PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, to wit.

ALEX. C. ONSLOW, Administrator. By His Excellency ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Esquire, Chief Justice, Administering the Government of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

N pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I, Alexander Campbell Onslow, Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation appoint

Tuesday, the 19th day of May, instant, a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Perth, Fremantle, and York.
