(L. S.) F. NAPIER BROOME, *Governor.* By His Excellency Sir FREDERICK NAFIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886" (50 Vic., No. 17), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name the same and define the boundaries thereof, and also to cancel the Proclamation of a Magisterial District; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that all Proclamations heretofore made, declaring or appointing Magisterial Districts, shall be and the same are hereby cancelled; and I do hereby further declare and proclaim that in lieu thereof all those portions of the Colony hereinafter mentioned and described shall be respectively Magisterial Districts, under the names hereinafter respectively mentioned :—

East Kimberley Magisterial District.

All that portion of the Colony North of the 16th parallel of South Latitude.

West Kimberley Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by the 16th parallel of South Latitude; on the East by the 126th meridian of East Longtitude; on the South by the parallel of 19° 30' South Latitude; and on the Westward by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

Kimberley Goldfield Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by the 16th parallel of South Latitude; on the East by the eastern boundary of the Colony (Longitude 129° East); on the South by the parallel of 19° 30' South Latitude; and on the West by the 126th meridian of East Longitude.

North-West Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by the parallel of 19° 30' South Latitude; on the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the South by an East line from the

sea coast, passing through a spot 30 miles South of Mt. Alexander on the Ashburton River; and on the *East* by the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

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Gascoyne Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a true East line from the sea coast, passing through a spot 30 miles South of Mt. Alexander on the Ashburton River; on the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the South by a true East line from the sea coast, passing through the summit of Mt. Murchison; and on the East by the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

Victoria Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a true East line from the sea coast, passing through the summit of Mt. Murchison; on the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the South by a true East line from the sea coast, passing through the summit of Mt. Lesuer to a spot due North from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, thence due South to said summit, and from thence by a due East line; and on the East by the Eastern boundary of the Colony.

Toodyay Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a line starting from the sea coast and extending due East, passing through the summit of Mt. Lesuer to a spot due North from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, thence due South to the said summit, and from thence by a due East line to longitude 119° E.; on the West by the sea coast including the islands adjacent; on the South and South-west by lines extending East from the coast aforesaid to a spot on the North branch of the Moore River where the South boundary of Melbourne location 93, at Gillingarra, crosses it, thence downwards along the said North branch to the junction of the North and East branches of the Moore River, thence in a South-south-easterly direction to the 60th mile mark on the road from Perth to New Norcia, thence to the South-west corner of Swan location 95 at Bailup, thence by a South-easterly line to a spot on the Eastern Railway, due North from the Northeast by the railway aforesaid in an East-north-easterly direction till it intersects the western boundary of Avon Location e 1, thence by that location's western and southern boundaries, and crossing the Avon River by its right bank downwards to the South-casterly direction along the western boundary of Avon Location P, then East-north-easterly along its southern boundary; then in a South-south-easterly direction along the western boundary of Avon Location 62, and Eastnorth-easterly along the southern boundaries of Avon Location 61, and South-south-easterly to its Southern boundary; then in a South-south-easterly direction along the western boundary of Avon Location 62, and Eastnorth-easterly along the southern boundaries of Avon Location N1, and South-south-easterly to its Southern boundary its head for the western boundary of Avon Location N1, and South-south-easterly along its southern boundary and by a line in about the same direction, till it meets a due East line from the summit of the highest peak in Wongan Hills, at longitude 119° East aforesaid.

Swan Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North and East by a line extending East from the sea coast to a spot on the North branch of the Moore River, where the South boundary of Melbourne location 93, at dillingarra, crosses it, thence downwards along the said North branch to the junction of the North and East branches of the Moore River, thence in a Southsouth-easterly direction to the 60th mile mark on the road from Perth to New Norcia, thence to the South-west corner of Swan location 95 at Bailup, thence by a South-easterly line to a spot on the Eastern Railway due North from the North-east corner of Helena location 22, thence by a South line to the South-east corner of said location, thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mt. Dale; thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mt. Dale; on the <u>South</u> by an East line from the sea coast passing along the North boundary of Perthshire location 111 at Nowergup Lake to a spot due North of the North-east corner of Perthshire location 104 at Gnangarra Lake, thence due South to said location's South-east corner, thence by a straight line to the South-east corner of Swan location X on the Swan River, thence South-east erly along the North-east boundary of Swan location 34 to its contemport corner, and theorem by a South eastedly its easternmost corner, and thence by a South-easterly line to Mt. Dale aforesaid; and on the West by the sea coast including the islands adjacent.

