Declaration between the Governments of Great Britain and of Sweden and Norway respecting the Privileges of Commercial Travellers.

Signed at Stockholm, October 13, 1883.

The Government of Her Britannic Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway being desirous of defining by a special Declaration the interpretation to be given to Article IX of the Convention of Commerce and Navigation signed at London the 18th March, 1826, as regards the Customs treatment of the samples introduced into the territories of either of the Contracting Parties by commercial travellers, being subjects of the other, have agreed upon the following

ARTICLE I.

Swedish and Norwegian commercial travellers shall, in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and British commercial travellers shall, in Sweden and Norway, enjoy the same privileges, facilities, and advantages in respect to the Customs treatment of their samples, or in any other matter, as are now or may hereafter be accorded to commercial travellers of the most favored nation in these

ARTICLE II.

The present Declaration shall come into operation from the date of its signature, and shall remain binding so long as the Convention between Great Britain and the United Kingdoms of the 18th March, 1826, shall continue in force.

#### MINUTES.

MINUTES of a preliminary Court of Inquiry held under the provisions of the Local Ordinance 28th Victoria, No. 2, before Leonard Worsley Clifton, Esq., Collector of Customs, and J. G. Slade, Esq., Justice of the Peace, to inquire into the circumstances attending the stranding of the schooner "Minnie" of Fremantle, Official No. 75,291, of  $38\frac{20}{100}$  tons burthen, at Port Irwin, on the night of 12th December last, when in command of Robert Owen, the number of whose Local Certificate is No. 19.

Held at the Customs Husse Fremantle, this 7th day of

January, 1884.

The Court having appointed, under the provisions of the 5th Section of the Act above quoted, W. Owston, Master Mariner, the number of whose Certificate is 75,647, Nautical Assessor to the Court, proceeded to examine the following witnesses in his presence.

Robert Owen saith: I was master of the schooner "Minnie" of Fremantle, Official No. 75,291, of 38 tons, and hold a local certificate as master, No. 19, and was master of the vessel certificate as master, No. 19, and was master of the vessel on the 12th December, and was lying at anchor at Dongarra on that day. I had a crew of 3 men besides myself and 5 passengers: 3 adults and 2 children. I got under weigh about midnight, intending to sail for Fremantle; the night was fine and a very light breeze from the S.E. As the vessel was canting she took the ground aft. I hauled off from the Jetty at midday and I was lying at anchor at about 120 yards from the Jetty at the time of getting under weigh. The vessel took the ground on a sand bank. I had no chart of the Port and have not inquired if there is one.

When the vessel canted, her head was to the S.W., and the vessel took the ground on the keel about 60 yards from where she had been lying. S.E. is a fair wind out of the Port of Irwin. After the anchor was up the vessel would not pay off, but forged ahead and ran on to a bank, and she remained there that night. We ran a kedge out that night

remained there that night. We ran a kedge out that night to the northward, and the vessel came off herself in the morning; no damage occurred to the vessel, the water was quite calm, the vessel has had no repairs since and has again loaded at Fremantle. I have often got under weigh at night before. I have never run a vessel ashore in getting out of the Irwin before this.

Examined by the Nautical Assessor.

The vessel was fast about 12 hours with a S.E. wind. I reckon the tide would be at its lowest early in the morning. On the 12th the moon was about full. The line of the kedge broke twice when trying to heave the vessel off. We ran out the kedge as soon as the vessel touched and began heaving on it; when the first line parted I ran out a second kedge. I am sure it was sand and not reefs the vessel ran on. The warp which parted got between the rudder and the stem poef. the stern post.

