BILL to amend "The Dog Act, 1883."

THEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Dog Act, 1883:" Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

extended to thirty

THE time within which the owner of a dog shall register Time of Registration such dog in each and every year after the first day of January, or after he shall have become the owner at any other period of the year, is hereby extended from fifteen to thirty days, and whenever the words "fifteen days" occur in the fourth and eleventh sections of the said Act the words "thirty days" are hereby substituted in lieu thereof.

Penalty for nonregistration.

THE words "a sum of Forty shillings," in the eleventh section of the said Act, are hereby repealed, and the words "a sum not exceeding Forty shillings" are substituted in lieu thereof.

Saving clause.

THE provisions aforesaid shall not affect any liability incurred, or any proceedings commenced or taken in respect thereof before the coming into force of this Act, but such proceedings may be continued as if this Act had not passed.

A BILL to amend the Northern District Special Revenue Acts of 1873 and 1878.

HEREAS it is expedient that the Governor in Council should have power to appoint from time to time the persons who shall be the authorities to issue licenses under the said Acts: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Governor in Council to appoint licensing authorities.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall have power to appoint from time to time a person or persons to be the authority at any of the ports of the Colony to issue licenses and to do all other things which may lawfully be done by the Licensing Board under "The Northern District Special Revenue Act, 1873,"

and "The Northern District Special Revenue Act, 1873, Amendment Act, 1878," and from time to time to remove such persons from their appointments and to appoint other persons in their places.

2. SUCH appointments shall be duly published in the Government Gazette, and a copy of the Gazette containing a notification of to be evidence. any such appointment as aforesaid, and purporting to be printed by the Government Printer, shall be received as sufficient evidence at all times and in all places that the persons therein named as having been appointed have been duly appointed in that behalf. Provided that the omission to publish any such appointment in the Gazette as aforesaid shall not in any way affect the validity of such appoint-

- 3. WHENEVER the words "licensing board" are used in the said Acts, such words shall be held to mean the person or persons Interpretation. respectively appointed as aforesaid; and the words "port of Cossack," as used in the 5th section of the "Northern Special Revenue Act, 1873, Amendment Act, 1878," shall mean the port of the officer who shall have granted a license as aforesaid; and the words "Principal Officer of Customs" in the said section shall mean the officer who shall have granted the said license; and the words "at the said port" in the said section shall mean at the port of the officer who shall have granted a license as aforesaid.
- 4. NOTHING in this Act shall affect the validity of any license already granted, or any rights accrued, or any liabilities. Saving of rights and incurred, under the said recited Acts, before this Act shall have come into operation, and all proceedings in respect of such rights or

liabilities may be commenced, had, and continued as if this Act had

not passed.

5. THIS Act shall come into operation on the day 18 , but it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council Commencement of to make any appointments under this Act, previously to its coming into operation.

A BILL to amend "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," and the Imported Stock Acts of 1876, 1877, and 1879.

HEREAS it has been deemed expedient to include Camels within the provisions of the Acts relating to the importation of cattle and stock into this Colony, and to make provision for the extension of the said Acts to other animals under certain circumstances: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. THE words "cattle" or "stock" in "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," and in "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and in "Camels to be within the words "cattle" "The Imported Stock Act, 1876, Amendment Act, 1877," and in or "stock."

the Act intituled "An Act for the Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," being No. 23 of 1879, shall apply to and include camels in addition to the animals mentioned in the said Acts.

may be included.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council. Any other animals may from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, order that any other animals not included within the provisions of the aforesaid Acts shall be from the time mentioned in the said notice included therein, and from and after the time mentioned in the said notice the provisions of the said Acts shall apply to and include such other animals as aforesaid.

Government Gazette to be evidence.

THE production of a copy of the Government Gazette, purporting to be printed by the Government Printer, and including such a notice as aforesaid, shall be sufficient evidence at all times and in all places that the animals mentioned in the said notice are included within the provisions of the said Acts and from the time stated in the said notice.

Short title and commencement of Act.

THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Imported Stock Amendment Act, 1885," and shall come into operation on the day of 188 .

A BILL to diminish the dangers resulting from Bush Fires.

THEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relating to Bush Fires: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

THIS Act may be cited as "The Bush Fires Act, 1885." 1.

Commencement of Act

2. THIS Act shall come into force on the day 18 ; but it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, previously to this Act coming into force, to declare the times during which it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in any part of the Colony after the commencement of this Act.

THE Ordinance No. 15 of 1847, intituled "An Ordinance to Repeal of 10 Vic., diminish the dangers resulting from Bush Fires," is hereby repealed; provided that this repeal shall not affect any liability incurred, or any right accrued, or the validity of any proceedings commenced or taken before the commencement of this Act, but such liability or right may be enforced, and such proceedings may be carried on, as if this Act had not passed.

