## WESTERN PACIFIC—HIGH COMMISSION.

## CLAIMS TO LAND.

BRITISH Subjects, desiring to register claims to land purchased in the Western Pacific, may forward for registration a statement of such claim to the Secretary to the High Commissioner, Suva, Fiji.

The statement should set forth the name by which the land claimed is known, together with a description of its boundaries; also the name of the group, island, and place therein, in which such land is situated. Whenever possible the statement should be accompanied by a sketch or plan of the land and locality. Such plan should not be larger than 14 x 8 inches.

The Registry will only record the particulars of the claim of the party registering; and such registration will not be regarded as the record of a warranted title, under which Her Majesty's Government guarantee to protect the holder.

A record will be kept of any statement the claimant may desire to make with reference to the title under which he claims.

If desired, copies will be filed in the High Commissioner's Office of all deeds and documents in support of claims to land, on production of the originals, or of copies certified to be correct by one of Her Majesty's Judicial or Deputy Commissioners for the Western Pacific; or by an officer in command of one of Her Majesty's ships; or by any British Consular Officer in the Western Pacific.

Search will be made at the instance of any person requesting it, and copies supplied of all entries in the Register of Claims, as also of the registry of deeds and other documents filed.

SIR,

With reference to your memorandum of the 5th of August, and its annexures, on the subject of the disposal of the exhibits from this Colony at the close of the Colonial and Indian Exhibition, I am to inform you that precise instructions would have been sent to you by this mail had not the matter assumed a new aspect in consequence of the telegram, with which you are no doubt acquainted, received a few days ago by His Excellency the Governor from His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, proposing the establishment of an Imperial Colonial and Indian Institute, as a memorial of Her Majesty's Jubilee.

2. Until this new proposal has been decided upon, which cannot be for some weeks, it is impossible to give final instructions for the disposal of our exhibits.

3. Previous to the receipt of the Prince of Wales' proposal, the Governor was of opinion that this Colony could go to no further expense in connection with the exhibits now in London, and that we must decline to bind ourselves to any expenditure in connection with a permanent Colonial Exhibition. It was thought that the gold exhibited should be sold, and that such of the exhibits as are of interest, and would be of use in connection with a museum here, should be sent back to the Colony, though articles on which the freight would amount to too large a sum should not be sent. At the same time, however, it was intended to authorise you, after conferring with, and with the concurrence of, the Secretary of State, to make any temporary arrangement which seemed expedient for the further exhibition of any of the articles sent from here, either in charge of some other Colonial, or of some Imperial authority, if it could be arranged that the products could remain on view without cost to this Government. The gold, however, it was considered, should be sold in any case on the close of the present exhibition in November. So soon as other exhibits, not suitable for return to the Colony for a local museum, would no longer be required for exhibition in London, either in November or on the termination of any temporary further arrangement as above described, it was intended that they should also be sold, but you were to be empowered, in a limited number of special cases, to present some of this class of articles (i.e., articles not suited for return for a local museum) to scientific institutions on the part of the Colony. It was thought, for instance, that the Kew authorities might be glad of the large logs of Jarrah for their museum.

4. As before stated, however, the aspect of the question is materially altered by the proposal now made by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales. It seems not improbable that the idea of founding an Imperial Colonial and Indian Institute in London, as a memorial of Her Majesty's Jubilee, will be warmly taken up, and, as you are aware, the Legislature of Western Australia have already voted £5,000 for the celebration of the Jubilee by this Colony. The Government of Western Australia have, therefore, funds at command which, if deemed advisable, might, in whole or in part, be allotted to the proposed Institute.

5. I enclose, for your information, copy of the *Gazette* containing His Excellency the Governor's reply to the Prince of Wales' telegram, and copy of the *Gazette* notice appointing a commission to consider the matter. Should His Royal Highness' proposal be acted upon, it is not improbable that this Colony may be able to give a considerable sum (for it) of money down, and also all the exhibits (except perhaps the gold) which are the property of the Government, as a donation towards the establishment of the "Imperial Colonial and Indian Institute"; but His Excellency does not think that this Government would consent, at present, to bind itself to anything further, in the shape of an annual contribution or otherwise.

6. In the event of the establishment of the Institute being assured, you had better, until further instructed, consider that the exhibits will be dealt with in the manner just stated. Should, as is not probable, the idea of the Jubilee Institute be given up, the instructions contained in the earlier part of this letter can be acted upon.

7. You will be communicated with, or you will learn what action has been decided upon, by telegraph, so soon as His Excellency is in a position to reply fully to the Prince of Wales' proposal.

