PROCLAMATION

Mestern Australia, ? to wit.

(L.S.) L. S. J F. NAPIER BROOME, Governor.

By His Excellency Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS I have been satisfied that there exists amongst the cattle from the Straits Settlements and the Dutch Islands a contagious and infectious disease known as "Foot and Mouth Disease"; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested, and in particular by "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," do by this Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, prohibit the Importation into and landing of Cattle in Western Australia from the said Straits Settlements and the Dutch Islands, and from all adjoining countries and places, until further order or direction in that behalf.

Given under my hand and under the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, Perth, this thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Rules for Examination for Masters' Certificates under "The Colonial Passengers' Ordinance, 1861" (25 Victoria, No. 9), and Amending Acts.

F. NAPIER BROOME, Governor.

HEREAS by "The Colonial Passengers' Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that every Colonial ship or vessel shall be commanded by a competent Master for her intended coasting voyage. AND WHEREAS by "The Colonial Passengers' Amendment Ordinance, 1868," the Governor is empowered from time to time to cause examinations to be held of persons who may be desirous of obtaining Certificates of Competency as Masters, and to lay down rules as to the qualifications of such persons, and generally to do all such acts as he thinks expedient in order to carry into effect such examinations : Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by virtue of the powers vested in me as aforesaid make and lay down the following Rules.

1.-Candidates must be twenty years of age and bring proof of their having served at least four years at sea, and also produce certificates satisfactory to the examiner, of sobriety, ability, and general good conduct.

2.—A candidate for a Certificate of Competency for small vessels above 15 tons, employed only on the coast trade, must satisfy the examiners that he understands the working of the class of vessels of which he has had or wishes to have charge.

3.-He must understand the rule of the road and be able to describe and show that he understands the Admiralty regulations as to lights.

4.--He must be acquainted with the lights on the coast and be able to take bearings by compass.

5.-He must know the marks on the lead lines and be able to work and heave the log.

6.—He must be able to take a meridian altitude.

7.--- A Certificate of Competency issued in respect of the foregoing qualifications only may be granted for vessels of 80 tons register and under, and be available only for voyages between Cape Naturaliste and the North-West Cape or between Albany and Eucla, or between any intermediate ports between Cape Naturaliste and the North-West Cape, or Albany and Eucla.
