# Rules for the Examination for the Government University Exhibition.

- 1. An Exhibition to be held at any one of the Universities hereinafter mentioned shall be open for competition to any boy between the ages of sixteen and eighteen years, whose parents, or either of them, shall be bonâ fide residents in the Colony of Western Australia, and who himself shall have been a resident therein for a period of two years at least previous to the holding of the Examination provided for by these Rules.
- 2. The said Exhibition shall be tenable for a period of three years, and shall be of the value of £100 for each of the said three years.
- 3. All competitors for the said Exhibition shall pass an Examination to be held at such place and by such Examiner or Examiners as may be appointed by the Board of Governors of the High School.
- 4. The said Examination shall be held during the month of May in each year, and shall comprise the following subjects, viz.:—
  - 1. Arithmetic: all.
  - 2. Algebra: including quadratic equations.
  - 3. Trigonometry: including solution of triangles
  - 4. Euclid: Books I, II, and III, including riders thereon.
  - 5. Virgil, either first three books of Æneid or the four Georgics.
  - 6. Livy: XXI Book.
  - 7. Greek: Homer's Iliad, Books I, II, and III.
  - 8. French: Fénelon's Télémaque.
  - 9. English Composition and Modern Geography.
  - Outlines of English, Greek, and Roman History.
- 5. Every competitor shall give to the Secretary of the said Board at least one month's notice of his intention to compete at such Examination, and, together with such notice, shall forward to the said Secretary two certificates (a) attesting the good character and repute of such competitor, and (b) a certificate of birth.
- 6. In case of a competitor from the High School, or from the Fremantle Grammar School, the certificate (a) shall be given and signed by the Head Master of such competitor's school; in all other cases such certificate shall be given and signed by the clergyman, priest, or minister of the religious denomination to which such competitor shall belong and of the district in which such competitor shall be residing, or by the Resident Magistrate of that district.
- 7. The said Examiner or Examiners shall, as soon as they can reasonably do so, report to the Board the result of such Examination, and the Board shall thereupon submit to the Governor the name of the successful competitor, who, on His Excellency approving the same, shall be thereupon gazetted by notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office as the

winner of the said Exhibition, which shall be held subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- a. The holder shall, within twelve months after the date of such Gazette notice, gain admission to the University either of London, Sydney, or Melbourne, or to any one of the colleges of the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge at which a matriculation examination is necessary previous to residence thereat.
- b. He shall begin residence at the University or College to which he may have been admitted as soon after such admission as the Regulations of such University or College shall allow.
- 8. Nothing in the previous Rules contained shall entitle any competitor to the Exhibition unless he shall have gained at least two-thirds of the full marks attainable at the aforesaid Examination.
- 9. The holder of the Exhibition shall be entitled to receive the said sum of £100 by half-yearly instalments so long as he continues in residence at such University or College, subject to the production of such certificates or other evidence as the Governor may from time to time direct.
- 10. The Board of Governors of the High School may from time to time, with the approval of the Governor, revoke, add to, or amend these Rules.

"Explosives Act" Rules. 19 Vic., No. 16.

IIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Regulations, framed under "The Explosives Act, 1885" (49 Vic., No. 16), and approved by him in Executive Council.

### NOTICE.

The Governor in Executive Council directs and orders the publication of the following Regulations under "The Explosives Act, 1885" (49 Victoria, No. 16).

- 1. These rules may be cited as the Explosives Act Rules, and they shall come into operation from and immediately after the first day of May, 1886.
- 2. In the construction of these Rules any words herein used which are defined by "The Explosives Act, 1885," shall have the meaning in the said Act assigned to them respectively.
- 3. Every ship arriving in any of the harbors of the Colony having explosives on board shall be moored at such a spot within the usual anchorage as shall be directed by the local authority (not being within a quarter of a mile of any other ship, or within half a mile of any public wharf or landing place), until she shall have discharged all the explosives on board.

- 4. Every ship having explosives on board shall carry a red flag at the mast-head as a danger signal, so long as such ship shall be in any of the harbors of the Colony.
- 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 3, any such ship as aforesaid may with the written permission of the local authority be taken alongside a wharf or pier between the hours of ten a.m. and three p.m. for the purpose of discharging explosives, but every such ship shall be removed to her moorings after the hour of three p.m.

#### LANDING AND SHIPPING.

- All explosives shall be landed in the original packages o. An exposives shall be failed in the original packages in which they are imported, and shall be shipped in like manner, or in strong and secure boxes made of jarrah timber, iron or zinc, or such other material as the local authority shall approve.
- 7. Explosives shall not be landed or shipped in any harbor of the Colony between the hours of 4 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- 8. Explosives shall be shipped from and landed at such places as the local authority shall direct, and at no other place.
- 9. In shipping and landing explosives, coverings made of wadmal tilts, hides, haircloth, tarpaulins, or thick plain canvas shall be used, or such other covering as the local authority may authorise.
- 10. All explosives landed at any public wharf or jetty or in any harbor shall be removed therefrom immediately to a magazine, store, or other premises licensed under the provisions of the said Act.
- 11. No explosives shall be landed until proper arrangements to the satisfaction of the local authority shall have been made for the immediate removal of the same as aforesaid.
