TELEGRAPHIC.

Transmit following Telegram to Governor New Zealand and other Australian Colonies, and Scratchley:—
Her Majesty's Government have agreed with Germany Her Majesty's Government have agreed with Germany following boundary New Guinea: Starting on the coast near Mitre rock on eighth parallel, following this parallel to degree 147 East Longitude, thence straight line to the North-west, to where sixth parallel cuts degree 144, thence West-north-west, to where fifth parallel cuts degree 141. This line calculated to approximate watershed and divide tensitive nearly according territory nearly equally.

REMOVAL OF LIGHTSHIP AND PLACING OF ADDITIONAL BUOY AND BEACONS, KEPPEL

NOTICE is hereby given, that on the 14th proximo the Lightship will be removed from the Elbow, Keppel Bay, the Channel now being marked by the Leading Lights on Balaklava Island, which were established on 17th February last.

The Elbow of the Bank will be marked by a Red Buoy carrying a cage 3 feet in diameter, 12 feet above the water. The Buoy will lie in 18 feet at low water, I cable North of the present position of the Lightship.

Two additional red and triangular Beacons have also been placed in 7 feet of water on the West Bank ("Wagtail Sand"), one on its southern extremity, and the other about midway between that and the old Beacon. These Beacons should not be approached within ½ a cable. On the Curlew Spit an additional Beacon, black and square, has been placed in 8 feet at low-water springs.

A berth must be given it of not less than ½ of a cable.

TORRES STRAITS.

REEFS NEAR AND EXTENDING FROM SAIBAI ISLAND.

SAIBAI ISLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Reef, upon which is a Sand-bank always dry, lies with its Eastern extremity N. by W. ½ W., 2½ miles from the Hill, 50 feet high, shown on the North-west end of Saibai Island, on the plan by Navigating Lieutenant E. R. Connor, R.N. The Reef is about 1½ miles in length, East and West, and ½ mile in width.

Another Reef, which at low-water springs is dry about 2 feet, lies with its N.E. extremity N.N.W. 1 mile from the same hill. The Reef is about 1½ miles in length and 3 cables wide, and lies N.E. ½ E. and S.W. ¾ W.

The extremities of both these Reefs are marked by Beacons, and they can be approached to within a ½ cable on either side.

There is a clear passage, with 3 fathoms at low water, between the southernmost of these Reefs and Saibai Island.

A third Reef, awash at low water, and which is 1 mile in extent, lies E.N.E. and W.S.W., with its centre in the following approximate position:—Peak of Mount Cornwallis, S.E. ½ S. 8½ miles.

The fringing Reef extends from the western end of Saibai Island to a distance of nearly 1 mile.

SHOAL NORTHWARD OF CAPE LAMBERT.

SHOAL NOETHWARD OF CAPE LAMBERT.

The German Government has published the following information—on the authority of the Commander of the German vessel of war Elizabeth—of the existence of a shoal, lying with cape Lambert, New Britain, bearing S. by E. ½ E., distant about 19 miles:—
This shoal, seen from the Elizabeth at 2h. p.m., 24th November, 1884, consists of several rocks above water, and shoal patches, extending apparently over an area of about 2 miles. The position, by observations, of the north extreme of this danger is given in lat. 3° 50′ S., long. 151° 33′ E.

NOTE.—It is considered that this shoal is identical with Legelis shoals, previously reported in lat. 3° 55′ S., long. 151° 40′ E., or about 7 miles S.E. by E. of the position now given.

(The bearings are Magnetic. Variation 6° Easterly in 1885.)

SPENCER GULF.

(1) MIDDLE BANK-BEACON, REPORTED EXTENSION.

The Government of South Australia has given Notice, dated 9th April, 1885, that a pile beacon, painted red and black chequered, and surmounted by a large circular head, has been placed on Middle bank, Spencer Gulf, in 18 feet at low water spring tides, with Barn hill bearing E. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N.

Approximate position, lat. 33° 36' S. long. 137° 351' E.

Also, that the Master of the steam vessel Governor Musgrave has reported, that Middle bank extends nearly 4 miles farther northward than was previously shown on the Admiralty charts.—Soundings of to 4 fathoms having been obtained at that distance from the supposed northern edge of the bank.

(2) SHOAL REPORTED NORTH-EAST OF FOUR-FATHOMS PATCH.

Also, that the Master of the steam vessel Governor Musgrave has reported the existence of a shoal lying in the fairway of Spencer gulf, westward of Jarrold point, and about 3 miles E.N.E. of Four-fathoms patch buoy.

This shoal, with a depth of 4 fathoms at low water spring tides and 7 to 8 fathoms close around, extends about one mile in a north and south direction, with a breadth of about three quarters of a mile. Position, lat. 33° 15′ S., long. 137° 39′ E.

(3) BEACON ON WESTERN SHOAL.

Also, that a pile beacon, painted black, and surmounted by a large square head, has been placed on an outlying patch of Western shoal, Spencer gulf, in 19 feet at low water spring tides, with the following beautiful. bearings :-

(4) LIGHT-VESSEL OFF NORMAN RIVER BAR.

The Government of Queensland has given Notice, dated 25th March, 1885, that a light-vessel has been placed off Norman river bar, south shore of Carpentaria gulf:—
The light is a fixed white light, elevated 34 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses of the fifth order. The light-vessel, painted red, is moored in 12½ feet at low water, one cable N.W. by N. from the position of the Fairway buoy.
