WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on THURSDAY, THE TENTH DAY OF JULY NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

BY virtue of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1855, and of the Act No. 14 of 1873, I do hereby proclaim the additional Rules and Regulations hereunder, which have been framed by me in pursuance of the said Ordinance and of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, and which are to be observed in the Port of Albany by all manner of persons, under the penalties provided by the said Ordinance and the said Act, and shall take effect from the twenty-first of June, 1884.

Additional Regulations for the Port of Albany, Princess Royal Harbor, King George's Sound.

Regulations to prevent the throwing overboard from shipping in Princess Royal Harbor of any rubbish, &c., or any material liable to cause deposits in the Harbor.

If any person shall throw or cause to be thrown from any ship, vessel or boat, any ballast, rock, stone, slate, shingle, gravel, earth, cinders, rubbish, or things

into any part of the Harbor below high-water mark, he or they shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

2. All vessels, steam or sailing, either discharging coals into or taking coals out of coal hulks, or barges, shall use either shoots or tarpaulins spread between the vessel and the hulk in such a manner as to prevent coals, dust, &c., from falling between the two vessels; such tarpaulin and shoots to be arranged to the satisfaction of the Harbor Master. And any master or commander of a vessel violating or neglecting to observe this rule will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

3. All vessels visiting the port of Albany must be provided with dust bins for holding rubbish of all descriptions. Vessels lying alongside the jetty can discharge their refuse or rubbish on to the jetty, to be thence taken and deposited in a place appointed by the Harbor Master. The precautions laid down in Rule 2 will be applicable, and tarpaulins, canvas, &c., must be placed between the ship and jetty in such a manner as will prevent either ballast, coal, stone, gravel, sand, cinders, ashes, or any other substance or thing from falling between ship and jetty, or through the deck of the jetty; such tarpaulin, canvas, &c., to be fitted to the satisfaction of the Harbor Master, under a penalty not exceeding £20.

The foregoing regulations are in addition to, and not in substitution for the regulations at present in force.

From the Government Resident, Derby, to the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, Perth.

I have had a well sunk on the edge of the pindan about ten or eleven miles South of Point Torment, in which there appears to be a plentiful supply of good stock water.

I am informed by Mr. Forrester and others, that there will be no difficulty in reaching this well with stock, landed at Point Torment, provided a drink be given them before leaving the ship. From this well stock could be driven, without the slightest risk, either to the Lennard or to the Fitzroy.

I may mention that stock landed at Point Torment between the first January and 31st March would be almost certain to find plenty of rain water along the edge of the marsh.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the following Draft Bill which it is his intention to introduce into the Legislative Council during the coming Session.

A BILL to provide for the Registration of certain Persons who shall be imported into Western Australia or employed in any manner within the Territorial Dominion thereof, and for certain other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a Register should be kept of all persons, natives of India, China, Africa, and of the islands in the Indian and Pacific Oceans, and the Malayan Archipelago, who shall be imported into Western Australia or employed in any manner within its Territorial Dominion; And whereas it is also expedient to prevent the importation of old and sickly persons, and to make due provision for the welfare and comfort of all such persons as shall be imported: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. "THE Imported Labor Registry Act, 1882," is hereby repealed. Provided that this repeal shall not affect the validity or invalidity of any contract made, or of any act done or suffered, or of any proceeding commenced, nor any penalty, forfeiture, or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against the said repealed Act before the commencement of this Act. Repeal of 46 Vic. No. 21.

2. THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Imported Labor Registry Act, 1884." Short title.

3. IN this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,— Interpretation of terms.

"Laborer" means any person apparently a native of India, China, Africa, or of the islands of the Indian or Pacific Oceans, or of the Malayan Archipelago, and imported into the Colony or employed within it as a laborer or servant, or in any other employment.

"Employer" includes every person at whose request or on whose behalf a laborer is imported into the Colony, and every person employing a laborer within the Colony, or the agent of any such person.

"Vessel" includes any ship or boat.

"Master" includes any person for the time being in command or charge of a vessel.