Perth Magisterial District.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast including the islands adjacent; on the North and East by lines extending East from the sea coast, passing along the North boundary of Perthshire Location 111, at Nowergup Lake, to a spot due North of the North-east corner of Perthshire Location 104 at Gnangarra Lake, thence due South to said location's South-east corner thence by a South to said location's South-east corner, thence by a straight line to the South-east corner of Swan Location X on the Swan River, thence South-easterly along the North-east boundary of Swan Location 34 to its easternmost corner, and thence by a South-easterly line to Mt. Dale; on the *South* by the North and East boundaries of North Fremantle Townsite, thence by the Southern shores of the Swan Estuary and of the Canning River and Della Gueb to the North and the Canning River and shores of the Swan Estuary and of the Canning Eiver and Bull's Creek to the North-west corner of Canning Location 26, thence by the West and South boundaries of said location 26 to its South-east corner, thence by a South-easterly line to that spot on the Perth-Albany Road situate due East from the South boundary of Rockingham Townsite, and thence North-easterly to Mt. Dale aforesaid.

Fremantle Magisterial District.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast; on the South by an East line along the South boundary of Rockingham town-East line along the South boundary of Rockingham town-site to the Perth-Albany Road; on the East by a North-westerly line to the South-east corner of Canning Location 26; thence by that location's South and West boundaries to Bull's Creek; on the North by Bull's Creek, the Canning River, and Swan Estuary to the sea, including North Fre-mantle townsite, Rottnest, Carnac, Garden Island and other islands adjacent.

York Magisterial District.

Bounded on the Westward by a due South line from a spot on the Eastern Railway passing along the Eastern boundary of Helena location 22 to its South-east corner, thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mount Dale, thence South-easterly to a spot 20 miles East of the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany road, then in about the same direction to the Hotham River at Reserve 225A at Cojatotine Pool; on the North-West by the Railway aforesaid in an East-north-easterly direction till it intersects the Western boundary of Avon location e1, thence by that location's Western and Southern boundaries, and crossing the Avon River by its right bank downwards to the South corner of Avon location P, then East-north-easterly along its Southern boundary, then in a South-south-easterly along its Southern boundary, then in a South-south-easterly direc-tion along the Western boundary of Avon location 62, and East-north-easterly along the Southern boundaries of Avon locations 62, 1066, 0, and 61 to the Western boundary of Avon location N1, and South-south-easterly to its South corner, thence East-north-easterly along its Southern boundary and by a line in about the same direction till it meets a due East line from the summit of the highest peak in the Wongan Hills, at longitude 119° East, and thence due East to longitude 124° E.; on the Southward from the South end of the Western boundary extending in a North-easterly direction along the Hotham River upwards to Millingnalling Pool, from thence by an East line to Mt. Glasse'in the Bremer Range, and from thence by an East-north-easterly line till it meets the Dart such of the North hermdory at length and of the East end of the North boundary, at longitude 124° East aforesaid.

Williams Magisterial District.

Bounded on the North by a due East line of 20 miles from the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence South-easterly to the Hotham River, at Reserve 225A, at Cojatotine Pool, thence by the river aforesaid upwards to Millingnalling Pool, and from thence by an East line to the summit of Mt. Glasse in the Bremer Range; on the West by a line extending in a southerly direction from the by a line extending in a southerly direction from the aforesaid 41-mile mark to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers, thence South-south-easterly to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarup Rivers, then by a line extending in a South-easterly direction to a spot 16 miles West from the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road; and on the Southward by an East line passing through the 175-mile mark aforesaid, to the junction of the Jackitup Creek with the Pallinup River, and thence by a line extending in an East-north-easterly direction to Mt. Glasse in the Bremer Range aforesaid.

Murray Magisterial District.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the North by an East line passing along the South boundary of Rockingham Townsite to the Perth-Albany Road and by a North-easterly line thence to Mount Dale; on the Eastward by a South-easterly line from Mt. Dale to a spot 20 miles due East from the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road aforesaid, thence West to the said mile mark, and from thence by a line extending in a southerly direction to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers; and on the South by an East line from the sea coast passing through the summit of Mount William to the Murray River, and by that river upwards, including the locations and leases on both banks, to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers aforesaid.

