A BILL to increase the number of Members to serve in the Legislative Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient to increase the number of Members to serve in the Legislative Council: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THE whole of the second section and so much of the third and fourth sections and of Schedule B of "The Legislative Council Act Amendment Act, 1882," as is inconsistent with this Act and the Schedules hereto are hereby repealed.

2. FROM and after the coming into operation of this Act the Legislative Council shall consist of twenty-six members, nine of whom (being one-third of the next greater number which is divisible by three) shall be appointed by Her Majesty according to the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament in that behalf in part recited in the Ordinance passed in the 33rd year of Her present Majesty, Number 13, and seventeen of whom shall from time to time be elected as by law is provided.

3. THE "Northern District," as defined by "The Legislative Council Act Amendment Act, 1882," shall be divided into two electoral districts. The one shall consist of such portions of the said "Northern District" as are contained within the boundaries as laid down in the Schedule annexed hereto, marked "A:" such district shall be called the "Kimberley District," and shall return one member. The other district shall consist of such portions of the said "Northern District" as are contained within the boundaries as laid down in the Schedule annexed hereto, marked "B:" such district shall be called the "Northern District," and shall return two members.

4. THE two members at present sitting in the Legislative Council for the "Northern District," as defined by "The Legislative Council Act Amendment Act, 1882," shall, from and after the coming into operation of this Act, and during the continuance of the present Council, be deemed and taken to sit for the "Northern District" only as defined by this Act.

5. THIS Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Legislative Council Act Amendment Act, 1886."

KIMBERLEY DISTRICT.**

So much of the Colony as lies to the North of the parallel of (19° 30') nineteen degrees thirty minutes South Latitude.

**Schedule B.
NORTHERN DISTRICT.**

Bounded on the North by the Kimberley District; on the West by the Sea Coast, including the Islands adjacent to it; on the South by the Gascoyne District, and on the East by the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the following Report by Staff-Surveyor H. F. Johnston on the examination of the Timber Country in the neighborhood of Nornalup Inlet (Deep River), on the South Coast of the Colony.

From Staff Surveyor H. F. Johnston to the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. In accordance with instructions, I proceeded in April to the Vasse, where I was joined by the police party that was to accompany me to Nornalup Inlet.
2. From the Vasse I went out by the Warren, with the intention of striking south from the latter place to the coast, and then to follow the coast easterly to Nornalup; but from what I learnt from Mr. Brockman of the nature of the coast country I concluded that the one pack-horse that I had would be unable to carry sufficient rations for the trip, so determined to go to Lake Muir and then make south from there to the coast, which would considerably lessen the distance over which it would be necessary to carry rations.
3. From Lake Muir (Mr. Andrew Muir's homestead) I followed a track that is used in taking cattle to and from the coast near Brookes Inlet, and which keeps in a general southerly direction.
4. From Lake Muir to the crossing of the Lake River the country is principally composed of low hills and flats of granite formation covered with red gum, jarrah, blackboy and scrub, and is as a whole fair pastoral country, with patches of country that would be suitable for agricultural purposes, but the clearing would be very heavy.
5. From the Lake River crossing to the crossing of a river (no name) over which a bridge was in course of construction, the country is much more hilly. The hills generally have ironstone gravel on their northern slopes covered with jarrah and a few blackboys, while their summits, southern slopes, and gullies at base are covered with splendid karri timber and a dense undergrowth of scrub, as is usual in karri country. In the numerous running gullies in this section, gneiss or granite was almost invariably exposed.
6. From (Bridge) river to the belt of karri near the coast hills, the country is very inferior, as it consists of low plains covered with dense scrub and scattered blackboys, and low ironstone and sandy hills which are also covered with thick scrub and stunted jarrah.
7. A large belt of karri country extends from near the east end of Brookes Inlet to the shores of Nornalup Inlet. The Deep River comes through this belt of karri, and then runs for some miles easterly along the foot of the karri hills till it enters Nornalup Inlet. For many miles the banks of the Deep River are covered with karri down to the water's edge, and the shores of Nornalup Inlet north and easterly from the mouth of the said river are covered with dense karri forests.
8. I was unable to ascertain the depth of the Deep River, but from the appearance of the water from the banks I should say that it has a depth of about 8 feet, save at its mouth, where the water is shallower, but even there I estimate the depth at 5 feet. The average width of the Deep River where seen by me is about 50 yards.
9. The shores of that part of the Inlet that I was over are covered with dense thickets of various trees and scrub, making it impossible to get horses through till roads are cut. I found the easiest plan was to leave the horses, and travel on foot in the shallow water near the shore.
10. The karri trees about Nornalup Inlet do not attain the huge size that they do farther from the coast, but are still fine trees and quite large enough for timber cutting purposes. The trees grow much more closely together here than is the case in karri forests farther inland. From a timber cutter's point of view I imagine the smaller size of the trees would be a distinct advantage, as the logs would be much easier to handle.
11. There is no doubt that on the shores of the Deep River and Nornalup Inlet there is an enormous amount of karri timber that could be cut near to the water's edge, and easily boated down the Inlet.

