**Pearl Shell Fisheries Regulations.**

*Amendment of Regulation No. 3, Sub-section No. 1, of the Regulations of August, 1881, made by the Governor in Executive Council, on the 27th of October, 1884, under "The Pearl Shell Fisheries Regulation Acts 1875 and 1883."*

WHEREAS the Governor in Executive Council did on the 16th August, 1881, in pursuance of the powers vested

in him under the 39 Vic., No. 13, Sec. 2, make certain Regulations with regard to the mode in which, the time at which, and the circumstances under which, diving for pearl shells shall or shall not be carried on; And Whereas it is now deemed expedient to extend the season during which it shall be lawful to dive for or otherwise collect pearl shells from the 15th to the 30th day of April, and to amend accordingly Regulation No. 3, Sub-section 1 (as Gazetted on the 23rd August, 1881): NOW THEREFORE I, FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., in pursuance of the powers in me vested by 39 Vic. 13, Sec. 2, as amended by 47 Vic. 10, Sec. 2, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, direct and declare as follows, that is to say:—That the time during which it shall be lawful to dive for or otherwise collect pearl shells shall be:—

1. From Cape Preston Eastward and Northward, from 15th September to 30th April, inclusive.

The Duke of Cambridge, K.G., &c., &c. It having been pointed out that the great interest Sir Bartle Frere took in all matters relating to ties between the mother country and the British Colonies in general, and the devotion he showed in upholding the best interests of the Colonial Empire, were so notorious that many in the colonies other than those in the South African colonies, with which he was more intimately connected, would wish to join in the memorial to him if an opportunity were afforded, the Committee invite all who knew him in private life, or admired his public character, to take this opportunity of testifying their affection and esteem.

A sum not exceeding £3,000 is to be devoted to the erection of a Statue, and the surplus of all subscriptions received will be utilised, (1) in providing a permanent Fund to be conferred, as a testimony of admiration of Sir Bartle Frere, on his widow and family in life-rent; and (2) in perpetuating his memory by settling the reversion on his family.

A sum of over £4,000 has already been collected in England.

IT having been reported to the Government that Chinese Coolies recently imported from Singapore have in several instances proved to be crippled or in unsound health, His Excellency the Governor desires to draw the attention of Importers of Chinese labor into this Colony to the necessity of instructing the Agent they may employ in Singapore, or elsewhere, to exercise the utmost care in procuring proper Medical Certificates, after careful examination, that the persons engaged are in sound health, both mentally and physically.

To prevent Coolies interchanging or selling these Medical Certificates, the Agent should take especial care to satisfy himself that the man who actually embarks for Western Australia is the *bonâ fide* recipient of the Certificate, and the person originally engaged.

*Conditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be charged by Contractor for Trucking.*

1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetties, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.
2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.
3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.
4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881.
5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.
6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.
7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to the existing Jetty Regulations.
8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.
9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.
10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.

11. A Bond of £300 for Albany and Geraldton and £100 for all other jetties, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.

12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.

13. The Principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the Colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1885 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.