Wellington Magisterial District.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast; on the North by an East line from the said coast passing through the summit of Mount William to the Murray River, then by that river upwards, excluding the locations and leases on both banks, to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers; on the *Eastward* by a South-south-easterly line from the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarup Rivers ; and on the Southward by a true East line from the sea coast to on the Southward by a true East line from the sea coast to the Capel River, passing along the South boundary of Sussex Location 82, then by the said river upwards to location 171 inclusive, then eastward from the South-west corner of Wellington Location 171 to a point due South from the South-east corner of Wellington Location 40, thence North passing along the eastern boundary of location 40 aforesaid to "Gregory's marked line" of road from Bunbury to Kojonup, known as the "old post road." from Bunbury to Kojonup, known as the "old post road," and thence by the said road to the junction of the Balgarup and Blackwood Rivers aforesaid.

Sussex Magisterial District.

Bounded on the Northward by the shore of Geographe Bay, and by an East line from the shore of the said bay to the Capel River, passing along the South boundary of Sussex Location 82, then by the river aforesaid upwards to Wellington location 171, excluding such location; on the Eastward by a South-easterly line from the South-west corner of Wellington location 171 aforesaid, to the junction of Padbury Brook with the Blackwood River, from thence to the South-west corner of Nelson Location 31, at Manjimup, thence in a southerly direction to a spot known as Bullamurrup, thence by the Bullamurrup Creek downwards to its junction with the Warren River, thence by said river upwards to its junction with the Wilgarup River; on the South-east by a North-north-easterly line extending from the extreme end of D'Entrecasteaux Point to the junction of the Wilgarup River with the Warren River aforesaid; and on the Southward and Westward by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

Blackwood Magisterial District.

Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by lines extendlocation 171 to a spot due South from the South-east Location 171 to a spot due South from the South-east corner of Wellington Location 40, thence North passing along the Eastern boundary of said location 40 to Gre-gory's marked line of road from Bunbury to Kojonup, known as the "old post road," and thence by the said road to the junction of the Balgarup and Blackwood Rivers, thence by a straight line from the said junction to a spot 16 miles West of the 175 mile mark on the Perth-Albany road; on the Westward by a South-easterly line from the South-west corner of Wellington Location 171 afor-said to the junction of Padbury's Brook with the Blackwood River, and from thence to the South-west corner of Nelson Location 31 at Manjimup, thence in a Southerly direction

to a spot known as Bullamurrup, thence by the Bullamurto a spot known as Bullamurrup, thence by the Bullamur-rup Creek downwards to its junction with the Warren River; on the *Southward* by said Warren River upwards to its junction with the Wilgarup River, thence by an Easterly line to the South-west corner of Nelson Location 6 at Topanup, thence Easterly by the road to Albany, to Muir's Bridge at the Frankland River, thence in a Northerly direction up the Frankland River to "Upper Yeriminup Pool," thence Northerly to a spot 16 miles West of the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany road aforesaid. aforesaid.

Plantagenet Magisterial District.

Plantagenet Magisterial District. Bounded on the Eastward by the East boundary of the Colony; on the Southward by the sea coast, from the said East boundary to D'Entrecasteaux Point including the islands adjacent; on the Westward and Northward by lines extending North-north-easterly from Point D'Entrecasteaux aforesaid to the junction of the Wil-garup River with the Warren River, thence by an east-crly line to the South-west corner of Nelson Location 6 at Topanup, thence easterly by the road to Albany, to Muir's Bridge at the Frankland River, thence in a Northerly direction up the Frankland River to "Upper Yeriminup Pool," thence Northerly to a point 16 miles West of the 175-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, thence East passing through the said mile mark to the junction of the Jackitup Creek with the Pallinup River, thence East-north-easterly to Longtitude 124° East, at a spod due East from the highest summit of Wongan Hills, and thence due East to the eastern boundary of the Colony.

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following General Regulations to be observed in the construction and working of Private Railways in this Colony.

General Regulations to be observed in the Con-struction and Working of Private Railways in the Colony.

