REGULATIONS FOR THE FREMANTLE SEA JETTIES.

H E following General Regulations for the management and use of the Sea Jetties at the management and use of the Sea Jetties at the Port of Fremantle, which were framed by the Administrator in Executive Council on the 22nd December, 1884, in accordance with the provisions of the 42nd Victoria, No. 18, are published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command, MALCOLM FRASER, Colonial Secretary.

- 1. The Jetty Regulations of 29th September, 1881, and 29th June, 1883, are hereby cancelled so far as the Port of Fremantle is concerned.
- 2. The Fremantle sea jetties will, in future, be under the control of the Collector of Customs, and the officer or officers duly authorised by him on that behalf.
- The whole of the trucking will be performed by the Customs Department, and the Wharfinger will not be held responsible for any goods after delivery on the platforms or at any of the Queen's Warehouses.
- 4. Consignees and shippers will be required to pay a charge of one shilling and six-pence per ton on all goods landed or shipped at the jetties, such charge including all labor in trucking on the jetties and platforms. The tonnage to be computed according to the following scale of measurement:-

Beer (in harrels) at 1s. 6d. per ton of 6 barrels. Beer (in hhds.) at 1s. 6d. per ton of 4 hhds. Water (in hhds.) at 1s. 6d. per ton of 5 hhds. Wool in bales at 1s. 6d. per ton of 4 bales. Chaff in bales at 1s. 6d. per ton of 2240lbs.

Lime in bags at 1s. 6d. per ton of 10 bags. Hides at 1d. each.

Empty hhds. at 2d. each.

Powder and other explosives in kegs and cases, at 5s. per ton of 2000lbs.

Horses at 9d. each. Cows and heifers at 9d. each. Bulls and steers at 9d. each. Pigs at 1d. each. Sheep at 1d. each. Smallest charge for any packet, 3d.

Under $\frac{1}{2}$ a ton, 6d. Over $\frac{1}{2}$ a ton, at the rate of 1s. 6d.

All goods not enumerated in the foregoing scale to be charged at 1s. 6d. per ton of 40 cubic feet, or, in cases of dead weight, 1s. 6d. per ton of 2240 lbs.

Passengers embarking or disembarking at any jetty will not be required to pay jetty dues on any articles of personal baggage carried in the hand.

5. On goods trucked after hours, on Holidays, or on Sundays (for which special permission has been obtained from the Collector of Customs) the Wharfinger will levy double rates on the above

- 6. Wharfage dues on packages or cases on which collectively the above charges do not exceed 5s. must be paid beforehand at the Wharfinger's Office and a ticket and receipt obtained.
- 7. The Wharfinger will give preference in trucking to goods entered for bond, to powder, and to other explosive materials, and truck other goods as far as possible in the order in which they are either received by land or sea, but always subject to his discretion under the circumstances.
- 8. No goods entered for warehousing in the Queen's Warehouses will be permitted to be discharged on the jetties after noon on Saturdays, and 3 p.m. on other days, without the permission of the Collector of Customs in writing.
- 9. The Wharfinger will not receive, place, or allow to be placed, goods more than 5 yards from or nearer than 1 yard to the rails.
- 10. In the event of it appearing that goods a being landed that cannot be removed in time to prevent a "block," the Collector of Customs may give notice, in writing, to the masters of vessels or lighters concerned, to stop discharging cargo for such time as may be deemed necessary by him.
- 11. No goods on any account to be placed between the lines of rails on the jetties or in any manner to impede the traffic. The Collector of Customs will cause any obstruction to be removed at
- 12. No goods are to remain on the platforms or the approaches to the jetties for more than 48 hours without the special permission of the Collector of Customs in writing, and no part of the approaches to the jetties shall be used except by persons to whom the land may be allotted for wharfage purposes, and the officer in charge thereof is empowered to order any unauthorised person or persons to vacate the same forthwith.
- The official hours for trucking will be from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. between the 1st October and the 30th April, with an interval of one hour each for breakfast and dinner, and on Saturdays the hours will be from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. From the 1st May to 30th September, work will not commence till 7 a.m., and continue until 5 p.m.
- The Harbor Master will have the entire control of berthing and removing all ships, boats, or vessels coming to the jetties, under the following Regulations:
 - a. No vessels, boats, or flats shall be fastened to any part of such jetty or jetties, except to such ring-bolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided for the purpose; and no vessels, boats, or flats shall lie alongside such jetties, unless so fastened. All vessels, boats, or flats so fastened shall also be anchored or moored in such manner as to relieve such jetties as much as possible from the weight of such craft; and in no case shall more than one tier of such vessels, boats, or flats lie alongside or be fastened to any such jetty or jetties, or be moored or fastened to other vessels, boats, or flats lying alongside any such jetty or jetties, except on special permission of the Harbor
 - b. Such vessels, boats, or flats shall not be moored or so fastened as aforesaid, except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period during the authorised hours than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

