SUNKEN ROCK AND SHOAL GROUND NORTHWARD OF EAGLE ISLET.

Information has been received from Lieutenant and Commander Pullen, H. M. Surveying vessel Lavit, of the existence of a dangerous rock, and shoal ground extending about 6 cables northward of the rocf fringing Eagle islet, western side of the Inner Route to Torres strait.

The rock, with less than 6 feet water on it, lies with Eagle islet bearing S. § E., distant one mile; a small rock above water is situated between it and the fringing reef; and shoal patches lie about 5 cables south-eastward of the sunken rock.

Position of rock, lat. 14° 41′ S., long. 145° 24¾ E.

THE Commissioner of Crown Lands hereby gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act 38 Vic., No. 13, Sec. 119, he will grant a License to practise as a Surveyor, under the said Act, on the following conditions:—

- a. That the applicant holds a License under a similar Act in one of the following Colonies, viz., South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, New Zealand, or Tasmania, and that he produces a Certificate, of not more than one year's previous date, from the Surveyor General of one of the said Colonies, that he is a thoroughly qualified and reliable Surveyor.
- b. Any Licensed Surveyor of any of the abovenamed Colonies, but not licensed under the Real Property Act of one of those Colonies, shall be required to produce the same Certificate as above (under a), and, in addition, shall be subjected to an experience in field work in this Colony of not less than 12 months, before being eligible to apply for a License.
- c. Any Surveyor who shall prove to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands that he has passed an examination (equivalent to that prescribed for a licensed Surveyor in the Colonies of South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, New Zealand, or Tasmania) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British Colony, and that he has been in field practice there for not less than two years, shall be eligible to apply for a license on the same conditions as under b.
- d. Any Surveyor not qualified as above under a, b, or c, shall serve at least two years in Western Australia as a Surveyor, before being eligible to apply for a License.
- e. In all cases the Commissioner of Crown
 Lands reserves to himself the right to
 subject the applicant to any examination
 or conditions he may consider necessary.
 An applicant for a License must present
 himself personally at the office of the
 Commissioner of Crown Lands, unless
 specially excused from such attendance.