PERMANENT SURVEYS, PLANS, SECTIONS, &C. Working Plans.

1. Copies of working plans and sections on tracing cloth must be deposited in triplicate with the Commissioner of Railways, for his examination and approval, at least one month before the commencement of the work.

The plans should be made in lengths of ten miles, and neatly folded in a special cardboard cover; a specimen of which can be seen at the office of the Commissioner of Railways in Perth.

The plans are to be plotted to a scale of three chains to the inch, and must show all boundaries of properties, roads, buildings, watercourses, &c., within a distance of ten chains on either side of the centre line. The radii of all curves must be given.

$\ Longitudinal \ Section.$

2. The longitudinal section must correspond with the plans, and should in like manner be in lengths of ten miles, neatly folded in a similar cover to the plan.

The section must be plotted to a horizontal scale of three chains to the inch, and to a vertical scale of 30 feet to the inch.

The section must show,---

- a. The reduced level of the datum. For the sake of uniformity throughout the Railways of the Colony, it would be advisable wherever practicable to adopt the same datum as that in use on the Government Eastern Railway, viz., 100 feet below the mean level of the sea at Fremantle.
- b. The reduced level of the surface of the ground at each chain.
- c. The reduced level of the formation at each chain.
- d. The depth of cutting or embankment at each chain.
- e. All bridges, culverts, level crossings, road diversions, and other works must be described in their respective places on the longitudinal section.

Road Crossings and Diversions.

3. Plans to a scale of 40 feet to the inch, and longitudinal section of all road crossings and diversions, must be submitted in triplicate to correspond with each length of section.

Bridges, Culverts, &c.

4. Detailed tracings in triplicate of all works of art such as bridges, viaducts, culverts, &c., included in and to correspond with the lengths of sections must be submitted, for the examination and approval of the Commissioner of Railways, at least one month before the commencement of the work.

N.B.—To avoid work and expense, it would be advisable to submit a complete set of tracings of the standard types of bridges, culverts, &c., proposed to be adopted, which will render it unnecessary each time to send tracings as above; reference being made on the section to the number of the type to be used in each case.

Permanent Way.

5. Tracings in triplicate of the type to a full size of rail, fishplate, bolts, and fastenings proposed to be adopted, together with the specification for the manufacturer, must be approved by the Commissioner of Railways before the line be laid.

Rolling Stock.

6. Tracings in triplicate of the type of engines, tenders, carriages, wagons, and other vehicles to be used on the railway must be submitted to the Commissioner of Railways; and no locomotive, carriage, or vehicle may be used without having been first approved by him.

Station Yards.

7. Plans of all station yards, junctions, &c., to a scale of 40 feet to the inch, must be submitted for the approval of the Commissioner of Railways prior to their execution.

These must be prepared in the same way as the plans and sections on tracing cloth, folded in cover, and in triplicate.

8. The Commissioner of Railways, on approving the plans, sections, &c., will return one to the engineer or accredited agent of the company, duly signed; the second one will be retained in the Public Works' Office; and the third will be handed to the inspecting engineer or agent of the Commissioner of Railways. 9. In all cases before being submitted, the different tracings must be signed by the engineer of the company or by some other duly accredited agent of the company empowered to do so on their behalf.

Construction of the Railway.

Fencing.

10. Fencing of an approved type must be erected in all cases of the railway passing through land held in fee simple. This applies to all lands now so held, or which may become so, during the working of the line, by reason of their sale or transfer, either by the Company, the Government, or present owner.

Level Crossings.

11. Public road level crossings in parts of the line which are fenced must be provided with either gates to close across the line, and gate houses, or with cattle-guards, as on the Government Railways, in which case gatekeepers will not be required.

Platforms of Bridges.

12. All platforms of bridges must be protected from fire.

Mile Posts and Gradient Boards.

13. Mile posts and gradient boards must be placed on the side of the line at a convenient height and distance, to be well seen by the engine driver.

Junctions.

14. Junctions must be protected by home and distant signals, and connected with the stations on either side by telegraph or telephone.

Distant signals must be weighted so as to fly to danger in the event of the wire breaking.

Sidings.

