Scab' in Sheep.

To Colonial Secretary.

Inform your Inspector of Stock that two flocks of American sheep, numbering seventy-three and two hundred, respectively, are infected with scab. These sheep have not mixed with others. Instructions have been given to destroy them; to burn the buildings in which they were placed, and the paddock in which they were running. There is no reason to suppose that any other sheep are affected. I will keep you informed.

I am pleased to inform you that there are no fresh signs of scab; it appears that only one lot of American sheep, those at Carcoar, are scabby; they have been destroyed, as well as the buildings they have been in, and all the runs near them have been quarantined; every precaution has been taken to prevent any spread.

Additional Instructions to Inspectors of Sheep.

PART III.—INFECTED SHEEP.

4. Clean Certificates.

a. The Inspector shall satisfy himself that every sheep within the quarantine boundaries has been twice properly dipped in some liquid wash deemed sufficient.

b. That no other infected or suspected sheep have joined quarantined sheep, since they were

first dipped.

c. That every sheep within the quarantine boundaries has been mustered for inspection as directed in 12th clause of "Instructions to Inspectors."

d. That if the Inspector has any reason to be uncer-

tain on any of these points he should withhold a clean certificate and "continue" the license, as provided in Section 9.