- c. Passenger boats only may lie alongside the steps on any such jetty or jetties, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers.
- d. All such vessels, boats, or flats lying alongside any such jetty or jetties shall, on the approach thereto of a passenger steamer, be hauled off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark passengers.
- e. Any steam vessel plying on the coast of this Colony shall be permitted to lie alongside any jetty for the purpose of discharging and taking in cargo at all hours of the day and night, consistently with the Regulations, without the permission of the Harbor Master.
- f. All steamers when lying at a jetty shall have and use two up-and-down fenders made of rope, and outside the up-and-down fenders a fore and aft rope fender of sufficient length and thickness to keep the guard streak entirely clear of the fender piles.
- g. All foreign-going vessels shall be moored alongside the jetties by the Harbor Master, in such position as may be indicated by such officer, who will, if necessary, direct the removal of other craft for that purpose.
- h. Vessels shall unload in the order in which they arrive, and are placed in a list to be kept by the Harbor Master. Application to be placed in turn on such lists according to arrival must be made to the Harbor Master on the day preceding that on which the vessel will unload. If such application be not made, the next vessel on the list shall have precedence, but the vessel forfeiting her turn may be placed next in succession. Vessels will load according to the order of application to the Harbor Master, and shall, when required by him, give place to vessels discharging cargo. Vessels arriving from or bound to foreign ports shall have precedence of coasting and other craft.
- i. In the event of any vessel or vessels being moored alongside any of the jetties in such way as to exclude any other vessel or vessels whose owners or masters wish also to moor her or them alongside consistently with the Regulations, the Harbor Master has power hereby to order the removal of such vessel or vessels to another berth or berths, and thus afford a berth or berths for such vessel or vessels so wishing to moor alongside such jetties.
- j. When the Harbor Master may deem it unsafe, through stress of weather, for a vessel to remain alongside a jetty, he shall direct the immediate removal of such vessel.
- 15. The Police will have charge of the water supply, to shipping; and the charge of 1s. per hundred gallons will be collected by the Collector of Customs. They will also patrol the jetties, keep peace and order, and allow no idlers to loiter about the platforms or jetties.
- 16. No person shall fish on such jetties, to the obstruction of the traffic.
- 17. Stones, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel (except in bags, baskets, or tubs) shall not be landed or placed on the jetties, except imported bricks or paving stone. Firewood for the use of passenger steamers and other vessels or boats shall be taken direct from the truck to the vessel. No goods shall be handed over the rails of the jetties.
- 18. No bullock or horse teams, or any wheeled vehicle other than a railway truck drawn by any