SIR,

For the information of His Excellency the Governor I have to report, that acting under instructions—"that all the gold that may be forwarded should be sold at the close of the Exhibition, the proceeds "are not to be expended or drawn against in any way, but must be repaid to General Revenue,"—I have sent to the Crown Agents for the Colonies all the parcels that were in this Court, requesting them to sell to the best advantage and to place the proceeds to the credit of the Colony. I enclose copies of their report and of the account sales, which show that the sum of £688 16s. 9d. has been realised.

In His Excellency's despatch to the Secretary of State, No. 169, dated 2nd July, 1886, copy of which has reached me from the Colonial Office, the total weights are given as 200 oz. 5 dwts. 22 grs., whereas the gross weight given by Messrs. Mocatta & Goldsmid is 199·675 oz. I can only account for this difference in weight of about half-an-ounce by the facts, that Mr. Hardman had a small sample of first parcel for assay, and that in a letter from the Acting Colonial Secretary, dated 2nd July, he concludes—"In addition to this amount about eight ounces were forwarded on the 31st January last;" so I may presume that the first parcel was really a little under the exact weight particularised in the above-mentioned despatch.

It will be observed that the gold is of very good quality, but about 10 per cent. of weight has been lost in the gravel and dirt imbedded in the nuggets.

The Crown Agents' letter has reached me too late for the mail which left yesterday, so this report will be delayed until next mail on the 26th.

Sir,

I have to report, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, that acting under his instructions, dated 23rd September last, I have disposed of the Government Exhibits in this Court, in the manner shown in the accompanying documents.

The sale of the gold was, I consider, a very satisfactory one, but this I deal with in a separate letter.

The big jarrah log, with a large assortment of timber, goes to Kew, as suggested; Mr. Keane having very kindly placed it at my disposal for the purpose.

The departure from the first idea of leaving the present Exhibition intact for another year has given considerable trouble and inconvenience to the Executive Commissioners just at the last, for until the 20th the change of plan was not known, though suspected.

It is now understood that the buildings for Imperial Institute will be commenced in 1887, but probably from three to four years will elapse before it is ready for occupation.

The Geological and Mineralogical collection sent home by Mr. Nicolay will be returned by first ship; it has been packed ready.

All the vouchers and accounts connected with this Court I have retained in my possession, and so soon as practicable after my return they shall be placed in the hands of the Auditor General in complete form.

I hope the form of this report, as shown by accompanying papers, will be found intelligible, and that His Excellency will approve of my action with regard to the distribution of the Government exhibits. Those belonging to private individuals have been disposed of by my assistant, Mr. Thomson, acting under instructions he brought to England with him.

SIR, South Kensington, S.W., 24th November, 1886.

At our interview this morning it was arranged that you would take charge of the exhibits now in the Western Australian Court, with a view to their disposal, either by sale or to be stored until the Imperial Institute building is ready for their reception. On behalf of the Government of Western Australia, I have to thank you very much for undertaking this. I have today gone over the Court with Mr. Bowring, the officer you appointed, and have handed to him the inventory of its contents, which had previously been checked over by Mr. Cunliffe Owen.

I may suggest that such of the contents of the Court as you may deem unsuited to the purposes of the projected Institute should be sold to the best advantage, and the proceeds, after deducting necessary charges, handed to the Crown Agents of the Colonies to be placed to the credit of the Western Australian Government; the furniture and the pearl shell trophy are among the things that I think should be sold, the first because it will damage, I am informed by experts, from being kept any longer in the present damp building, and the latter because it will not bear removal whole, and the shells can easily be replaced at a future time by others sent from the Colony; the trophies of natives' weapons and other implements can be dismantled, and the different articles stored in the same cases as they came from Western Australia in. The large show case or pavilion made of the different woods of the Colony, and containing stuffed specimens of birds and mammals, should be if practicable removed entire.

Again thanking you for relieving me of my charge at this juncture when I am obliged to leave, to return to my official duties, and for your courtesy and kindness to me personally continued throughout the whole period, now nearly ten months, during which I have been connected with the Exhibition of 1886,

SIR,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 24th instant, and in accordance with the instructions I have received from Sir Francis Knollys on the part of the Prince of Wales, I am prepared at the present moment to take over the collections of the Western Australian Government which have been shown at the Colonial and Indian Exhibition, an inventory of which I have in my possession.

In accordance with your wishes those objects which it is considered will be of use for the Imperial Institute will be stored in a suitable place, and those you wish to be disposed of by sale shall be sold accordingly to the best advantage; the proceeds arising from such sale will be placed to the credit of your Government at the Crown Agents, and a report shall be sent to you of the whole transaction.
