II IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Proclamation issued by the Governor of South Australia, prohibiting the importation into that Colony of horned cattle, sheep, or swine shipped in Western Australia.

(L.S.) WILLIAM C. F. ROBINSON. Proclamation by His Excellency Sir William CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Province of South Australia and the Dependencies thereof, &c., &c.

PY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Act No. 12, intituled "An Act to enable the Governor to prevent the importation of cattle into South Australia under certain circumstances, and for other purposes," and the Act No. 19, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said province, do hereby absolutely prohibit the introduction or importation into the province of South Australia of horned cattle, sheep, or swine shipped in the colony of Western Australia, unless the owner or importor shall produce to an inspector of sheep in this province a certificate, signed by an inspector of sheep in Western Australia, that such horned cattle, sheep, or swine were bred in that colony, or that they had been kept in that colony for not less than six months, and were, during that period and at time of leaving the said colony, free from any infectious or contagious disease: And I further order and direct that this proclamation shall take effect from the date hereof, and shall continue in full force and effect until the same is revoked by proclamation in the

Given under my hand and the public seal of the said province, at Adelaide, this twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and in the forty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.
