NOTICE is hereby given that a large Iron Cask Mooring Buoy, attached to a 35 (thirty-five) cwt. anchor by 50 fathoms of one and seven-eighths inch chain cable, has been laid down about one hundred and thirty (130) fathoms off the end of the Rockingham Jetty.

Vessels can shackle their own chains on to the upper ring of this buoy, and slacken in to the Jetty.

Should it be necessary at any time for a vessel to let go one of her own anchors, great care must be taken to avoid any chance of fouling the mooring by so doing.
