## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

*All bearings are Magnetic. Variation 0° 20' W. in 1884.*

AUSTRALIA—NORTH-WEST COAST.

**DELAMBRE REEF**,\* off Cossack, is a cable's length in extent in an East and West direction, and consists of coral and sand. The shoalest spot found (2 fathoms) lies with the following bearings and distances:—north extreme of Delambre island (triangular hill) W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., distant 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles; and summit of Bezout island, S.S.W. Wly., distant 7 $\frac{1}{4}$  miles. There are depths of 9 and 11 fathoms, sand and shells, close around Delambre reef.

S. with the off-lying Islands and Reefs, 475; Buccaneer Archipelago to Bedonbt Island, 1048; Bedonbt Island to Cape Cuvier, 1055; Australia, Northern Portion, 272a; and Indian Ocean Southern Portion, 748a; also, Australia Directory, Vol. III, 2nd edition, 1881, pp. 102-3.

**Clearing marks.**—Legendre island shut in southward of the north extreme of Delambre island, the latter bearing W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., will lead southward; south extremes of Dolphin and Delambre islands in line, W. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., will lead northward; summits of round-backed hill (over Port Robinson) and Bezout island in line, S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., will lead eastward; and Jarman island beacon just open eastward of Bezout island, S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., will lead westward, respectively, of Delambre reef.

The reef reported to lie with Delambre island bearing West, distant 11 or 12 miles, and to have two fathoms over it, has been searched for unsuccessfully, and is believed to be identical with Delambre reef.

**DOCKRELL REEF**, in Mermaid strait, has from 1 to 3 fathoms, over coral and sand, and is about 5 cables in extent in an East and West direction, and 4 cables wide. The shoalest spot found (6 feet) lies nearly in mid-channel, between Enderby island and the main, with the following bearings and distances:—sandhill over south extreme of Eagle-hawk (Sandy) island, West, distant 3 and 9-10<sup>ths</sup> miles; west extreme of Enderby island, N.W., distant 4 and 1-10<sup>th</sup> miles; and south-east extreme of Enderby island, N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., distant 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

**Clearing mark.**—North extreme of Eagle-hawk (Sandy) island bearing West, will lead Northward of Dockrell reef in from 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  to 5 fathoms.

The rock shown on the charts with South extreme of Eagle-hawk (Sandy) island bearing West, distant 2 miles, has been searched for unsuccessfully, and is believed not to exist; there are depths of from 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  to 5 fathoms, sand, over and around its assigned position.

A rock, with ten feet over it, and from 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  to 5 fathoms, sand, within a cable's length of it, lies with the following bearing and distance:—south extreme of Eagle-hawk (Sandy) island, W.N.W., distant 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ ths mile.

**Reefs**, which uncover at low water, and sunken dangers over which the sea breaks at times, extend 4 miles in a south-west direction from the south extreme of Eagle-hawk (Sandy) island.

The channel between Enderby and Eagle-hawk (Sandy) islands is recommended (especially for vessels drawing over 9 feet) in preference to the passage southward of the latter island.

#### Relating to Hampton Harbor.

North-West Australia,  
"Meda," in Hampton Harbor,  
20th June, 1884.

SIR,—I have the honor to report that, in obedience to Your Excellency's request, we have surveyed Hampton Harbor; and, in accordance with Your Excellency's wishes, beg to submit the following report upon its capabilities as a harbor.

2. Hampton Harbor, between the Intercourse Islands (Dampier Archipelago) and the main, is about 4 miles long and from 5 cables (half-a-mile) to one mile wide. The whole of the space, however, cannot be considered as available for anchorage, as a considerable portion of it is occupied by very shoal ground at low water spring-tides. The main entrance to the harbor, between the two eastern Intercourse Islands, is 5 cables wide; but this channel is obstructed by a reef, which dries 18 inches at low water springs, and lies nearly in mid-channel. Within the harbor, four other rocks uncover from 4 to 6 feet at low water springs (rise of tide 14 feet, at springs); but these dangers can be avoided by certain leading marks, or, as a general guide, by favoring the south shore of Great Intercourse Island (western side of channel) when entering or leaving the harbor. The holding ground (stiff mud) is excellent. On the whole, for vessels drawing 15 feet (especially steamships), Hampton Harbor may be considered a well protected and secure haven.

