SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of the Legislative COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on Wednes-DAY, THE SIXTEENTH DAY OF JUNE NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

N pursuance of the authority vested in me by a certain Ordinance, made and passed in the 21st year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 12, and intituled "An Ordinance to extend and enlarge the provisions of an Ordinance passed in the 12th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitutled 'An Ordinance for the regulation of Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction in the Colony of Western Australia, and for other purposes relating thereto," I do hereby notify, declare, and direct that the houses, buildings, erections, and enclosures situate at Fremantle upon the "Fremantle Lot CD," mentioned and described in the Schedule to the Ordinance passed in the 14th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 22, now used and occupied, supported, and maintained at the expense of the Colonial Government for the confinement and reception of prisoners, shall henceforth be a Legal Public Gaol and Prison of and belonging to the said Colony, for the purposes mentioned in the said Ordinance 21st Vict., No. 12.

A BILL to declare the Status of Corporations and Joint Stock Companies in Colonies other than the Colony in which they have been constituted, and for other purposes.

Preamble.

HEREAS doubts have arisen as to the status of Corporations and Joint Stock Companies constituted according to the laws of the several Australasian Colonies in other Colonies than the Colony in which they are respectively constituted, and it is expedient to remove such doubts, and to declare and define the status and the rights, powers, capacities, and privileges of such Corporations and Joint Stock Companies: Be it therefore enacted and declared by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Federal Council of Australasia, assembled at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. THIS Act may be cited as "The Australasian Corporations Act, 1886."

Interpretation.

- 2. IN this Act-
 - "Colony of Incorporation" means the Colony under the laws of which the Corporation in question is constituted:
 - "Colony of Registration" means the Colony in which the Corporation in question is registered under the provisions of this Act:
 - "Corporation" includes any joint stock company or other company or society which under the laws of the Colony of Incorporation has perpetual succession and a common seal:
 - "Supreme Court" means the Court having unlimited civil jurisdiction in the Colony in question.

Registration of Corporations.

- 3. ANY Corporation duly constituted under the laws of any Colony in which this Act is in force may procure itself to be registered in any other Colony in which this Act is in force, in the manner hereinafter prescribed.
- 4. A CORPORATION desiring to be so registered shall cause certificate of incorporation and other documents to be de- of the Colony in which it desires to be registered, or if there is no

such officer then in the office of the Supreme Court of that Colony, a certificate of incorporation under the hand of the Registrar of Registrar of Joint Joint Stock Companies or other proper officer of the Colony of Stock Companies. Incorporation, and under the seal of his office, together with a copy, certified by such registrar or other officer, of the memorandum and articles of association, deed of settlement, Act, Ordinance, or other instrument declaring the constitution and functions of the Corporation.

THE Governor of any Colony in which this Act is in force, with the advice of his Executive Council, may prescribe what fees Fee on registration. shall be payable upon the registration of a Corporation in such Colony under this Act, but such fees shall not exceed the fees payable upon the registration of a Corporation of like constitution under the laws of that Colony.

6. UPON the lodging of such certificate and other document Certificate of registor documents as hereinbefore prescribed, and upon payment of the tration to be issued. prescribed fee, the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies, or Registrar of the Supreme Court, or other proper officer with whom they are so lodged, shall issue a Certificate under his hand and the seal of his office in the form following or to the like effect:—

UPON such registration and publication being made, the Effect of registration 8. UPON such registration and publication of Corporation named in the Certificate shall, within the Colony of and publication of certificate. Registration, have and be entitled to the same rights, powers, capacities, and privileges, and be subject to the same obligations, liabilities, and disabilities, as if it had been incorporated under the laws of the Colony of Registration. Provided that no such Corporation shall be entitled to take, hold, convey, or transfer land in the Colony of Registration, if by the laws of the Colony of Incorporation it is not entitled so to do in that Colony, or to any greater extent than it is entitled so to do in that Colony, or except under and subject to such conditions (if any) as are imposed by the laws of the Colony of Incorporation and by the constitution of the Corporation.

WITHIN any Colony in which this Act is in force, a Cor- Disabilities of Corporation constituted under the laws of another Australasian Colony, porations not registered. whether this Act is in force therein or not, is not competent to take, hold, convey, or transfer land, unless such Corporation has been registered in the first-mentioned Colony in accordance with the provisions of this Act, or unless some Act or Ordinance has been passed by the Legislature of that Colony empowering such Corporation to take, hold, convey, or transfer land in that Colony.

Proof of Registra-

10. PRODUCTION of the Government Gazette or other official Gazette of the Government of the Colony of Registration, purporting to contain a copy of a Certificate issued under the provisions of this Act, shall be prima facie evidence for the purpose of proceedings in any Court of Justice, or for any other purpose, of the due registration in that Colony of the Corporation mentioned in such Certificate.

Power to liquidators to deal with land in Colony of Registration.

11. IN the event of the winding-up of a Corporation registered in any Colony under the provisions of this Act, the liquidators or other persons duly appointed according to the laws of the Colony of Incorporation to wind up its affairs and distribute its assets shall have full power and authority to convey, transfer, or otherwise deal with any land held by such Corporation in the Colony of Registration.

Proof of appointment of liquidators.

12. A CERTIFICATE purporting to be signed by the Registrar of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Incorporation, and to be under the seal of his office, stating the fact of the appointment of any such liquidators or other persons, shall be *primâ facie* evidence of their due appointment.

Commencement.

13. THIS Act shall commence and take effect on the first day of , one thousand eight hundred and eighty- .

A BILL to alter the law relating to the procedure under "The Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1884," and "An Act to regulate grants of Patents for Inventions in the Colony of Western Australia."

E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Patent Office.

