Circular No. 950/84.

SIR,—The attention of Magistrates and other Justices of the Peace is particularly directed to section 10 of "The Aboriginal Offenders Act, 1883." By this section it is enacted that, as soon as possible after every conviction under the Act, the convicting Justices are to transmit two documents to the authorities named therein (1) a record of the conviction, and (2) a report of the conviction containing an abstract or statement of the charge and of the evidence for and against the convicted person.

In the case of a conviction under section 7, the convicting Justice should specially mention the fact of non-residence of any other Justice within the distance mentioned in the section, both on the Record of the conviction and on the Report of the same. (*See* 14 Vic. No. 5, sec. 32.)

It is hoped that all Justices will carefully observe the requirements of the Act in these particulars; non-observance of them might possibly result in the premature discharge of the convicted person.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, to approve of a further alteration being made in the boundaries of the first described mineral area in Victoria District, published in the *Government Gazette* of 23rd January, 1883, and amended in *Government Gazette* of 26th June, 1883. The former boundaries are hereby cancelled, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by straight lines extending in direction N. about 14° E. from the summit of Mount Gregory to a spot 120 chains North from Manuererra Peak; thence in direction North about 130° E. to a spot 30 chains North and 50 chains East from the North-East corner of Victoria Location 381 at Allen-Nolba, and thence in direction North about 176° E. to the summit of the Northern Peak of Yangit Hill; on the Westward and Southward by straight lines extending in direction N. 164° 30' E. from the summit of Mount Gregory to a spot about 15 chains East and 40 chains North from the Dolby Gully bridge on the road from Geraldton to Northampton, and thence due East to the aforesaid summit of Yangit Hill; all bearings true.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

(1) NEWCASTLE HARBOUR—LIGHT-VESSEL WITH FOG SIGNAL.

The Newcastle harbour authorities have given Notice, that on 1st October 1883, the two red lights previously exhibited from the floating powder magazine on the South side within the entrance to that harbour would be shown from a light vessel moored in 9 feet water, near the black buoy (northward of the outer end of the loading wharf), which would be withdrawn.—

During thick or foggy weather, a bell will be sounded at short intervals on board this light-vessel.

(2) SHOAL IN EDGE CUMBE BAY.

The Government of Queensland has given Notice, of the existence of a shoal lying on the Western side of Edgecumbe bay, in a position dangerous to shipping.—

This shoal, on which the steam vessel *Chyebassa* touched, has been found on examination to be about a quarter of a mile in extent, to be composed of coral, shells, and boulders, and to have not more than 13 feet on it at low water. It lies with the following bearings:—

- West extreme of Middle island N. ½ E.
- North end of Gloucester island N.E. ½ N.
- Ben Lomond peak S.E. by E, ½ E. Ely.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 7½° Easterly in 1883.)