- quadruped or quadrupeds, shall be driven on or permitted to go on, and no riding on horseback will be permitted on, the Fremantle jetties.
- 19. No stones or other kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the water from such jetties, or from vessels moored alongside such jetties.
- 20. No person shall make fast any tackle, purchase, or other gear, to any part of the cranes placed at the ends of the jetties, or place or use any private derrick, crane, or other machine on such jetties without special permission obtained from the Collector of Customs in writing.
- 21. Not more than one ton shall be lifted with single half-inch chain, or two tons with a single block added. On a single five-eighth chain not more than 33 cwt. shall be lifted, or 66 cwt. with one single block. For heavier weights the number of parts of the chain shall be increased in proportion to the weight to be lifted; but not more than five tons shall be put upon any crane without special arrangements with the Collector.
- 22. The Wharfinger is to give and take receipts whenever called upon to do so.
- 23. In cases where special permission is granted by the Collector, or Principal Officer of Customs, for the landing of goods from beyond the seas on the beach, no such wharfage charges as are chargeable on goods landed at the sea jetties will be levied.
- 24. No person or persons shall land or place, or cause to be landed or placed upon the Jetties, or upon the approaches to the jetties, any decayed or decaying vegetables, matter, or other thing whatsoever likely to become a nuisance.

The following Rules and Regulations for the Western Australian Police Benefit Fund, framed under the provisions of the Ordinances 30 Vic., No. 10, and 48 Vic., No. 18, have been approved by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council, the Rules and Regulations hitherto in existence being cancelled:—

DERIVATION OF FUND.

1. (1.) A monthly deduction according to the following scale from the pay of each member of the Force:

- (2.) All fines imposed on the members of the Force.
- (3.) An annual grant voted by the Legislative Council upon the Estimates.
- 2. Every member of the Western Australian Police Force (exclusive of the Superintendent and the Inspectors) shall be subject to the following Rules.
- 3. The monies of the Fund shall be distributed in the following manner, under the recommendation of a Board of Officers to consist of the Colonial Secretary, the Colonial Treasurer, and the Superintendent of Police, for the time being, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.
- 4. Any member of the Force who may have served therein with good conduct for twelve consecutive years shall be permitted to claim his discharge therefrom, and a gratuity of one month's pay for each year's service.
- 5. Any member of the Force who may have served therein with good conduct for a longer period than twelve years may claim a gratuity calculated at the same rate as in the preceding Rule.
- 6. Any member of the Force who may have served therein with good conduct for seven consecutive years, and who may be reported on medical authority as unfit for further service, may claim a gratuity of one month's pay for each year's service.
- 7. Any member of the Force compelled to leave the service from injuries received in the execution of his duty may claim a gratuity not exceeding one year's pay in addition to any further claim he may have under these regulations.
- 8. Any member of the Force who shall become unfit for service consequent on ill health contracted in the discharge of his duty may claim a gratuity not exceeding one year's pay.
- 9. The widow or orphans of any member of the Force who shall have lost his life in the discharge of his duty may claim a gratuity equal to one year's pay of the deceased.
- 10. The widow or orphans of any member of the Force who may have served twelve or more years therein, and who may have died from natural causes, or have lost his life in the discharge of his duty, may claim a gratuity not exceeding one month's pay for each year's service of the deceased.
- 11. The widow or orphans of any member of the Force who has served for a period of seven and not exceeding twelve years therein, and who may have died from natural causes, may claim a gratuity not exceeding one month's pay for each year's service of the deceased.
- 12. The widow or orphans of any member of the Force who has served for a period of more than one year and less than seven years therein, and who may have died from natural causes, may claim a gratuity not exceeding Thirty pounds.

- The character and pecuniary position of the widow, and the number of children of a deceased member of the Force, will invariably be taken into consideration by the Board when recommending gratuities from this Fund, and it shall be lawful for the Board to apply the gratuity granted to such widow or orphans for their benefit in such manner as to the Board may seem fit.
- It shall be competent for the Board to recommend the payment of gratuities in any deserving cases not comprised in the foregoing clauses.
- All claims for gratuities must be supported by such certificates, vouchers, or testimonials as may be reasonably required by the Board.
- The moneys described in Clause 1 shall be received by the Superintendent of Police and be paid monthly into such Bank in the Colony as may be approved by the Governor, to the credit of an account to be called the "Western Australian Police Benefit Fund Account;" and moneys shall be drawn from such account only by cheques signed by two of the Members of the Board, of whom the Superintendent of Police shall be one.
- The Superintendent of Police shall cause proper accounts to be kept of the receipt and expenditure of all moneys received and expended under the foregoing Regulations, and the amounts shall be audited every twelve months by the Auditor General, who shall affix his signature thereto.
- These rules may be cancelled, altered, or amended from time to time, as the Governor in Council may direct.
- Members of the Force who joined prior to September, 1866, shall be entitled on resignation to a grant of Twenty-five pounds from the Fund towards payment for land: such grant being paid to the Commissioner of Crown Lands when the land has been selected and the purchase approved.
- Service on the Police Force, prior to 1861, to reckon as half-time towards a gratuity.

