Minutes of a meeting of the Commission appointed to consider and advise the best method of expending the sum of £5000 voted during the recent Session of the Legislative Council in connection with the celebration of Her Majesty's Jubilee, held in the Legislative Council Chamber, Perth, at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, 21st December, Present: 1886.

His Excellency the Governor having stated the object for which the Commission had met, and the nature of the business to be done, letters were read from the Hon. J. G. Lee-Steere, Mr. T. Burges, M.L.C., and Mr. M. Grant, M.L.C., members of the Commission, who were unable to be present.

After discussion, Mr. S. H. Parker proposed and the Mayor of Perth seconded the following resolution:—

"That the sum of £2000 out of the money "Ynat the sum of £2000 out of the money "voted by the Legislative Council for the cele"bration of Her Majesty's Jubilee be appro"priated as the donation of this Colony towards
"the Imperial and Colonial Institute in London, "in the manner suggested by His Royal High-"ness the Prince of Wales to His Excellency the "Governor."

Resolution put and carried.

The Mayor of Perth proposed and Dr. Scott seconded the following resolution :-

> "That the sum of £3000 be appropriated to-"wards the commencement of a Jubilee Library "in the city of Perth, to be called the Victoria "Jubilee Institute."

Mr. Marmion proposed the following amendment:-

"That, in the opinion of the Commission, the "balance of £3000 now remaining at disposal be "applied as follows, namely, £1000 to lay the foundation of a Public Library, £2000 for pur"poses of local amusements and pleasant cele"bration of the Jubilee at the period."

Amendment put and lost.

Original resolution put and carried.

His Excellency the Governor stated that he proposed to appoint a Committee to carry out the arrangements in connection with the designs and site of the Public Library, and that he would ask the Hon. Director of Public Works to be Chairman and His Worship the Mayor of Perth to be a member of the Committee.

His Excellency the Governor thanked the members of the Commission for their attendance.

Mr. S. H. Parker proposed a vote of thanks to His Excellency the Governor for the manner in which he had presided. The vote of thanks having been unanimously carried, the Commission separated at 1.15 p.m.
