Circular to Government Residents and Resident Magistrates.

Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 23rd January, 1884.

SIR,—

I have the honor to convey to you His Excellency's instructions as to your course of action in the event of the spread of the disease of Measles among the native population of your District.

2. No doubt, as heretofore, natives who are in the actual employment of settlers, and the families of such natives, will be supplied by their employers with the nourishment, medicine, and protection from the weather necessary during the period of sickness. This moral obligation on the part of employers has been generally recognised in the most praiseworthy manner in this Colony, and dependence may be placed upon it.

3. But, should the disease spread, there will be many sick natives who have no employers to look to, and it is clearly the duty of the Government to succour them.

4. You will therefore see that such natives are, as far as may be practicable, collected at suitable spots, lodged in proper huts, and supplied, while they are invalids, with the medical comforts and necessaries specified in the enclosed memorandum from the Colonial Surgeon, which is forwarded for your information and guidance.

5. You are hereby authorised to procure, in the usual manner, the necessary supply of oatmeal, tea, sugar, blankets, &c.

6. You will take care to incur no expense for articles or food which are not clearly required for use; and His Excellency generally relies on your discretion, as well as on your energy, in carrying out these instructions.

7. In providing shelter and relief for sick natives who have no fair claim on an employer, you are at liberty to act through any settler of your district whose position warrants his being selected as the agent of Government, and who may offer his services. It is scarcely necessary to say, however, that any authority given to a private individual to expend public money, to distribute blankets, food, and nourishment, to see to the provision or erection of huts or other shelter, should be limited, and delegated from time to time as necessary, and should be very carefully checked and controlled.

Injuries to Buoys, Beacons, and Ship Marks.

WHEREAS by "The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855," it is enacted that any person who shall wilfully injure or remove any buoy, beacon, or sea mark used for the convenience of navigation or security of shipping shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding fifty pounds.

And whereas about the end of November last certain beacons in the River Swan were riddled by rifle bullets, and there is good reason for believing that some person or persons did wilfully injure the said beacons: Notice is hereby given that a reward of £5 will be given to any one who shall give such information to the Police authorities at Perth, or elsewhere, as will lead to the conviction of the said offender or offenders.

And notice is hereby further given that all offenders against the said Ordinance will be prosecuted according to Law.

Regulations made by the Collector of Customs and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of "The Customs Ordinance, 1860."

WHEREAS for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of "The Customs Ordinance, 1860," power is given by the said Ordinance to the Collector of Customs, subject to the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, to make Regulations for carrying this Ordinance into effect, and from time to time to alter and revoke the same, and to make others as may be necessary subject as aforesaid, and provided such Regulations from time to time shall be published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the hours for opening and closing the Queen's Warehouses and the building commonly known as A Store at Fremantle; Now therefore I, LEONARD WORSLEY CLIFTON, Collector of Customs of the Colony of Western Australia, do by these Regulations made in pursuance of this Ordinance, and with the approval aforesaid, order and direct as follows:—

1. From and after the first day of February, 1884, the Queen's Bonding Warehouses at Fremantle shall be open for receiving goods on all days upon which such Warehouses are now open, from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m., except on Saturdays, when they shall be open from 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. The hours during which the said Warehouses shall be open for the delivery of goods shall remain as at present.

2. The A Store at Fremantle shall, from and after the date aforesaid, be open on all days as aforesaid from 7 a.m. until 8 a.m. and from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m., except on Saturdays, when it shall be open from 7 a.m. until 8 a.m. and from 9 a.m. until noon.