"Magistrate" means a Government Resident, or a Resident Magistrate, or a Police Magistrate, or any person lawfully acting as such, but it does not include any other Justice of the Peace.

4. NO laborer shall be imported or brought into the Colony of Western Australia unless a contract, as hereinafter provided for, shall have been previously entered into with such laborer, and every person who shall bring or import a laborer into the Colony contrary to this provision of the Act shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds for every laborer so brought or imported.

No laborer to be imported unless a contract has been previously made.

5. EVERY such contract shall be entered into with the laborer, by the employer or his agent, previously to the shipment of the laborer, at the port or place of his shipment.

Place where such contract shall be made.

6. THE said contract shall be in writing signed or marked by the employer or his agent and by the laborer, and it shall specify the nature of the employment, the period of the service (which shall not exceed three years), the amount of wages (which shall not be less than ten shillings per month), the times of payment thereof (which shall be weekly or monthly), and the daily rations to be supplied, which shall be such as are, in the opinion of the Magistrate, full, substantial, and sufficient, and suitable for the laborer. The contract shall also contain a stipulation by the employer that the laborer be provided with fit and proper lodging during the period of his engagement, and that he shall be returned to the port or place of his shipment, at the expense of the employer, at the end of the period of service: Provided, however, that the absence of such latter stipulation shall not invalidate any contract bearing the written approval of any British authority, or of any authority of a European Government of the country where the contract has been made; and the contract shall further contain a stipulation that no part of the wages shall be deducted for medical attendance, and that such medical attendance shall be provided by the employer when practicable and necessary. The said contract may be in the Form A in the Schedule hereto.

Requisites and form of such contract.

7. THE master of every vessel which shall arrive at any port or place of landing within the Colony, having on board any laborer or laborers as aforesaid, shall, as soon as possible after arrival, give to the principal officer of Customs or of Police, or other officer authorised by the Governor in that behalf at or nearest to the said port or place of landing, a complete list of all such laborers, containing the particulars hereinafter provided for.

List of imported laborers to be given before landing.

8. SUCH list shall contain the name, sex, apparent age, place of birth, place of last residence, place and date of shipment, calling or occupation, and intended place of residence and employment of each laborer, and the name, residence, and description of his employer. The said list may be in the Form B in the Schedule hereto.

Requisites and form of such list.

9. THE master of any vessel who shall knowingly give to the said officer a list which shall be false in any of the particulars aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds for every laborer in respect of whom there shall be any false particular in such list.

Penalty for giving a false list.

10. THE master of every vessel arriving with laborers on board as aforesaid shall also, as soon as possible after arrival, give to the officer aforesaid a medical certificate in respect of each of such laborers certifying as to his apparent age and that he is free from disease and of a sound constitution.

Medical Certificate to be also given.

11. THE said medical certificate may be signed at the port or place of shipment of such laborer by a person authorised to practise as a physician or surgeon by any law in force in any of Her Majesty's

Requisites and form of medical certificate.

Dominions or by any licensed or recognised European school of medicine, or it may be signed at the port or place of landing of such laborer by a Government medical officer. Such certificate may be in the Form C in the Schedule hereto.

12. NO laborer shall be landed from any vessel or employed within the Colony until the master of the vessel shall have given to the Officer of Customs or Police, or other officer as aforesaid, a list containing all the particulars of such laborer, and a medical certificate in respect of such laborer, as hereinbefore provided for; and every master or other person who shall knowingly land any laborer within the Colony, contrary to the provisions of this section, shall be liable to a penalty not less than Two pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds for every laborer so landed. No laborer shall be landed, in the first instance, except at a port which is a regularly appointed seat of magistracy.

Penalty for landing a laborer before giving such list and medical certificate.

13. WITHIN seven days after the landing of any laborer within the Colony the employer or his agent and the laborer shall go before the Magistrate of the port of landing, and the employer or his agent shall produce the contract entered into between the parties as aforesaid, and the employer shall prove to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the contract has been explained to, and freely and voluntarily entered into by the laborer, and that it is understood by him; provided that the fact of any contract having been entered into before and signed by a British authority or any authority of an European Government of the country where the contract has been made, shall be *prima facie* evidence that such contract has been explained to and freely and voluntarily entered into and understood by the laborer.