SUNKEN PATCH, NANANU CHANNEL, N. COAST, VITI LEVU.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Floating Beacon, showing as a vertical post 6ft. high and painted red, has been moored in 5 fathoms, on the southern edge of a sunken coral patch situated to the southward of the S.W. extreme of Nananu Island, North Coast, Viti Levu.

The patch extends in a North and South direction for about 300 yards, by about 100 yards broad; the least water found on it being 2½ fathoms near its centre.

Bearings from beacon:

Right extreme of small low island to northward in line with Native house on point of Nananu Id., N.N.E. (mag.), and Bluff point to S.-Eastward on with North shoulder of Tovu Pk., S.E. ½ E. (mag.)

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST. BASS STRAIT—SEAL OR DIRECTION ISLANDS.

(1) FLASHING RED LIGHT ON CLIFFY ISLAND.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 253 (2), of 1st September 1883, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse then in course of construction on the southern side of Cliffy island, Seal or Direction islands, northern shore of Bass strait:—

The Government of Victoria has given further Notice, that on 8th September 1884, the light would be exhibited:—

The light is a flashing red light, showing five flashes and eclipses alternately in every minute; it is elevated 180 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order. The lighthouse, 25 feet high, is constructed of stone. Position approximate, lat. 38° 57′ 10" S., long. 146° 42′ 25" E.

NORTH ISLAND—EAST COAST.

BAY OF ISLANDS.

(2) FIXED RED LIGHT ON WAIMANGAROA POINT.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that on 11th August 1884, a light would be exhibited from the northern extremity of the Railway Coal wharf at Waimangaroa (Opua) point, at the junction of Kaua-kaua and Waikari rivers:—

The light is a fixed red light, visible between the bearings of S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., through south, and S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE ISLAND-MASSACRE BAY.

(1) LEADING LIGHTS AT PORT WAITAPU.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that on 10th September 1884, four leading lights would be exhibited at port Waitapu, southern side of Massacre bay:—

The lights are two fixed white lights and two fixed green lights. Entering the river, the two white lights on Waitapu hill should be kept in line bearing about S.S.E., until the two green lights above the wharf are brought in line; then steer on that course as far as the wharf.

Position approximate, lat. 40° 49½′ S., long. 172° 50′ E.

NOTE.—The red beacons should be left on the starboard hand when entering, the black beacons on the port hand.

NORTH ISLAND-WEST COAST.

(2) KAIPARA HARBOUR—INTENDED FLASHING LIGHT ON NORTH HEAD.

Also, that a lighthouse is in course of creetion on North head of Kaipara harbour; from which it is anticipated that a light will be ready for exhibition about the month of December 1884;—

The light will be a flashing white light of the second order, showing a flash every ten seconds.

Position approximate, lat. 36° 23° S., long. 174° 8° E.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

(1) REVOLVING LIGHT ON DOUBLE ISLAND POINT.

The Queensland Government has given Notice, that in the latter part of the month of August 1881, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on the summit of Double Island point:—

The light is a revolving white light of the third order, with an interval of thirty seconds between the flashes, elevated 335 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 25 miles.

Position approximate, lat. 25° 56′ S., long. 153° 12½′ E.

PIONEER RIVER ENTRANCE (2) LEADING LIGHTS ON EAST POINT.

(2) LEADING HIGHTS ON EAST FOIRT.

Also, dated 28th July, 1884, that two leading lights are now exhibited from beacons erected on East Point, Pioneer river entrance, which, kept in line, lead through the deepest water over the flats at the lower end of the Town reach:

The lights are fixed white lights.
