That in each case of the Birth of every child in the said Colony the parent shall, within thirty days, and in the case of the Death of any person the tenant of the house or place shall, within fourteen days next thereafter, respectively inform the District Registrar of such Birth or Death, and of all the particulars concerning the same, according to the form of registration hereinbefore referred to.

Section 30.

That every person who shall offend against this Ordinance by refusing or neglecting to give any notice or information required by any of the foregoing sections, or by knowingly registering any Birth or Death contrary to the provisions of any of the said sections, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not less than Two Pounds, nor exceeding Twenty Pounds.