Antonia Ratke—I was an able seamen on board the "Minnie" and know nothing of navigation. There was no mate on board. I remember the night the vessel took the ground, it was about full moon, a very light breeze about S.E.; I remember the anchor being hove; the vessel canted to the S.W.; we had all sails set, head sails and all; the vessel would not pay off; the Captain was at the helm; I do not know how the helm was placed; the vessel made head way; when I found the vessel would not pay off the peak of the know now the neim was placed; the vessel made head way; when I found the vessel would not pay off, the peak of the mainsail was not dropped, but it was dropped when she grounded; the headsails were to windward when she was trying to cant. I cannot tell whether the peak of the mainsail was dropped just before she touched the ground or after she had touched.

after she had touched.

The Captain was under the influence of drink at the time of the casualty, and when he was at the wheel. I did not see the Captain drink anything. The Captain came on board with the passengers at 11 o'clock. The Captain knew what he was doing. When the vessel was canting, the Captain gave an order to haul the jib sheets from port to starboard, which was done; and I afterwards, on my own authority put them to port again, as I knew it to be wrong. authority, put them to port again, as I knew it to be wrong. The Captain asked me if I was going to take charge of the vessel. I altered the head sails as I knew that had the Captain's orders been carried out the vessel would have

grounded.

When I altered the sails, contrary to the Captain's orders, the Captain left them just as I had altered them. The crew were quite sober, except the Captain.

I saw some brandy come on board, and it was given to me to stow away by the Captain, but next morning the bottle was gone. The Captain was quite sober all the voyage after the vessel got off.

Examined by Nautical Assessor.

The vessel left the jetty about 1 p.m. We anchored the vessel in the usual place, and had the same room for getting under weigh that we have had before. (Sd.) A. RATKE.

James Hope saith: I am a Wheelwright, and was a passenger on the "Minnie." I went on board about 11 o'clock p.m. with the Captain. When the Captain got into the boat to go off to the ship he did not stagger in the boat. The Captain was sober to my knowledge when he was in the boat. I saw him take a glass of spirits before going on board. When the vessel was under weigh the Captain was at the wheel.

I do not recollect anything about the headsails being altered.

Injuries to Buoys, Beacons, and Ship Marks.

HEREAS by "The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855," it is enacted that any person who shall wilfully injure or remove any buoy, beacon, or sea mark used for the convenience of navigation or security of shipping shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding fifty

# GOVERNMENT IMMIGRATION.

### FREE PASSAGES

TO

# NOMINATED IMMIGRANTS.

THE Board of Immigration are prepared to receive Applications from Colonists desirous of obtaining Free Passages for Emigrants from the United Kingdom to this Colony.

All such applications to be made on printed forms, which may be obtained at any Magistrate's Court or Police Station.

In all cases the trade or occupation of the person sought to be introduced must be stated. Applications to be forwarded to the Secretary to the Immigration Board, Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, not later than 1st February next.

The following are considered to be the most desirable class of Immigrants:—

Agricultural Labourers, Shepherds, Blacksmiths, Carpenters, Masons and Bricklayers, Brickmakers. Gardeners, Wheelwrights, Sawyers, Dairy women and Domestic Servants.

The Board of Immigration desire to ascertain, as far as possible, at an early date, the actual number of labourers, &c., required by the Colonists for the ensuing year. This knowledge can only be arrived at by the prompt co-operation of those who may be intending to apply for free passages for their relations or friends from the United Kingdom, or who may otherwise be in want of labourers, &c.

All such persons are accordingly invited to send in applications as above. The applications may be of three classes, as follows:—

First.—The names and addresses of the Immigrants it is desired to introduce may be given, the trade or occupation, &c., of each proposed Immigrant being stated, as provided in the forms of application.

Second.—The names of the Immigrants need not be stated, but only the male or female Immigrants required, their trades or callings, &c., and the address of the Agent instructed by the applicant to select the individuals on his behalf.

Third.—The number of male or female Immigrants required, their trades or occupations, &c., may be stated, but it may be left to the Board to select and nominate through their own Agent.

The Board reserve to themselves the right of accepting or rejecting any nomination.

In case the funds at the disposal of the Board for Immigration purposes should not be sufficient to provide passages for all those nominated, the applications will be taken in the order in which they are received.
