"Explosives Act" Rules.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Regulations, framed under "The Explosives Act, 1885" (49 Vic., No. 16), and approved by him in Executive Council.

NOTICE.

The Governor in Executive Council directs and orders the publication of the following Regulations under "The Explosives Act, 1885" (49 Victoria, No. 16).

1. These rules may be cited as the Explosives Act Rules, and they shall come into operation from and immediately after the first day of May, 1886.

2. In the construction of these Rules any words herein used which are defined by "The Explosives Act, 1885," shall have the meaning in the said Act assigned to them respectively.

3. Every ship arriving in any of the harbors of the Colony having explosives on board shall be moored at such a spot within the usual anchorage as shall be directed by the local authority (not being within a quarter of a mile of any other ship, or within half a mile of any public wharf or landing place), until she shall have discharged all the explosives on board.

4. Every ship having explosives on board shall carry a red flag at the mast-head as a danger signal, so long as such ship shall be in any of the harbors of the Colony.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 3, any such ship as aforesaid may with the written permission of the local authority be taken alongside a wharf or pier between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. for the purpose of discharging explosives, but every such ship shall be removed to her moorings after the hour of three p.m.

LANDING AND SHIPPING.

6. All explosives shall be landed in the original packages in which they are imported, and shall be shipped in like manner, or in strong and secure boxes made of jarrah timber, iron or zinc, or such other material as the local authority shall approve.

7. Explosives shall not be landed or shipped in any harbor of the Colony between the hours of 4 p.m. and 8 a.m.

8. Explosives shall be shipped from and landed at such places as the local authority shall direct, and at no other place.

9. In shipping and landing explosives, coverings made of wadmal tilts, hides, haircloth, tarpaulins, or thick plain canvas shall be used, or such other covering as the local authority may authorise.

10. All explosives landed at any public wharf or jetty or in any harbor shall be removed therefrom immediately to a magazine, store, or other premises licensed under the provisions of the said Act.

11. No explosives shall be landed until proper arrangements to the satisfaction of the local authority shall have been made for the immediate removal of the same as aforesaid.

NOTICE is hereby given that from and after the first day of July next, no ship or vessel engaged in the coasting trade of the Colony, whether carrying passengers or not, will be permitted to clear out or proceed to sea unless commanded by a competent certificated master, as provided by "The Colonial Passengers Ordinance, 1861," and the amending Acts. In the case of ships or vessels engaged in the coasting trade carrying passengers on any coasting voyage (except on voyages between Cape Naturaliste and the North-West Cape, or between Albany and Eucla, or between any intermediate ports between Cape Naturaliste and the North-West Cape, or Albany and Eucla), the provisions of the Acts requiring such ships or vessels to carry a certificated mate, in addition to a competent certificated master, will continue to be enforced from the present time as heretofore.

Upon any breach of the said Ordinance or other Acts, proceedings will be taken and the penalties prescribed thereby enforced.

Fresh Meat, Fish, Poultry (dead), Dairy produce, Eggs, Fruit, under 1 cwt., 25 per cent. reduction on parcels rates.

All parcels should be at the Station 15 minutes before the departure of the train by which they are to be forwarded.

Parcels over £10 value and under £50, double rate; over £50, quadruple rate. Although these rates are charged and the value of the parcel declared accordingly, the Department does not hold itself responsible for the contents.

Musical Instruments, Sewing Machines, Perambulators, Bicycles, double parcels rates.

Corpse 1s. per mile, minimum 20s.

Newspaper parcels, open at ends, one quarter rates.

Passengers' excess luggage, parcels rates.

† **Goods of a Dangerous Nature.**

The Commissioner is *not* a common carrier of gunpowder, blasting powder, gun cotton, dynamite, lithofracteur, fireworks, cartridges, aquafortis, mineral acids, petroleum, or lucifer matches, or any other goods which in the judgment of himself or his officers may be of a dangerous nature; and when the conveyance of such goods is undertaken it must be distinctly understood that it is *entirely at the owner's risk*, and that the Commissioner will not be responsible for any loss or damage occurring to or caused by same during transit, or while being loaded or unloaded, or at any time while in the custody of the Railway Department.

In order that all necessary precautions may be taken to ensure safety, no such goods are to be taken to the Railway unless their nature is made known, either by a conspicuously printed notice of contents exhibited on the outside of each package, or by a written notice of contents being handed to the receiving officer to whom the goods are made over. Any person disregarding this regulation will be liable under the Railway Acts, By-Law 5 (44 Vic., No. 17, Sec. 15) to a penalty not exceeding £50.

(See *Special Regulations for conveyance of Gunpowder and other explosives*).

Special Regulations for the Conveyance of Gunpowder and other Explosives.

All Gunpowder or other explosives must be packed in barrels closely joined and hooped, or in copper, zinc, or tinned cases or canisters enclosed in wooden boxes or barrels, and so secured that no part of the explosive can escape. Casks or other packages of blasting or loose powder must also be placed in bags or sacks to be provided by sender.

No barrel or package is to contain more than 100lbs.

On the outside of each barrel or package the contents must be distinctly specified in conspicuous letters of not less than 1 inch in length, and each barrel or package must also be addressed.

No explosive of any kind exceeding 100lbs. is to be taken to a Railway Station for despatch unless accompanied by a permit from the Traffic Manager authorising the same to be received and forwarded. In Geraldton these permits are to be obtained direct from the Traffic Manager by application at his office, but at other stations they may be procured through the Station Master. Station Masters are empowered to arrange for the conveyance of quantities of 100lbs. and under, without reference to the Traffic Manager; but under no circumstances is the smallest quantity of any kind of explosive to be brought to the Railway unless permission is first obtained from the officer in charge of the station from which it is to be despatched.

Any consignments of explosives not taken delivery of at destination and removed from the Railway premises within 24 hours after arrival, will be forfeited to the Commissioner, and when the quantity exceeds 100lbs., in addition to forfeiture the owner or consignee will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50. Before a permit for despatch will be granted by the Traffic Manager the sender will be required to sign an agreement, undertaking to have the consignment removed at destination in accordance with this regulation.

Powder or other explosives will not be left at any place where there is not an officer in charge, unless there is some one present to take delivery, but will be taken on to the next station and left there at owner's risk and expense.

Permits will not be granted in Geraldton after 4 p.m. on the day preceding despatch, nor after 12 noon on Saturdays.

The only time at which the Department will receive explosives is between 7 a.m. and 12 noon: and when the quantity exceeds 100lbs., only on Tuesdays and Thursdays (holidays excepted) in Geraldton, and at other stations on days to be specially arranged with the Traffic Manager or Station Master.

The Commissioner does not guarantee to receive explosives at any time, either on appointed days or otherwise, unless the necessary vans are available in which to place the same, and he reserves to himself the right to delay the despatch of any consignment, after received, as long as he may think proper, in order that other consignments may be forwarded in the same van. To secure despatch by first available train after received by the Department, a minimum charge of 1 ton must be paid.

On and after 15th March, the above Classification and Rates will come into force,—all previous lists being cancelled.
