THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

**W**HEREAS by the "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power, when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended, and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the dominions and possessions of the Republic of the Equator.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said "Foreign Deserters Act, 1852," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant

Regulations relating to the Importation of Dogs.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the two following Regulations which have been substituted for Regulations, Nos. 19 and 21, proclaimed on the 8th April, 1884:—

Regulation 19. No dog will be allowed in the Quarantine Ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the Quarantine Ground may be destroyed or subjected to quarantine by an Inspector.

Regulation 21. The Quarantine Ground in the Port of Albany shall be the land already set apart at Albany as a Quarantine Station. The Quarantine Ground for Fremantle shall be the enclosure set apart for that purpose on Rottnest Island.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,—

We, the Mayor and Councillors of the Albany Municipality, on behalf of ourselves and the inhabitants of this town and the District of Plantagenet, beg to accord you a hearty welcome to our Port on this your special visit to perform the initiatory ceremony of the greatest work ever undertaken in Albany. We beg to assure Your Excellency of our loyal attachment to the British Crown and the person of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, and to Your Excellency, Her Majesty's representative. We desire to accord our appreciation of the efforts of Your Excellency to promote the advancement of the Colony since you have held the reins of Government, and especially to congratulate you on the commencement being made, under your administration, of so important an undertaking as the Albany-Beverley Railway, and trust that the connection by rail with the Capital and other towns of the interior will cement the good feeling and unite the interests of the various portions of the Colony. MR. MAYOR AND GENTLEMEN,—

I receive with pleasure an Address expressing, on the part of the people of Albany and of this District, your loyalty to the Sovereign, and your satisfaction at the occasion which has brought me to your town. The railway begun to-day is an undertaking of vital importance, and one which will open the gates of Western Australia to the world. Your magnificent harbour, hitherto little more than a source of pride to the townspeople of Albany, and of convenience to the commerce of our neighbors, will now become a real and active factor in the progress of the Colony to which it belongs, and will acquire an immediate importance to an immense district.