Interpretation.

- IN this Act the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, if not inconsistent with the context:
 - "Bush" shall mean and include grass, stubble, shrubs, bushes, trees, and all other vegetation.

- "Prohibited times" shall mean the times of the year during which it shall have been declared by the Governor in Council to be unlawful to set fire to the bush within any district or part of the Colony, as hereinafter mentioned.
- THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time, by notice published in the Government Governor in Council Gazette, declare the times of the year during which it shall be times. unlawful within any district or part of the Colony, mentioned in the said notice, to set fire to the bush within that district or part, and may from time to time revoke, vary, or amend such declarations by notice as aforesaid.

6. A COPY of the Government Gazette, purporting to be printed by the Government Printer, and containing any such notice as Government Gazette aforesaid, shall be received in all courts of justice and elsewhere as evidence of the prohibited times within the district or part of the Colony named in such notice.

EVERY person who shall wilfully or negligently set fire to the bush within any district or part of the Colony during the pro- Penalty for setting hibited times for that district or part, shall be liable, on conviction ing prohibited times. thereof before any two or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds. Provided that any lawful occupier of land may set fire to the bush on the land in his occupation dur- Proviso. ing such prohibited times if he shall have previously given seven days notice to all the owners or occupiers of lands next adjacent to his said land, and if he shall also take all such precautions as shall prevent the said fire from extending to any of the lands adjacent, or from damaging the crops, grass, trees, houses, or buildings on any of the lands adjacent.

IF any occupier of land shall wilfully set fire to the bush on the lands in his occupation during any prohibited times without Penalty for setting having given seven days notice to all the owners or occupiers of fire to bush without notice to adjacent adjacent land as aforesaid, he shall be liable, on conviction thereof occupiors. before any two or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, although such fire shall not have extended to any of the adjacent lands and shall not have done any damage as aforesaid.

9. NO conviction, payment of penalty, endurance of punishment, or proceeding taken under this Act shall take away or affect Saving of other remedies and proceedings. any right of action or other remedy at Common Law or otherwise which any person may have in respect of any loss or damage caused by any such fire as aforesaid, nor interfere with the provisions of the Act of the Imperial Parliament relating to malicious injuries to property, adopted by "The Criminal Law Consolidation Ordinance, 1865."

Powder and all Explosives double 2nd Class rates. Goods of a Dangerous Nature.

The Commissioner is not a common carrier of gunpowder, blasting powder, gun cotton, dynamite lithofracteur, fireworks, cartridges, aquafortis, mineral acids, petroleum, or lucifer matches, or any other goods which in the judgment of himself or his officers may be of a dangerous nature, and when the conveyance of such goods is undertaken it must be distinctly understood that it is entirely at the owner's risk, and that the Commissioner will not be responsible for any loss or damage occurring to or caused by same during transit, or while being loaded or unloaded, or at any time while in the custody of the Railway Depart-

In order that all necessary precautions may be taken to ensure safety, no such goods are to be taken to the Railway unless their nature is made known, either by a conspicuously printed notice of contents exhibited on the outside of each package, or by a written notice of contents being handed to the receiving officer to whom the goods are made over. Any person disregarding this regulation will be liable under the Railway Acts, By-Law 5, (44 Vic., No. 17, Sec. 15), to a penalty not exceeding £50.

Special Regulations for the Conveyance of Gunpowder and other Explosives.

All Gunpowder or other explosives must be packed in barrels closely joined and hooped, or in copper, zinc, or tinned cases or canisters enclosed in wooden boxes or barrels, and so secured that no part of the explosive can escape. Casks or other packages of blasting or loose powder must also be placed in bags or sacks to be provided by

No barrel or package is to contain more than 100fbs.

On the outside of each barrel or package the contents must be distinctly specified in conspicuous letters of not less than 1 inch in length, and each barrel or package must

No explosive of any kind exceeding 100lbs. is to be taken to a Railway Station for despatch unless accompanied by a permit from the Traffic Manager authorising the same to be received and forwarded. In Perth these permits are to be obtained direct from the Traffic Manager by application at his office, but at other stations they may be procured through the Station-master. Station-masters are empowered to arrange for the conveyance of quantities of 100lbs. and under, without reference to the Traffic Manager; but under no circumstances is the smallest quantity of any kind of explosive to be brought to the est quantity of any kind of explosive to be brought to the Railway unless permission is first obtained from the officer in charge of the station from which it is to be despatched.
