PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, }

(L. S.) F. NAPIER BROOME, Governor. By His Excellency FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by several Acts of Council of the Colony of Western Australia, that is to say, by "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," "The Imported Stock Act, 1876, Amendment Act, 1877," and "The Act for the prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock of 1879," power is given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time by proclamation to prohibit the introduction into the Colony (amongst other animals) of any dogs, or to permit their importation by sea, at such ports, and subject to such regulations and restrictions as he shall see fit, and to make all such regulations as may be deemed expedient to prevent the introduction into the Colony of infectious or contagious diseases in dogs from countries or places where such diseases exist, and to appoint such officers and do such things as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of the said Acts :

AND WHEREAS such diseases in dogs, that is to say, the disease called rabies or hydrophobia, exist in Europe, Asia, Africa, and America, and in all other places beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand; AND WHEREAS certain of the Australasian Colonies have made provision for restricting and regulating the importation of dogs into the said colonies, and it is desirable that similar restrictions and regulations should be made in the Colony of Western Australia: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore referred to, do hereby proclaim and order that the regulations hereinafter set forth for regulating the introduction and importation into the Colony from Europe, Asia, Africa, and America, and from all other places beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand, and for preventing the introduction of diseases in dogs into the Colony, shall take effect and have force within the said Colony from and after the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

Regulations relating to the Importation of Dogs, and to the preventing of the introduction of Disease in Dogs into the Colony.

Reg. 1. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

- "Dog" shall mean any dog of any age or sex.
- "Inspector" shall mean any Inspector or Assistant Inspector appointed under "The Scab Act, 1882," or appointed by the Governor to act under these regulations.
- "Owner" shall include any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent or person in possession or charge of any dog, or any agent of such owner.
- "Quarantine Ground" shall mean the lands hereinafter defined to be quarantine ground, or which may at any time hereafter be defined by Proclamation of the Governor in the "Gazette" to be quarantine ground.

Reg. 2. No dog shall be landed in the Colony of Western Australia at any place other than within the ports of Albany and Fremantle. Reg. 3. The master of any vessel with any dogs on board shall within twenty-four hours after arrival at Albany or Fremantle give notice in writing to the Chief Inspector at Albany or Fremantle, respectively, of the arrival of such dogs, and stating their description and number; and if at any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, then to the Inspector at or nearest to such port.

Reg. 4. All dogs on board any such vessel shall beforthwith examined by the Inspector; and if such dogs are certified by the Inspector to be free from rabies, he may grant a permit for the removal of such dogs by the owner or consignee to such quarantine ground as the Inspector may direct, and no dogs shall be removed from such vessel without permission, in writing, from an Inspector be first had and obtained by the owner or consignee.

Reg. 5. All dogs imported into the ports of Albany or Fremantle, or any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, showing symptoms of rabies on arrival, or during the term of quarantine, shall be destroyed; or if any dog be not removed to a quarantine ground, as directed by an Inspector, such dog shall be destroyed.

Reg. 6. All dogs imported into the Colony shall remain in quarantine for a term of not less than six months from the date of landing.

Reg. 7. All dogs imported into the Colony shall be under the supervision of the Inspector, and shall not be removed from quarantine unless a permit for the removal of such dog or dogs shall have been first had and obtained by the owner or consignee from an Inspector.

Reg. 8. All expenses of examination, landing, removing to, maintaining, and keeping in quarantine of any dog, and removing from quarantine, and all expenses in connection therewith shall be borne by the owner or consignee of such dog; and the owner or consignee shall, on demand, deposit the estimated amount of such costs and expenses with the Inspector previous to any dog being landed.

Reg. 9. Every master of any vessel who shall neglect to forward notice of the arrival as required by Regulation 3 or who shall land or attempt to land or permit or suffer to be landed any dog without a permit for such landing or removal from an Inspector first had and obtained, or who shall remove or attempt to remove or permit or suffer to be removed any dog from his ship or vessel to or from any other ship or vessel whilst either of such ships or vessels shall be within the boundaries of any Port in the Colony, without permission from an Inspector, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £50.

