BASS STRAIT—FLINDERS ISLAND.

(1) SHOAL REPORTED EASTWARD OF BABEL ISLANDS. The Government of Victoria has given Notice, of the reported existence of a shoal lying about 10 miles E. by S. from Babel islands, east side of Flinders island, eastern approach to Bass strait:—

This shoal, on which the British barque Minnic Carmichaed is stated to have struck, has an estimated depth of 3½ fathoms, and lies with the following bearings and distance:—

Cans Review

Cape Barren S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. Babel island summit W by N., distant 10 miles. Position, lat. 40° $1\frac{1}{2}$ S., long. 148° 33' E.

Note—Close southward of this position, the lead gave no bottom at 21 fathoms.

ARAFURA SEA.

(2) REEF REPORTED SOUTH-EASTWARD OF LYNEDOCH BANK.

The Government of Queensland has given Notice, on the authority of the Commander of the steam vessel Indus, of the existence of a reef lying about 33 miles south-eastward of Lynedoch bank, north coast of Australia.

This reef (Indus reef) appeared to extend about one mile in a north-east and south-west direction, with a breadth of a quarter of a mile, and to have very little water on its south-west end.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 10° Easterly in 1884.)

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-Law to abate the Nuisance arising from the removal of Night Soil and offensive matter within the City of Perth, and to regulate the time of such removal.

Whereas numerous complaints have been made by the inhabitants of the City, regarding the manner in which night soil and other offensive matters are removed from dwellings within the City, also with regard to the time of such removal, be it enacted by the Council of the City of Perth, that from and after the date of this Bye-Law coming into operation, every person who shall empty or begin to empty any privy or cesspool between the hours of 430 in the morning and 1130 at night, or remove along any thoroughfare the contents of such privy or cesspool or other such offensive matter between the hours aforenamed, or who shall wilfully or carelessly slop or spill any such offensive matter on the removal thereof, or who shall not carefully sweep and clean every place on which any such offensive matter shall have been placed, slopped or spilled, shall, on conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

Accommodation must be provided in the conveyances for at least six passengers.

The time of arrival and departure of the Post Office Mails at and from the several Post Offices shall be on such days and at such hours as the Postmaster General shall from time to time appoint.

In the case of any failure on the part of the Contractor in carrying out the terms of his Contract, and observing the time appointed by the Postmaster General, it shall be competent for the Postmaster

Men, vehicles, horses, and every person or thing employed in the conveyance of such Mails shall be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General.

The Postmaster General shall be previously informed by the Contractor of the name of every driver or other person entrusted with the custody of such Mails.

In case any servant of the Contractor employed in connection with such Mail Service shall be dismissed for misconduct or neglect, the name of such servant shall be forthwith reported to the Postmaster General, and the servant so dismissed shall not be eligible for re-employment in such service without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall not assign the benefit of any portion of his Contract without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall be liable for the following penalty which shall be deducted, on the authority of the Postmaster General, from any amount falling due to him on account of his contract:—For conveyance by his servants or passengers, or other person, of any correspondence or matter liable to postage charge, without the permission or direction of the Postmaster General (unless under instructions as to roadside correspondence and loose bags), any sum not exceeding £3 for such offence.

All journeys which ought to commence on a day previous to the conclusion of the Contract, as well as all other Mail Services ensuing on the route, must be accomplished by the Contractor.

The Contractor must understand that no excuse for delay will be entertained unless supported by certificates from persons of known respectability as to the cause of delay and that it is not attributable to the absence of ample provision for efficiently carrying out the terms of the Contract.

The Mails must be conveyed at the rate of at least seven miles an hour, inclusive of stoppages.

The Contractor is required to convey loose letters given to him by any Postmaster for delivery on the road; and, unless specially exempted, shall, when applied to by any person on the road, receive letters for conveyance to the nearest Post Office.
