Crown Lands' Office, Perth, 19th January, 1886. SCAB DISTRICTS.-CENTRAL.

Bounded on the North by the South boundary of the Victoria District; on the West by the sea coast including the islands adjacent to it; on the South by an East line from the sea coast passing along the south side of Rock-ingham townsite to the Perth-Albany Road, from thence in a North-easterly direction to Mount Dale, from thence in a South east direction to the Dethem Birger from thence in a South-east direction to the Hotham River, from thence in upward along the river aforesaid to Millingnalling Pool, and thence by a due East line, including the sea coast and islands adjacent to it; and on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony.

SOUTH-WEST.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the Southern boundary of the Central District; on the Westward and Southward by the sea coast and the islands adjacent to it; Southward by the sea coast and the Islands adjacent to it; on the Eastward by lines extending in a North-easterly direction from Point D'Entrecasteaux to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarrup Rivers, thence in a North-westerly direction to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers, thence in a similar direction to the 41st mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence East to the South-west boundary of the Central District, and from thence in a North-westerly direction along the said Southwest boundary to Mt. Dale.

SOUTH-EAST.

Bounded on the North by the South boundary of the Central District; on the West by the East boundary of the South-west District; and on the *South* by the sea coast in-cluding the islands adjacent to it.

The Scab Districts gazetted 21st November, 1882, are hereby cancelled.

Poison Sale Act, 1879. 43rd Victoria, No. 14.

Regulations as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons in the town of Fremantle, in the district of Fremantle.

WHEREAS "The Poison Sale Act, 1879," enacts that the undermentioned articles, viz. :-

Arsenic and its preparations,

Prussic Acid, Cyanides of Potassium, and all Metallic Cyanides, Strychnine and all poisonous vegetable alkaloids and

their salts, Aconite and its preparations,

Emetic Tartar,

Corrosive Sublimate, Cantharides,

Savin and its oil, Ergot of Rye and its preparations,

shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the said Act. And whereas the undermentioned articles are by proclamation in the Government Gazette of July 3rd, 1884, also deemed to be poisons within the meaning of the said Act:

White Precipitate,

Red Precipitate, Chloral Hydrate.

That persons selling such above-named Poisons shall be That persons selling such above-handed Poisons shall be licensed by the Resident Magistrate of his District. That they shall observe all the regulations respecting the sale of poison as specified in Section 3, and that they shall conform to such further regulations as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of such poisons as may from time to time be prescribed by the Resident Magistrate of his District. District.

Notice is hereby given that the following regulations will be enforced in the Town of Fremantle and the District of Fremantle.

- 1st. The Book required by Section 3 to be kept for the purpose of making entries therein of the sale of Poison shall at all times be available for inspection by any Justice of the Peace, Police Constable, or other Police Officer.
- 2nd. None of such Poisons shall be sold, or disposed of, or be given at any time to any person under the apparent age of twenty-one years, or in a state of intoxication, nor to any convict, ticket-of-leave holder, aboriginal native, or half-caste native.
- 3rd. No person shall keep any of such Poisons for sale by retail, in any shop, house of business, or other place, without labelling each box, vessel, wrapper, or cover which may contain such Poisons with the word "Poison."