3. For vessels of heavier draught than 15 feet, good anchorage will be found just outside the harbor, in from 24 to 28 feet, stiff mud, at about half

a mile from the shore. Everywhere among the main channels of the Dampier Archipelago good anchorage may be found, well protected by the islands. Between the North and South Lewis Islands, the "Meda," during an easterly gale, found even smoother water than she did under similar circumstances in Hampton Harbor.

4. The eastern approach to Hampton Harbor is comparatively free from danger, and laid down on the published charts on a scale large enough to meet, in my opinion, the present requirements of local navigation, and this approach has, therefore, not been examined in detail by us. The western approach (Mermaid Strait) being obstructed by shoals under the depth of three fathoms together with some sunken rocks (the positions and extent of which were not accurately known), we have embraced that approach (on a smaller scale to the mile) in our examination of Hampton Harbor.

5. The shores both of the main and of the neighboring islands consist chiefly of large boulders, of "a rusty color" (*Dampier*) outside, which give a metallic ring when struck, and, when broken, are traversed by veins of a substance resembling copper ore. Specimens of these (apparently) mineral rocks have been collected, and upon our return to headquarters will be furnished to the Registrar of Mines and Minerals (Rev. C. G. Nicolay). The eastern (main) shore offers facilities for the erection of jetties.

6. In the event of a settlement being formed on the shores of Hampton Harbor there should, apparently, be little difficulty in obtaining a good supply of fresh water. In most of the valleys (both on the main and on the adjoining islands) we have found the surface of the ground to be moist, and occasionally extensive patches of tall ferns growing there, and (notwithstanding a dry atmosphere and scorching sun) further search has, as a rule, revealed fresh water pools. On all occasions we obtained fresh water by digging holes some 4 to 5 feet deep. During the latter portion of our stay the fresh water pools in the hollows were permanent. The present season, however, may be an exceptional one, inasmuch as we have experienced, at full and change, easterly gales accompanied by a considerable fall of rain.

7. From our surveying stations on the summits of the hills, we obtained a good view of the surrounding country. The coast hills over Hampton Harbor are separated from the next ridge parallel to them by a plain about 6 miles wide, about 3 miles of which, at high water, appeared to be marsh cut up by creeks.

So far as I can gather information (derived chiefly from a gentleman who lives on Lewis Island, and who occasionally proceeds from Hampton Harbor overland to Roebourne), these three miles of swamp are difficult to cross on foot, and horses get bogged.

The usual track taken (Mr. Macvean informs me) is through a valley which comes down to the shore about 2 miles up Hampton Harbor, thence round the foot of the coast hills and across the plain before-mentioned, to Clarkson's station on the Maitland River. Should a causeway at any time be required across the three miles of marsh, abundance of material will be found by utilising the boulders which cumber the sides of the adjoining hills. The distance from Hampton Harbor to Cossack by sea (proceeding outside Delambre and Legendre Islands) is about 55 nautical miles; and that by land to Roebourne (*via* Clarkson's station on the Maitland) about 45 statute miles.

8. The Government Resident at Roebourne (Mr. Laurence) paid a visit to Hampton Harbor during the "Meda's" stay there. Your Excellency will,

therefore, receive from Mr. Laurence more reliable information than I can furnish as to the precise nature of the land approaches to Hampton Harbor.

SIR,—I have the honor to inform Your Excellency that, since furnishing my report to you upon Hampton Harbor (dated the 20th instant), we have returned here for supplies, and, upon our arrival, found the steam-yacht "Cushie Doo" at anchor, *en route* for Cambridge Gulf.

2. Anxious to visit and survey Cambridge Gulf (at least that portion contiguous to the mouth of the Ord River), I solicited and have obtained, by the courtesy of Mr. Osmund, the owner of the "Cushie Doo," a passage in her, and embark to-morrow for Cambridge Gulf.

3. I hope to be able to inform Your Excellency, when we reach Port Darwin, that we have found a good navigable channel into the Ord River.

4. Fortescue Roadstead and the other contemplated surveys will be carried out, during my absence from the "Meda," by Lieut. Dixon, and the "Meda" will return to Fremantle about the end of the first week of September.

I hope to arrive in Fremantle myself towards the end of September, when the survey of Dongarra will be made, and a re-examination, also, of the mouth of Princess Royal Harbor.
