PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868" (32 Victoria, No. 12), it is provided that Quarantine shall be performed in such place or places as shall be directed by the Governor, by his order or orders notified by Proclamation or published in the Government Gazette: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and order that a length of 200 feet of the New South Jetty, from the sea end, which shall include the whole of the head, shall be a place where Quarantine may be performed by vessels, persons, or things liable to Quarantine in the Port of Fremantle, in addition to any place or places which may have already been declared or proclaimed to be Quarantine Ground or Grounds.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this eighth day of September, 1884.
