## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1881," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things, to declare and proclaim any adjoining defined portion of any district not being part of a town to be united with any Municipality; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that portion of the District of Cockburn Sound, adjoining the Municipality of Fremantle, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with and form a portion of the Fremantle Municipality:

Bounded by the present South boundary of Fremantle Townsite and by a North line of 21 chains along its East boundary, thence by lines extending East along the North boundaries of Fremantle Suburban Lots 46, 47, 48 and 49, then South passing along the East boundaries of Fremantle Suburban Lots 49, 50, 57, and 58 to the North boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 10, thence West to its North-west corner and South along its West boundary its North-west corner, and South along its West boundary to the South-east corner of Cockburn Sound Location 222 then West along the South boundaries of Cockburn Sound Locations 222, 70, and 203 to the Sea Coast, and by the Sea Coast Northward to the South boundary of Fremantle Townsite aforesaid.

Proclamation by His Excellency Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Province of South Australia and the Dependencies thereof, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a proclamation dated the 23rd day of December, 1885, duly published in the Government Gazette, I did absolutely prohibit the introduction or importation into South Australia of horned cattle, sheep, and swine shipped in the colony of Western Australia: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do, from the date hereof annul revoke and rescand the aforesaid proclamahereof, annul, revoke, and rescind the aforesaid proclamation of the 23rd day of December, 1885.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 11 of 1886.

NEW LIGHT, BAY ROCK, CLEVELAND BAY.

OTICE is hereby given, that on and after this date, a fixed White and Red Light will be exhibited from Bay Rock. The apparatus is dioptric of the 4th order, and shows all around the horizon, except where intercepted to the W.S.W. through a sector of about 14 degrees.

The Light will be seen as a Red Light from N. by W.3-W. to N.N.W.3-W.—that is, from the Black Buoy marking the 17-feet patch to the Red Cage Buoy—and White through the remaining sectors. While the White Light is in sight to the Eastward of the Red sector, vessels will be clear of "Virago" Rock and the shoal water off Cape Pallarendha.

DRECTIONS.—Vessels of heavy draft entering Cleveland Bay by Magnetic Island Channel during the night, after passing Bay Rock (which is steep to, to within half-a-cable on either side) will keep to the westward of the Red sector until the West point of Magnetic Island bears N.E. \(\frac{1}{4}\)-E. and then haul up and steer S.E. \(\frac{1}{2}\)-E. until through the Red sector, when a course may be steered for the Coal Hulks and the West Channel Leading Lights.

The Tower is 25 feet high, circular, and painted Stone Color; and the Light, which is placed at an elevation of 94 feet, is visible from a distance of 15 miles.

### WESTERN AUSTRALIAN VOLUNTEER FORCE.

### General Order.

ENERAL Order dated 4th July, 1877, is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted:—Officers of the Volunteer Force after three years service (including service in the ranks) may, with the Governor's approval, be placed on the Retired List, at their own request, instead of resigning their Commission, in cases where their occupation takes them to such a distance from the station of their Corps as to prevent them attending to their military duties. They will have the privilege of being allowed to wear their uniform on all public occasions such as Balls, Levées, &c., and will be eligible to be brought back on the Active List of Volunteer Officers and posted either to their own or another Corps as vacancies and circumstances permit, being placed for seniority junior to all others of the same rank in the Corps. They will be liable to be called out for active service should the occasion arise.

- 1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetties, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.
- 2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.
- 3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.
- 4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881.
- 5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.
- 6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by
- 7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to the existing Jetty Regulations.

- 8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.
- 9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the Government Gazette of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetties.
- 10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officers in charge of jetties), the Contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.
- 11. A Bond of £300 for Albany and Geraldton and £100 for all other jetties, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.
- 12. When a Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.
- 13. The Principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tomage.
- 14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the Colony.
- 15. That any tender accepted for the service during 1886 will not commence until these conditions are signed by the tenderer and his sureties.

### 7.-LIGHTERAGE.
