### Order in Council. 1474

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

HEREAS by the said Act, the Governor in Executive Council is empowered from time to time to make such orders as he may think expedient, for preventing the introduction into Western Australia of insects, or of matter destructive or prejudicial to vegetation, and to prohibit or regulate the landing in, or other introduction into Western Australia of any tree, shrub, plant, or any portion thereof, or any substance, or any other article, vegetable, or mineral, from any place out of Western Australia, the landing or other introduction whereof may appear to the Governor in Council likely to introduce any such insects or other matter into Western Aus-Now I, Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, tralia. Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by this Order made in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, order and direct as follows :----

- 1. From and after the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette, no grapes, grape vine, cutting or other portion of a grape vine shall be landed in or otherwise introduced into Western Australia.
- 2. It shall be the duty of every Collector of Customs, Sub-Collector of Customs, Landing Waiter, or other officer of Customs, on ascertaining that any such grapes, grape vines, cutting or other portion of a grape vine have or has been landed, immediately to seize and cause the same to be destroyed by fire; and also to seize and in like manner destroy every case, package, sacking, or other covering in which any such grapes, grape vine, cutting or other portion of a grape vine may be found, or be reasonably suspected to have been.
- 3. This Order may hereafter be rescinded, in part or in the whole, by the Governor in Council.
- 4. The Order now in force under the said Act (No. 931-C.S.O., of the 16th day of August, 1881) is hereby rescinded.
