# 1924 PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; NOW THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of the Legislative COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on Wednes-DAY, THE SIXTEENTH DAY OF JUNE NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

THE Commissioner of Crown Lands hereby gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act 38 Vic., No. 13, Sec. 119, he will grant a License to practise as a Surveyor, under the said Act, on the following conditions:-

- That the applicant holds a License under a similar Act in one of the following Colonies, viz., South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queenland, New Zealand, and Colonies and Colonie land, or Tasmania, and that he produces a Certificate, of not more than one year's previous date, from the Surveyor General of one of the said Colonies, that he is a thoroughly qualified and reliable Surveyor.
- b. Any Licensed Surveyor of any of the above-named Colonies, but not licensed under the Real Property Act of one of those Colonies, shall be required to produce the same Certificate as above (under a), and, in addition, shall be subjected to an experience in field work in this Colony of not less than 12 months, before being eligible to apply for a License.
- c. Any Surveyor who shall prove to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands that he has passed an examination (equivalent to that prescribed for a licensed Surveyor in the Colonies of South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, New Zealand, or Tasmania) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British Colony, and that he has been in field practice there for not less than two years, shall be eligible to apply for a license on the same conditions as under b.
- d. Any Surveyor not qualified as above under a, b, or c, shall serve at least two years in Western Australia as a Surveyor, before being eligible to apply for a License.
- In all cases the Commissioner of Crown Lands reserves to himself the right to subject the applicant to any examination or conditions he may consider necessary.