Reg. 10. Every owner or consignee or person who shall land or attempt to land or assist or be in any way concerned in landing or attempting to land any dog from any vessel before a permit shall have been had and obtained from an Inspector for that purpose, or who shall refuse or neglect to remove any dog from any vessel to a quarantine ground, or who shall remove or attempt to remove or assist or be in any way concerned in removing any dog from a quarantine ground without a permit from an Inspector authorising such removal first had and obtained, or who shall refuse or neglect to remove any dog from quarantine within twenty-four hours after an Inspector shall have granted a permit for such removal; or who shall refuse or neglect forthwith to obey any requisition, order or direction under these Regulations or any of them, or who shall obstruct or hinder any Inspector in the execution of any of his duties or powers under these Regulations, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty of not less than £10 nor more than £50.

Reg. 11. All dogs imported into the ports of Albany or Fremantle, or any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, which the master of any vessel shall certify in the notice required by Regulation 3 as being only ships' dogs, or dogs in transit to other colonies not requiring to be landed, such dogs if healthy shall be detained on board such vessel, and shall be securely chained whilst within any port in the Colony, except as may otherwise be authorised by an Inspector.

Reg. 12. Any dog found on board any vessel in any harbor of the Colony unchained, without authority having been firstlobtained from an Inspector, shall be destroyed.

Reg. 13. Any master or owner or consignee who shall refuse or neglect to have any dog securely chained as directed by an Inspector, or who shall neglect to carry out any order or direction given by an Inspector for the care or security of any dog, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £50.

Reg. 14. Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stay on board a ship on which an imported dog is detained, shall be destroyed on the order of an Inspector. Reg. 15. Any person taking or allowing a dog to be on board a ship where an imported dog is detained, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \pounds 5 nor more than \pounds 20.

Reg. 16. Any master, mate, or member of the crew of a ship who shall permit or suffer a dog to go on board their ship during the time any dog shall be detained on such ship shall be liable to a penalty of not less than $\pounds 5$ nor more than $\pounds 20$ for each breach of this regulation.

Reg. 17. A deposit of £10 for every dog to be landed shall be paid on demand to the Chief Inspector, to meet the expenses liable to be incurred in the quarantine and treatment of such dog. An inspection fee shall be charged for the examination, and paid on demand by the owner or consignee or master of any vessel, as in schedule hereto.

Reg. 18. Every person being thereunto liable who shall neglect or refuse to pay on demand by an Inspector the cost as required by Regulation 8 of all expenses under these Regulations shall, for every day during such neglect or refusal shall continue, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

Reg. 19. No dog will be allowed in the quarantine ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the quarantine ground will be immediately destroyed.

Reg. 20. No compensation or claim shall be allowed or payable to any person whatever for any dog sold or destroyed under these regulations.

Reg. 21. The quarantine ground in the Port of Albany shall be the land already set apart at Albany as a Quarantine station. The quarantine ground at Fremantle shall be Rottnest Island.

Reg. 22. The foregoing regulations shall apply to all dogs imported into the Colony of Western Australia from any country or place other than any of the Australasian Colonies or New Zealand; but they shall not apply to dogs imported into Western Australia from any of the Australasian Colonies or from New Zealand, which last mentioned dogs shall remain subject to all the laws and regulations of the Colony of Western Australia in that behalf.

By His Excellency FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868" (32 Victoria, No. 12), it is provided that quarantine shall be performed in such place or places as shall be directed by the Governor, by his order or orders notified by Proclamation or published in the *Government Gazette*: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and order that Carnac Island, and the adjacent space or anchorage ground hereinafter defined, shall be the place where quarantine shall be performed by all vessels, persons, and things liable to quarantine in the port of Fremantle; And I do further proclaim, direct, and order that the limits of the said space or anchorage ground shall be the following, that is to say:—

Northern limit.—An East and West line (true) seven and a-half cables in length, passing four cables South of the Mewstone Rock, and just Southward of the three fathoms edge of the Row-boat shoal.

Southern limit.—An East and West line (true) five and a-half cables in length, passing a cable's length Northward of the Pointer Rock, and just Northward of the three fathoms edge of the Pointer Rock. Eastern limit.—Haycock Hill on Garden Island in line with Flat Rock (20 feet high) of South-east extreme of Carnac Island bearing S. 9° W. (magnetic).