Verification of contract before a magistrate.

14. IF the Magistrate shall be satisfied as aforesaid, and if the said contract shall not appear to the Magistrate to be harsh or unfair to the laborer, the Magistrate shall countersign such contract and deliver it to the employer or his agent, and it shall thenceforth be deemed to be a valid contract under this Act between the employer and the laborer, and a duplicate copy of such contract, signed or marked and countersigned as aforesaid, shall be given by the employer or his agent to the Magistrate, and shall be filed by him in the office of his Court, and the Magistrate shall cause the particulars of every such contract to be entered in a book to be kept in his office and to be called "The Imported Labor Registry Book." If the Magistrate shall not be satisfied as aforesaid, or if any of the provisions of the contract shall appear to the Magistrate to be harsh or unfair to the laborer, it shall be competent to the said Magistrate, at his discretion, to amend the contract, or to annul it, and to further order that the laborer be returned to the place of his shipment by the Government at reasonable expense, which the employer shall defray. Provided that if any employer or his agent shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Magistrate to have brought laborers to the Colony by the use of force or fraud he shall be subject, in addition to any penalty otherwise provided, to a fine of Fifty pounds in respect of each laborer so brought.

Counter-signature and registration of contract.

15. ANY contract made under this Act may, at any time after the counter-signature thereof as aforesaid, be rescinded or amended by mutual consent of the parties thereto, in the presence of the Magistrate who has countersigned the same. The employer shall produce the copy of the contract retained by him, and the Magistrate upon being satisfied that the parties to the contract both wish to rescind or amend the same, and that such rescission or amendment is not to the prejudice of the laborer, shall destroy or amend the

Rescission of contract by mutual consent.

copy so produced to him as aforesaid, and shall make and sign a memorandum of such rescission or amendment, and of the date thereof, on the duplicate copy of the contract, which shall remain filed in the office of his Court, and he shall also cause a note of such rescission or amendment, with the date thereof, to be entered against the particulars of the contract in the aforesaid book.

Requisites and form of subsequent contracts.

16. AFTER the termination of any contract under this Act whether by rescission, by effluxion of time, or otherwise, a new or subsequent contract may be entered into by any employer with a laborer, provided that such contract shall be in writing and shall contain all the terms and stipulations of the original contract as hereinbefore provided for, excepting only the stipulation as to the return of the laborer to the port of his shipment at the expense of the employer, which may be omitted from such subsequent contract; and provided that such subsequent contract shall be explained to the laborer and signed or marked by the employer and laborer in the presence of a Magistrate or other Justice of the Peace of the Colony.

Counter-signature and registration of subsequent contracts.

17. IF the said Magistrate or Justice is satisfied that such subsequent contract has been freely and voluntarily entered into and understood by the laborer, he shall countersign the said contract and deliver it to the employer or his agent, and such contract shall thenceforth be deemed to be a valid contract, under this Act, and a duplicate copy of such subsequent contract, signed or marked and countersigned as aforesaid, shall, in the case of a contract entered into before a Magistrate, be filed by him in the office of his Court and entered in the book as aforesaid, and in the case of a contract entered into before any other Justice of the Peace, shall be delivered or sent by such Justice to the Magistrate in whose district such contract shall have been entered into as aforesaid, and shall be by him filed and entered as aforesaid, and similar proceedings shall take place in the case of all contracts subsequent to the first or original contract.

Penalty for employing a laborer without having a valid contract.

18. EVERY person who shall employ any laborer within four years of the arrival of such person in the Colony without having first entered into a valid contract under this Act with such laborer, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds, for every laborer so employed, and every contract with a laborer after the commencement of this Act, not duly made according to this Act, shall be null and void.

Contracts to be subject to the Masters and Servants Acts.