15. All sidings must be supplied with a locked chock block to prevent wagons fouling the main line either by accident, carelessness, or design. All wagons left in a siding should have their brakes pinned down, and their wheels chocked in addition. At sidings where no station master or porter is in charge, the points should be securely padlocked.

Stations.

- 16. *a.* The minimum distance between the lines of Railways must be six (6) feet.
 - b. Facing points on the main line at ends of yards should be provided with self-acting indicators and lamps.
 - c. Platforms at stations must not be of less width than twelve feet, and should be of sufficient length to accommodate all ordinary passenger trains in use on the Railway.
 - d. No fixed column or object must be less than six feet from the edge of platform.
 - e. The ends of platforms must be ramped, and not stepped or ended abruptly.
 - f. All stations must be connected by telegraph or telephone.
 - g. Clocks should be placed at each station so as to be visible from the trains.
 - h. Turntables must be placed at a safe distance from the main line.
 - *i*. No switch handles should be worked between the lines of Railways.

WORKING OF THE RAILWAY.

Passenger Trains to be fitted with automatic continuous brakes.

17. All passenger engines, carriages, and vans must be fitted with a continuous automatic brake of the same system as that in use on the Government Railways, so as to secure uniformity and facilitate the interchange of vehicles.

18. All engines and brake vans must, in addition, be provided with hand-power brakes, in case of failure of or any accident happening to the automatic gear. In like manner, the couplings of the rolling stock should be capable of being easily adapted to those in use on the Government Railways.

Guard's brake at the tail of every passenger train.

19. There should be a guard's brake van with a guard in it at the tail of every train, and it should be the duty of the guard to keep a constant lookout from it along his train.

Communication between guard and driver.

20. There should be a means of communication provided between the guard at the tail of every passenger train and the engine driver.

Engines not to run tender first.

21. Engines with passenger trains should not, as far as it is possible to prevent it, be run tender first.

Second engine on a train.

22. In the event of a second engine being required it must be coupled to the first one, and in no case to the rear of the train.

Locomotives to be fitted with spark arresters.

23. Locomotives must be fitted with an efficient system of spark arrester, not only in the smoke box or chimney, but also in the front and back of the ash pans.

Tyres to be properly secured.

24. The types of all wheels should be so secured to the rims of wheels, as to prevent their flying open if fractured.

It is recommended that types be secured with studs, and in no case with through bolts.

Tyres to be examined en route.

25. Tyres, couplings, axle boxes, &c., should be examined on all trains, at convenient distances, to ascertain that they are in proper order for running.

Records to be kept.

26. Records must be carefully kept of the work performed by the wearing parts of the rolling stock, to afford practical information in regard to them, and to prevent their being retained in use longer than is desirable.

Cattle trucks to be disinfected.

27. All cattle trucks should be disinfected after each journey, and plainly marked with the date when this was last done.

Cattle to be watered.

28. In cases when cattle are more than twelve hours in transit, particularly in the summer months, provision must be made for supplying them with water, either at stations or in the trucks.

Color blindness.

29. All railway servants should be examined carefully for color blindness. No guard, driver, or fireman who is unable clearly to distinguish color should be employed in any of these capacities.

Staff system to be adopted on single lines.

30. For single lines the staff and ticket system for working traffic as in use on the Eastern Railway is recommended for adoption.

Responsibility of the Companies not affected by these Regulations.

31. These regulations, so far as the working is concerned, are not to be considered as affecting or diminishing the responsibility of the Company in the event of accident, loss, or negligence, but with the intent to secure, as far as possible, uniformity of working between the Government Railways and private companies to the advantage of both.

Regulations may be amended.

32. These regulations can, from time to time, be amended or added to at the discretion of the Commissioner of Railways.

Mid Reef is about half-a-mile long in an East and West direction and two cables wide, its eastern portion being nearly awash, with depths of 25 and 26 fathoms, coral, close around. The centre of this danger lies W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., distant about $22\frac{1}{2}$ miles, from Moore Point Lighthouse, with Hummock Island Beacon bearing W.S.W., distant $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles. There are usually heavy breakers over Mid Reef.

King Reef, which seldom breaks, is of small extent, with depths of 26 and 27 fathoms, coral and shells, close around. From its centre Hummock Island Beacon bears N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant $2\frac{6}{10}$ miles. September 20, 1886.