Western limit.—Haycock Hill in line with West Rock (30 feet high) of North-west extreme of Carnac Island bearing South (magnetic).

NOTE.—The depths over the Quarantine Anchorage ground are from three fathoms and three-quarters to five fathoms and a-half, sand and weed.

Regulations made by the Governor in Executive Council under "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Acts 1875 and 1883."

WHEREAS by section 2 of 39 Vict., No. 13, as amended by section 2 of 47 Vict., No. 10, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council from time to time to make Regulations with regard to the mode in which, the times at which, and the circumstances under which diving for or otherwise collecting pearl shells may be or shall not be carried on, and with regard to the persons whom it shall be unlawful to employ therein; And whereas it is expedient to make Regulations as aforesaid as to the collecting of pearl shells by the practice commonly called beach-combing; I, FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Esquire, Companion of the Most Dis-tinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c., do by these Regulations, made in pursuance of the said Acts, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, direct and declare as follows, that is to say :

1. Beach-combing shall not be carried on, on any bank, during the time that such bank is lawfully declared or ordered to be closed, nor shall it be carried on on Sunday.

2. No person shall collect pearl shells on any beach or bank unless such person shall be permitted to do so by a license in writing under the hand of the Government Resident at Roebourne; which license shall specify the locality upon or over which such person is permitted to collect shells as aforesaid. IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Regulations under "The Telegraph Act, 1883," approved by His Excellency in Executive Council, on the 31st March, 1884.

Regulations and Conditions under which Telegraph Messages are authorised to be transmitted in Western Australia.

1. To lessen as much as possible any liability to error in the transmission of Messages from defective manuscript, it is desirable that the use of figures should be avoided, and that words at length be substituted; messages must be written with ink in a clear and legible manner, and bear a proper date, address, and genuine signature.

2. Messages are transmitted and delivered in the order of their reception, and no precedence is allowed except for messages relating to the arrest of criminals, the discovery or prevention of crime or any other matter connected with the administration of justice, and all Government despatches when so required.

3. Messages for transmission on Sundays must be restricted to messages relating to sickness or death, the arrival or departure of friends by land or sea, and special despatches on the public service.

4. Payment of charges in advance is required, except for replies to interrogatory messages on which the sender may have written the words "Reply Paid."

5. All messages are held strictly confidential, the strictest secrecy being enjoined as to the contents or purport of any message; no person not employed in the service of the Telegraph is allowed access to the operating rooms without a special order.

6. Every reasonable exertion is used to secure the greatest promptness, accuracy, and despatch in conducting the business of the Telegraph, but no responsibility is assumed by the Government for any errors, omissions, or delays in the transmission or non-transmission, delivery or non-delivery of any message from whatever cause the same arise. In order, however, to afford the fullest security for the correctness of a transmitted message, the sender may obtain a copy of the message as repeated back from the receiving office upon payment of one-half the original charge upon such message.

7. In the event of serious delay occurring to prevent the transmission of a message within a reasonable time, or sufficient to destroy the value of the despatch, notice will be conveyed to the sender, and the message together with the amount paid thereon returned if desired.

8. In cases where immediate replies are required the messenger will be instructed to wait five minutes after the delivery, provided the message contains the words "Reply by Telegraph immediately."

9. Printed forms upon which messages should be written may be obtained at the Offices; but all messages, whether written upon the prescribed form or upon plain paper, will be considered as tendered for transmission and be transmitted under the several conditions and stipulations above detailed.

10. The original messages are kept for the space of one year, after which they are burned in the presence of the Superintendent.

SCALE OF CHARGES.

For messages between Perth and Fremantle, 6d. for the first ten words, and 1d. for each additional word.

For messages between any other two stations in Western Australia, a uniform rate of 1s. for the first ten words, and 1d. for each additional word.

Press messages are transmitted at 3d. for the first ten words, and 1d. for each four words additional.

No charge is made for the date, address, or signature to any message.

Messages are delivered free of charge within one mile of the office, over that distance mileage at the rate of 1s. per mile is chargeable.

Messages may be transmitted in Cypher in the English language on payment of an additional charge of fifty per cent., but Cypher words must not average more than two syllables. On special occasions, when the communication may be kept open after office hours, and on Sundays, double the ordinary rate will be required upon all messages.