19. ALL contracts under this Act are to be subject to the provisions of an Act, passed in the Sixth year of Her Majesty, No. 5, intituled "An Act to provide a summary remedy in certain cases of Breach of Contract," and of "The Masters and Servants Amendment Ordinance, 1868," and of "The Masters and Servants Amendment Act, 1882." And upon conviction of any laborer under the provisions of the first mentioned Act, it shall be lawful for the convicting Magistrate, Justice or Justices to rescind the contract with such laborer; and such Magistrate, Justice or Justices shall forthwith cause a note of such rescission to be transmitted to the Magistrate having custody of the book in which the said contract is registered, who shall cause a note of such rescission, with the date thereof, to be entered therein.

Production of laborer when required.

20. THE employer for the time being of any laborer within the Colony, whenever requested thereto by any officer of Customs or of Police, or other officer, having and producing a written authority signed by a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, and authorising such officer to make the above request, shall produce such laborer to such

officer, or to the said Magistrate or Justice, at all reasonable times. If any employer shall fail to produce a laborer when requested as aforesaid, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds and not exceeding Ten pounds for every such default, unless he shall prove, to the satisfaction of the Magistrate or Justice or Justices before whom the case shall be heard, that there was some reasonable ground or excuse for the non-production of such laborer as aforesaid. Provided that this section shall not apply to any laborer who shall have resided within the Colony for a period exceeding four years.

21. ALL offences under this Act made punishable by any penalty, shall be summarily punishable upon conviction before a Magistrate or a Justice or Justices of the Peace according to the provisions of the Acts in that behalf.

Offences summarily punishable.

22. EVERY person who shall forge, or alter, or who shall produce or make use of knowing the same to be forged or altered, with intent to defraud, any contract or medical certificate as aforesaid, shall be guilty of felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be kept in penal servitude for any term not exceeding five nor less than three years, or to be imprisoned with or without hard labor for any term not exceeding two years.

Forgery of contracts or medical certificates.

23. IF any person shall feel himself aggrieved by any conviction or order of a Magistrate, Justice or Justices under this Act, such person may appeal from such conviction or order to the Supreme Court. Provided, always, that it shall be a condition precedent to the right of appeal that notice of such appeal shall be given to such Magistrate, Justice or Justices within three weeks after such conviction or order, and that the appellant shall within the same time give security for the payment of the costs of such appeal in the event of the appeal being unsuccessful, in such a sum as to the said Magistrate, Justice or Justices may seem meet, and that such appeal shall be entered for hearing within three months after such conviction or order; and upon such notice and security being given all proceedings upon such conviction or order shall be stayed until the hearing of the appeal, and the appellant, if in custody, shall be liberated upon recognisance, with or without surety or sureties, and in such sum as to the convicting Magistrate, Justice or Justices may seem meet conditional for his appearance before the same Magistrate, Justice or Justices, or some other Magistrate, Justice or Justices sitting at the place where such conviction or order was made, within ten days after the judgment of the Supreme Court upon such appeal shall have been given, to abide such judgment, unless the conviction or order appealed against be reversed.

Appeal from summary convictions and orders.

24. SECTIONS A, E, G, and H, of "The Shortening Ordinance, 1853," shall be incorporated with and taken to form part of this Act, to all intents and purposes, and in as full and ample a manner, as if the said sections had been introduced and fully set forth in this Act.

Certain sections of 16 Vic. No. 11 incorporated.

25. THE provisions of this Act shall not apply to any laborer who shall be employed in any vessel which shall merely pass through the waters of the territorial dominion of Western Australia, or touch at any port or place within the same, in the course of a voyage from or to parts beyond the said dominion. Save as aforesaid, this Act shall apply to the whole territorial dominion of the Colony.

Application of Act.

26. THIS Act shall come into operation on

IN accordance with the provisions of "The Telegraph Act, 1883," His Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Amended Regulation, approved in Executive Council, which is substituted for Regulation No. 4, gazetted on the 5th ultimo:—

Regulations and Conditions under which Telegraph Messages are authorised to be transmitted in Western Australia.
