provided in the forms of application.

Second.—The names of the Immigrants need not be stated, but only the male or female Immigrants required, their trades or callings, &c., and the address of the Agent instructed by the applicant to select the individuals on his behalf.

Third.—The number of male or female Immigrants required, their trades or occupations, &c., may be stated, but it may be left to the Board to select and nominate through their own Agent.

The Board reserve to themselves the right of accepting or rejecting any nomination.

In case the funds at the disposal of the Board for Immigration purposes should not be sufficient to provide passages for all those nominated, the applications will be taken in the order in which they are received.