1. THERE shall be provided for the purposes of "The Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1884," and the Act intituled "An Act to regulate grants of Patents for Inventions in the Colony of Western Australia," an Office with all requisite conveniences, which shall be called the Patent Office.

Registrar.

- 2. THE Patent Office shall be under the immediate control of an Officer called the Registrar of Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks.
- 3. ANY act or thing directed to be done by or to the Registrar may in his absence be done by or to any officer for the time being in that behalf authorised by the Governor.

THERE shall be a Seal for the Patent Office, and impres- Patent Office Seal. sions thereof shall be judicially noticed and admitted in evidence.

5. ALL the powers, duties, privileges, and rights conferred upon or to be done or exercised by the Colonial Secretary, and all acts or Colonial Secretary things directed to be done by or to the Colonial Secretary under the transferred. provisions of either of the Acts aforesaid, or any general rules made under the provisions of "The Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1884," shall be conferred upon and done or exercised by or to the Registrar of Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks; and all applications, notices, Patent Office for documents, matters, and things required by either of the Acts or Office of Colonial rules aforesaid to be furnished, given, or sent to or left or deposited at the office of the Colonial Secretary, shall be furnished, given, or sent to or left or deposited at the Patent Office.

Substitution of

THE words "Colonial Secretary" and "Colonial Secretary's Office," wherever they may occur in either of the aforesaid Acts, or Reading of words in 36 V. 1 and 48 V. 7. in any general rules made under the provisions of "The Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1884," shall be respectively read "Registrar of Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks" and "Patent Office."

7. ALL instruments, records, certified copies, matters, documents, and things required under the provisions of either of the Acts to be used. aforesaid or of any general rules as aforesaid shall be sealed with the seal of the Patent Office and not with the Public Seal of the Colony, except in the case of Letters Patent and Letters of Registration of a Patent which shall be sealed in each case with both seals.

THIS Act shall be read and construed together with "The To be read with 48 v. 7 as one Act. Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1884," as one Act.

9. THIS Act shall be read and construed together with an Act intituled "An Act to regulate grants of Patents for Inventions V. 1 as one Act. in the Colony of Western Australia," as one Act.

A BILL to impose a Duty upon the Importation of Opium.

E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. ON and after the passing of this Act, there shall be charged, Duty on Opium. raised, collected, levied, and paid upon opium, and all goods, wares, and merchandise mixed or saturated with opium or with any preparation or solution thereof, or steeped therein respectively, imported into Western Australia, whether by land or by sea, in lieu of any duty now imposed thereon, a specific duty of Twenty shillings per 16.

THE said duty shall be collected and levied in the manner Collection of duty. provided by and subject and according to the provisions of any Ordinance, Act, or law for the time being in force for the general regulation of the Customs of the Colony.

THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Opium Short Title. Duty Act, 1886."

Periodical Ticket holders, when travelling by Train, will be required to produce their Tickets when called upon to do so by any of the Officers or Servants of the Commissioner of Railways. A Passenger holding a Periodical Ticket neglecting or refusing to produce or deliver it up for inspection, when so required, must pay the regular fare.

A Periodical Ticket is not transferable; and if any such Ticket be found in the possession of any person to whom it was not issued, who shall attempt to travel therewith, it shall be retained, and absolutely forfeited, unless it shall appear that the proper holder thereof had not connived at such improper use.

Commissioner of Railways' Office, Perth, 10th May, 1886.

In addition to the usual charge, a deposit of 10s. will be required on all Periodical Tickets, which will be returned on delivering up the said Ticket; but if not so delivered up within 24 hours after the expiration of the time for which the Ticket was issued, the said deposit shall be absolutely forfeited.

A new Periodical Ticket in lieu of one lost will only be issued on payment of ten per cent. on the original cost of such lost ticket (See By-Laws 13 and 14).

Note.—All Periodical Tickets are issued subject to any alteration which may be made in the Trains during their currency, and no allowance or compensation will be made to the holders on account of any alteration in the time, or reduction in number of Trains. No allowance or extension of time will be made on the ground of the holder of a Periodical Ticket having through sickness or disaster, or any other cause whatever, failed to use the ticket during the period or any part of the period for which it was issued.

Children.

Children under three years of age, Free; above three and under twelve years, Half-fare.

Return Tickets.

Return tickets will be available only on the day of issue, or from Saturday to Monday, with the exception of Tickets issued to or from places beyond Guildford, which will be available for three days, inclusive of day of issue.

Special Trains. Excursions, Picnics.

Rates for Special Trains can be obtained from the Traffic Manager, Perth, to whom persons wishing to engage Special or Excursion Trains must give at least three days Notice in writing; and it is to be distinctly understood that the Commissioner of Railways does not bind himself to let Special or Excursion Trains on Public Holidays. A concession of single fare for the double journey will be made to bond fide Excursion or Picnic parties of not less than 20, on special application to the Traffic Manager.

Passengers' Luggage.

First Class Passengers are allowed, of ordinary luggage, 84lbs.; Second Class, 56lbs. Any excess and articles of merchandise will be charged for at Parcels Rates. Passengers are strongly recommended to have their names and the Station to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and to satisfy themselves that it is placed in the Train. The Commissioner of Railways will not be responsible for any luggage unless it is specially booked and paid for, and the owner's name and its destination distinctly marked thereon (See By-Law 15).

Passengers desiring to travel in the Brake Van with Goods Trains will be allowed to do so when convenient, at their own risk, on payment of Second Class fare.

Smoking.

Smoking will only be permitted in the compartment of a Carriage set apart for that purpose (See By-Law 26).

Gratuities.

Servants of the Commissioner of Railways are prohibited from receiving any gratuity from the public, on pain of dismissal.

Irregularities.

It is requested that any irregularity may be immediately reported to the Traffic Manager, Perth.

Former Time Tables cancelled.
