No. 4.—"An Act to make provision for the enforcement within the Federation of Judgments of the Supreme Courts of the Colonies of the Federation."

Forwarding a Petition praying for a reduction of the Duty on Colonial Wines.

No. 63. Government Cottage, Rottnest Island, MY LORD, 15th March, 1886.

I have the honor to transmit, herewith, copy of a memorial which I have received from gentlemen interested in the cultivation of the vine in this Colony, praying for the reduction of the Imperial duty on Colonial Wines to one shilling per gallon.

2. There is no country in the world more suited to the Vine than Western Australia, and if a profitable market for our wine could be opened in the United Kingdom an immediate impetus would be given to the industry in this Colony, which will one day, I have no doubt, be a very large wine producing country. large wine-producing country.

3. I understand that the Agents General of the other Australian Colonies have been urging this question in London. To their voice in the matter should be added that of Western Australia, and I trust that it may be possible be-fore long to make some arrangement which will admit Colonial Wines to the Mother Country on more favorable terms than prevail at present, and that Your Lordship may see fit to support the prayer of the memorial now transmitted.

To His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

Knowing the deep interest taken by Your Excellency in everything affecting the progress and welfare of this Colony, we the undersigned, who are interested in the culture of the Vine, venture to ask Your Excellency's assistance in drawing the attention of the Right Honorable W. Ewart Gladstone, First Lord of the Treasury, and of the Right Honorable W. Vernon Harcourt, Chancellor of the Exchequer, to the fact that the present rate of duty on Wines in England has a most prejudicial and deterrent effect upon the production of Wine in Western Australia, and that Your Memorialists feel confident that the reduction of the English duty for such Wines as this Colony can produce to one shilling per gallon, will have a most imtion of the English duty for such Wines as this Colony can produce to one shilling per gallon, will have a most important bearing in bringing into immediate cultivation much of the large area of land in this Colony, which is especially adapted for the growth of the Vine.

That the area under Vine cultivation, as shown in the last Blue Book, was 725½ acres, and that since the last returns were made more than 100 additional acres have been planted; the whole of this area. as Your Excellency

been planted; the whole of this area, as Your Excellency is aware, being required chiefly for the supply of the Local Market.

That having regard to the very large area of land available for the growth of the fine class of Wines produced in this Colony, and the increased facilities for transport to be afforded by the extensive system of Railways now in course of construction, and which will traverse the Wine-growing Districts, Your Memorialists consider that the effect of such a reduction in the present rate of duty on Wines in England cannot fail to ensure for our Colonial Wines an almost unlimited sale in the London Market.

That the Wine industry in this Colony would then quickly become an important element in its prosperity and onward progress, and at the same time add very materially to the revenue of the Mother Country.

# NOTICE TO MARINERS.

AUSTRALIA—NORTH-WEST COAST-KING SOUND.

[All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation 1° E. in 1886.]

SUNDAY STRAIT.—The steamship "Menmuir," while passing through Sunday Strait, with the tide at half-ebb, and drawing  $19\frac{1}{2}$  feet, reports that she "touched something supposed to be a sunken rock," in a position nearly in mid-channel between Tree and East Roe Islands. Until the existence of this supposed danger has been confirmed, vessels are recommended to use the channel between Roe and

Sunday Islands (Meda Pass) in preference to Sunday In Meda Pass the flood stream sets directly towards Sunday Island, and the ebb stream towards Roe Islands.

Entering King Sound by Sunday Strait, vessels are recommended to keep the summit of Caffarelli Island open westward of the Tiderip Group, N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.; proceeding out of King Sound, that mark should be steered for until the summit of High Island bears

Pincombe Shoal, with 2 fathoms and less water over it, is the northern extreme of the bank joining the Roe Islands. From the outer edge of this danger the west extreme of East Roe Island bears South, distant about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile. There are depths of 12 and 20 fathoms close northward of Pincombe Shoal.

Clearing Mark.—North Twin Islet well open northward of the South Twin, W. by N.  $\frac{a}{4}$  N., leads northward of Pincombe Shoal.

Swan Shoal, upon which the sea breaks at low water springs, is reported to lie about midway between the Alarm Reefs and the shore, with the following bearings and distances (approximate):— Swan Point Islet E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., distant  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles, and Cape Lévêque Islet S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

Strangers are recommended not to pass between

the Alarm Reefs and the shore.

South Meda Shoal is reported to dry 4 feet at low water springs.

BUOYS.—Three buoys have been laid down in the approach to Derby.

Torment Spit Buoy, painted black, is moored in 4 fathoms, off the North-West extreme of Torment Spit, with the following bearings:-Point Torment S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E., and Saddle Hill N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E.

Fairway Buoy, chequered red and white, is moored in 4 fathoms, in the fairway between Torment Spit and North Mary Isle, with the following bearings:—North extreme of North Mary Isle S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and hill North of Deep Creek E. by S.

Anchorage Buoy, painted white, is moored in 4 fathoms off the North end of North Mary Isle, with the following bearings:—North extreme of North Mary Isle W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., and Double Nob Hillock S.S.E. 3 E.

The anchorage ground lies eastward of this buoy. (See Australia Directory, Volume III., Supplement,

1885, page 7).

LACEPEDE ISLANDS.—Several vessels having taken the ground in the neighborhood of Cape Baskerville, when passing between the Lacepede Islands and the mainland, and as the tides in that locality are strong and irregular (the flood stream setting directly towards the shore), this passage should only be taken by coasting vessels with local knowledge.
