Order in Council under "The Bankruptey Act, 1871" (34 Victoriæ, No. 20).

5758 84 ALEX. C. ONSLOW, Administrator, etc. 26-11-54.

**THEREAS** by Section 65 of the said Act it is provided that if it shall appear to the Governor in Council expedient that any Local Court should have Bankruptcy Jurisdiction, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to appoint the said Court to have Bankruptcy Jurisdiction accordingly, and to assign to the said Court its District for Bankruptcy purposes; And WHEREAS I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Chief Justice, am now the Officer Administering the Government of Western Australia; AND WHEREAS it appears to me in Council expedient that the Local Court held at Geraldton should have Bankruptcy Jurisdiction within the Victoria District: Now THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Esquire, Chief Justice, Administering the Government of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., by this Order made in Executive Council in pursuance of the said Act, do order and appoint that the Local Court at Geraldton, in the Victoria District, shall from and after the first day of January next have Bankruptcy Jurisdiction; AND I do assign to the said Court, as its District for Bankruptcy purposes, the whole of the said Victoria District.

IS Excellency the Administrator has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Rules and Regulations for the examination of Candidates, from amongst the pupils of the Government and Assisted Primary Schools, for the two Annual Scholarships, established by the Legislative Council, at the High School, Perth.

### By Command,

1. Two Scholarships of the value of Fifty pounds each per annum, tenable for three years, at the High School, Perth, will be annually offered to boys attending the Government and Assisted Schools of the Colony.

- 2. Candidates for these Scholarships must-
  - (a) Be over eleven years of age, and not more than fourteen years old on the 31st October of the year in which the examination for the Scholarship is held;
  - (b) Have attended one or more of the Government or Assisted Schools continuously for at least two years immediately preceding the abovenamed October 31st, and have made not less than three hundred halfday attendances (unless prevented by illness) in such schools, during their last school-year;
  - (c) Have passed satisfactorily in all the subjects prescribed for the Fifth Standard in the "Programme of Examination" appended to the Regulations of the Central Board of Education;
  - (d) Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the head teacher of the last school attended.

3. The Scholarships will be awarded upon a competitive examination, which will comprise the following subjects :---

- (a) Reading aloud passages in prose and verse;
- (b) Writing from dictation, as a test of spelling and penmanship;
- (c) Geography generally, and special reference to Australasia;
- (d) English grammar, including simple analysis;
- (e) Arithmetic, including the ordinary rules, and questions in mental arithmetic.

4. The following values are affixed to the several subjects of examination :---

Reading		100 marks
Writing from dictation		200 ,,
Geography	•••	200 ,,
English grammar		200 ,,
Arithmetic		300 ,,

5. An examination of candidates will be held annually in Perth in the month of December, and, should it be found expedient for the convenience of candidates residing in the distant parts of the Colony, the Central Board of Education may arrange for examinations being also held in "local centres." In the latter case, copies of the examination questions will be forwarded, under seal, to the Chairman of the District Board of Education of such "centre" (who, with other persons nominated by the Central Board, shall conduct the examination) to be opened at the commencement of the examination, which shall be held simultaneously with, and in the same manner as that held in Perth.

6. Application for admission to the Scholarship examination must be made on the prescribed form, to the Secretary Central Board of Education, on or before the 31st October of each year.

7. The conditions upon which the Scholarships will be held are :----

- (a) That the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the Scholarship, become a pupil of the High School, Perth.
- (b) That he shall continue to attend the said school, and must at the end of each term obtain from the authorities of the school a certificate, stating hat his conduct and attendance have been satisfactory. If an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time his conduct shall be disorderly, or immoral, the Scholarship and the advantages connected therewith shall, with the consent of the Governor, thereupon cease and determine.

8. The first examination for the Elementary School Scholarships will be held in December, 1884.



IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that the Honorable the Colonial Secretary is prepared to receive and forward to the Executive Committee at the Mansion House, London, subscriptions to the "Frere Memorial Fund," which is now being organised under the patronage of Field Marshal H.R.H. The Duke of Cambridge, K.G., &c., &c., &c. It having been pointed out that the great interest Sir Bartle Frere took in all matters relating to ties between the mother country and the British Colonies in general, and the devotion he showed in upholding the best interests of the Colonial Empire, were so notorious that many in the colonies other than those in the South African colonies, with which he was more intimately connected, would wish to join in the memorial to him if an opportunity were afforded, the Committee invite all who knew him in private life, or admired his public character, to take this opportunity of testifying their affection and esteem.

A sum not exceeding  $\pounds 3,000$  is to be devoted to the erection of a Statue, and the surplus of all subscriptions received will be utilised, (1) in providing a permanent Fund to be conferred, as a testimony of admiration of Sir Bartle Frere, on his widow and family in life-rent; and (2) in perpetuating his memory by settling the reversion on by family.

A sum of over £4,000 has already been collected in England.

Sonditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be

charged by Contractor for Trucking.

1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetties, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.

7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to the existing Jetty Regulations.

8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.

9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.

10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.

11. A Bond of £300 for Albany and Geraldton and £100 for all other jetties, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.

12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.

13. The Principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the Colony.

15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1885 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.


