**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

**NEW ZEALAND.**

**MIDDLE ISLAND—NORTH COAST.**

(1) LIGHTS AT FRENCH PASS.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that on 1st October, 1884, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on Channel point, South side of French pass, between Admiralty bay and Current basin:—

The light is a fixed red light of the sixth order, visible between the bearings of N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. through East, and S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; it is elevated 12 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 8 miles.

The Lighthouse is painted white.

Position, lat. 40° 55' S., long. 173° 52' E.

Also, that a fixed white light would be exhibited from the top of the perch on the Southern end of the reef, Northern side of French pass.

NOTE.—As this light can only be attended to in the day and during fine weather, mariners should not place reliance on its being lighted or visible.

**MIDDLE ISLAND—EAST COAST.**

(2) LEADING LIGHTS AT OAMARU.

Also, that on 25th September 1884, two leading lights would be exhibited from beacons erected above the cliff South-westward of Oamaru harbor:—

A fixed green light, elevated 120 feet above the sea, is shown from the upper or South beacon; a fixed white light, elevated 104 feet above the sea, is shown from the lower beacon.

The beacons are white, with a black vertical stripe in the centre of each; the South beacon is the gable of a small hut, the North beacon a disc; they bear from each other N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant 180 feet.

These beacons kept in line lead into the harbor, clearing the spit at the end of the breakwater by about 80 feet, and the mole end about 85 feet, with 18 feet water at the distance of 2 cables off the breakwater, 17 feet abreast the spit, and 16 feet abreast the mole end, at low water spring tides.

Vessels approaching the harbor, should bring the lights or beacons in line when about 2 cables off the breakwater, keeping them so till the end of the breakwater bears S.E. by E., then alter course to port, passing the mole (on which is a fixed red light) about 120 feet off, and steer for wharf if so directed, or anchor as convenient, out of the fairway if possible.

SIGNALS TO STEAM VESSELS.—Steam vessels arriving at night, and sounding the whistle on approaching the breakwater, will be signalled to wharf, as follows:—

Macandrew wharf.—A red light on West or outer corner of wharf.

Normanby and Sumpter wharves.—East side, a green light on East corner of wharf; West side, a red light on West corner of wharf.

If wharf berth is not clear, the above lights will not be shown; vessels should then anchor, or secure to mooring buoys.

NOTE.—Strangers should not attempt to enter the harbor at night, but keep about 5 miles outside till daylight, more especially with Southerly gales, as then the wind draws directly out of the entrance, and if much sea on, vessels might get dangerously near the North beach.

**MADAGASCAR—NORTH-WEST COAST.**

(1) PASSANDAVA BAY—FIXED LIGHT ON TANI-KELI ISLET.

The French Government has given Notice, dated 27th November, 1884, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse erected on the summit of Tani-Keli (or Ninepin) islet, Passandava bay:—

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 184 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

The lighthouse, 26 feet high, is painted white.

**CEYLON—WEST COAST.**

(2) COLOMBO PRINCIPAL LIGHT—INTENDED ALTERATION IN CHARACTER.

The Government of Ceylon has given Notice that on 1st January, 1885, the following alteration will be made in the character of the principal light, shown from the clock tower at that place:—

The light will be a group flashing white light, showing three flashes in quick succession every thirty seconds, each flash lasting two seconds, separated by an eclipse of three seconds and followed by an eclipse of eighteen seconds; the light will be elevated 135 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric, or by lenses, of the first order.