12. I saw very little jarrah near Nornalup, and that seen was too small to be worth cutting for timber.
13. The mouth of Nornalup Inlet has a width of deep water in its narrowest part of about thirty yards. The south side of this channel is rock-bound for some distance. On the two days that I saw this channel there was a strong current running, and heavy swirl amongst the rocks and boulders. The day previous to my visit there had been a strong southerly blow which caused a high sea outside, so probably I saw the entrance under unfavorable circumstances. During fine weather I see no reason why small craft should not enter the Inlet.
14. A short distance inwards from the entrance of the Inlet, a bar extends diagonally across the channel (*see tracing*), having a depth of water of, I should say, five feet. I was told that a boat from Albany had been here and the depth of water obtained on this bar was eight feet at high tide. Of course the depths I give are mere approximations, being only judged from the appearance of the water.
15. The question of an anchorage off the mouth of the Inlet appears to me to be of importance, but of this I can say little.
16. If the entrance to the Inlet should prove to be unsuitable for even small craft, and a suitable anchorage is found near Saddle and Goose Islands, a road could be easily made from B to C (*see trace*) across a stretch of nearly level sandy country having sand hills on the east and a granite hill on the west. At B there is a nice stretch of sandy beach; the water appears shallow for some distance out, causing a long break which would necessitate the construction of a jetty of considerable length.
17. During the summer months strong south-easterly winds are prevalent on this coast. A glance at the tracing will show that Saddle and Goose Islands would protect the spot marked A from these winds, if this spot is in other respects suitable for an anchorage.
18. I saw but little land near Nornalup that is suitable for agricultural purposes, and what there is, is so densely covered with scrub and timber that the cost of clearing would be so excessive that there is little hope of this country being utilised for many years to come, except for its timber, and for pastoral purposes on the fringe of coast hills.
19. The entrance to the Inlet was teeming with fish, and I found a small bed of fine oysters, of good flavor, in the channel.
20. I much regret that I was unable to give the shores of the Inlet a more extended examination, but it was impossible to do more with only one pack-horse to carry rations.
21. To give the Inlet a thorough examination on horseback, it would take at least three weeks, probably longer, on account of the numerous streams and gullies, which are difficult to cross, and the dense thickets through which tracks would have to be cut to enable horses to get through.
22. Should a further examination be deemed advisable, I should strongly advise the use of a boat instead of horses.
23. I beg to recommend that the area of Reserve 999 be extended, as shown on tracing. The present Reserve includes but a small portion of the banks of the Deep River, and I think that the south bank of this river, for a few miles from its mouth, should be reserved, as there are some banksia and jarrah hills here that, in the course of time, may be required for settlement.
24. As evidence of the durability of karri timber, I saw the walls of an old hut and dairy that are said to have been erected for about sixteen years. The walls of these buildings are of karri slabs sunk in the ground, several of which I pulled up and found them still perfectly sound, and their butts, which were underground, still bore the marks of the saw with which they had been cut.
25. I attach rough plans of track from Lake Muir to Nornalup.
