FINDING of the Court of Inquiry held at the Custom House, Fremantle, on the 25th August, 1885, into the circumstances attending the stranding of the British

schooner "Spinaway" (No. 68922) in Gage's Roads, in the Port of Fremantle, on the 18th August, 1855.

It is to be regretted that the Master was not on board at the time of the casualty, and we are of opinion that masters should not leave their vessels during stormy weather, in the Port of Fremantle, and therefore we consure Mr. Garrick, the Master of the "Spinaway."

The Mate (who holds a British Certificate of Competency as Master Mariner) did all that could have been done in this case.

We are of opinion that the warp passed from the "Sketty Belle" to the "Spinaway" did not in any way contribute to the parting of the first cable, and that it was intended for mutual protection in case of need, but was not tightened or used at all.
