WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of any Magisterial District; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare that the districts named the "West Kimberley Magisterial District" and the "East Kimberley Magisterial District," respectively, shall hereafter embrace so much of the Colony as is comprised within the following boundaries:—

The "West Kimberley Magisterial District."—Bounded on the *North* by the 16th parallel of South Latitude; on the *East* by the 126th meridian of East Longitude; on the *South* by the parallel of 19° 30' South Latitude; and on the *Westward* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

The "East Kimberley Magisterial District."—All that portion of the Colony *North* of the 16th parallel of South Latitude.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered by proclamation to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name the same and define the boundaries thereof; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare that portion of the Colony within the following limits to be a Magisterial District, under the name of the "Kimberley Goldfield Magisterial District:—

Bounded on the *North* by the 16th parallel of South Latitude; on the *East* by the Eastern boundary of the Colony (Longitude 129° East); on the *South* by the parallel of 19° 30' South Latitude; and on the *West* by the 126th meridian of East Longitude.

Gazette Notice No. 2479 C.S.O., of 8th March, 1886, is hereby cancelled.
