PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by certain Deeds Poll of Grant, bearing date the 24th day of November, 1865, and the 4th day of March, 1870, under the hand of the Governor and Public Seal of the Colony, the lands known and therein described as "Perth Town Lots W 53, 54, 55, 56, and 57" were granted to certain persons; AND WHEREAS, by the said Deeds Poll, power was reserved to the Crown, at any time within 21 years from the date thereof, to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time by the Crown be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience; AND WHEREAS the piece or parcel of land, hereinafter described, is necessary for the purposes of a Public Drain: NOW KNOW YE

that I, the said Governor, acting for and on behalf of and by the authority of Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, do hereby and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said recited Deeds Poll resume, for the purposes aforesaid, all that portion of Perth Town Lots W 57, 56, 55, 54, 53 that lies to the Northward or Westward, and ten links from lines starting from a spot on the Western boundary of W 57, seventy-five links from the junction of Short and Mackie Streets, and extending in a straight line to a spot on the Western boundary of Lot W 54, one chain seventy-three links from its South-west corner, thence in a straight line to a spot on the Western boundary of Lot W 52, three chains twenty-six links from its South-west corner, and thence along the Western boundary of Lot W 52, one chain seventy-four links to Mangles Street.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, at Government House, Perth, this 1st day of August, 1884.
