HEREAS "The Poison Sale Act, 1879," enacts that the articles named and described in the Schedule to the Act shall be deemed to be poisons within the meaning of the Act; and that the Governor may, from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, declare that any article named in such notice is a poison within the meaning of the Act; and that, on the expiration of one month from such publication, the article so named shall be deemed to be a poison within the meaning of the said Act:

SIR,--I have the honor of forwarding to Your Excellency a copy of a Regulation recently made under the provisions of Section Seven of the Western Pacific Order in Council, 1879, prohibiting the supply by British subjects of arms, ammunition, and explosive substances to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands, and I beg leave to request that it may be published for general information in the Colony under Your Excellency's Government.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c., &c. A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Britannic Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879)

To prohibit the supply of arms, ammunition, and explosive substances to natives of the Western Pacific Islands.

 1. In this Regulation the expression "Western Pacific Islands" means and includes any of the following islands or places, namely:

 (1.) The part of the Island of New Guinea, eastward of the 143rd meridian of longitude.

 - (2.) The Islands or Archipelago of New Britain and New Ireland.

(3.) The Louisiada Archipelago.

 (4.) The Groups of Islands known as—

- (5.) All other islands in the Western Pacific Ocean, not being within the limits of the Colonies of Fiji, Queensland, or New South Wales, and not being within the jurisdiction of any civilised power.
- The expression, "the waters of the Western Pacific Islands," means the waters within 3 miles of any of the islands or places included in the Western Pacific Islands.

 The word "arms" means every kind of firearms and any part
- or parts of firearms.

 The word "ammunition" means every kind of ammunition for firearms and any material for the preparation thereof.
- The expression, "explosive substance," means gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, gun-cotton, blasting powder, and every other substance used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion.
- 2. British vessels within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands shall not carry arms or ammunition. But this prohibition shall not be held to prevent or forbid the carriage by any such vessel for the protection of the same and of the persons therein, and otherwise for the ordinary lawful purposes of such vessel, of arms and ammunition, in quantities not exceeding those herein specified, viz.:
 - nes not exceeding those herein specified, viz.:—

 One rifle or shot gun, and one pistol for every member of the crew of such vessel, whose names shall be on the articles. One hundred rounds of ammunition for every such rifle, shot gun, or pistol on board.

 Cannons or swivel guns forming part of the ordinary equipment of any such vessel, together with one hundred rounds of ammunition for every such gun.

- 3. British subjects, within the Western Pacific Islands, shall not give, sell, or otherwise supply any arms, ammunition, or explosive substance to any native of any Island or place within the Western Pacific Islands.
- 4. Any British subject who shall carry, or aid, or abet the carriage of any arms or ammunition in any British vessel within the waters of the Western Pacific Islands, except as permitted by this Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.
- 5. Any British subject within the Western Pacific Islands who shall give, sell, or otherwise supply, or aid or assist in supplying any arms, or any single firearm, or any ammunition or explosive substance, to any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands, shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.
- 6. Any person guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to punishment as follows:—
 - (1.) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months, with or without hard labor, and with or without a fine not exceeding £10: or,
 - A fine alone, not exceeding £10, without any ir sonment.
- 7. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of Júlv, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and may be cited as the "Arms Regulation, 1884."

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following opinion, as expressed by the Honorable the Attorney General, on the construction to be placed on Clauses 110 and 111 of the Land Regulations of 1882.

OPINION.

Clause 110,-A Three Pounds License enables one man to cut timber for one month, and to have as many persons as he likes to remove such timber during the month. A Five ne mees to remove such timber during the month. A Five Pounds License enables two men to do the same, and to have any number of persons to remove the timber during the month. A Five Shillings License only authorises one man to cut and remove. Every one either cutting or removing must have such a license. A Half-crown License authorises the cutting of sandalwood by one man; no fee is required to be paid by those who may remove it.

Clause 111.—A person who cuts trees in order that they may be split or sawn up (and not for use or shipment as piles or balks) will have to pay Five shillings for every man who either cuts or removes trees, when cut, from the place where they were cut. But as soon as they have been removed from that place to the pit or mills or other place where they are to be split or sawn up, the removal within the meaning of the clause is complete, and no further license is necessary for the further removal of the wood from the pit, mill, or other such place.

DISCONTINUANCE OF LIGHT AT LIGHT-SHIP, BRISBANE BAR, AND EXHIBITION OF LIGHT AND TIDAL SIGNALS FROM THE PILE LIGHT-HOUSE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on or about the 31st instant, the Light-ship will be removed from her present position off the Bar of the Brisbane River, and that the Light and the Tidal signals will after that time be shown from the Pile Lighthouse.

after that time be shown from the Pile Lighthouse.

The Lighthouse stands in 16 feet at low water, and 450 feet eastward from the line of leading lights through the outer Cutting.

The Light exhibited from the Central Lantern will be Dioptric of the 4th Order, occulting during the flood tide, and fixed during the ebb. It will be seen as a red light by vessels passing through the outer Cutting, and between the bearings of N. by W. ½ W. and S. by E. ½ E. to W.S.W. westerly it will appear as a white light. Between the bearings of W.S.W. westerly and W. by N. ½ N. northerly, it will be seen as a red light. From a W. by N. ½ N. northerly, by W. ½ W. bearing it will be again seen as a white light, and from the southward of the latter bearing the light will be obscured.

In the direction of Cowan Cowan, the white light will be intensified by a sector of 45° of light—not otherwise required—condensed into a beam of 10°.

The red sector facing to the eastward covers Mud Island and the reefs, and the shoal ground to the northward, so that when passing in the white sectors, North or South of the Island, vessels will be in deep water.

While within the white sector to the southward of the red light, vessels will be in the fairway between St. Helena and Mud Islands, and clear of the foul ground on either hand.

The occulting light will be obscured for 2 seconds at intervals of 10 seconds.

During the flood tide a red flag will be kept flying from a staff on the lantern platform.

The depths given represent the draft at which a vessel may safely

enter the river.
