Order in Council.

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under 43rd Victoria, No. 23.

HEREAS it has been reported that an infectious or contagious disease of a malignant nature, to wit, Pleuro-pneumonia, has broken out amongst cattle in the district of East Kimberley on the Ord River, and whereas the Governor-in-Council has power under the 4th Sub-section of the 3rd Section of the 43rd Victoria, No. 23, in such case, to make an Order, published in the Government Gazette, authorising some person or persons to be named in such Order to make such orders and give such directions as may seem to him or them necessary under the circumstances of the case: Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by this Order made in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, order and direct that the Government Residents in East and West Kimberley and the Warden of the Goldfields do make such orders and give such directions as may seem to them or any one or two of them to be necessary to prevent the spread of pleuro-pneumonia amongst cattle.

Government Secretary's Office, Sandakan, 14th January, 1887,

Sir,—In view of the fact that several diggers from the Colonies have recently arrived here with the object of working gold in the Segama District, I am directed by the Governor of British North Borneo to request you to be good enough to bring to the notice of His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia the advisability of taking steps to notify Gold diggers in your Colony that, owing to the tropical climate and heavy rainfall, the fields here are not of a nature to be profitably worked by white men who have not capital to enable them to employ native or Chinese labour, and further that at mesent there exists no Chinese labour, and further that at present there exists no suitable overland route to the fields through the dense jungle, nor are there any facilities for obtaining supplies and provisions except from a great distance.

As will be seen from the copies of the Government notifications of the 17th January, 1883, and the 26th August, 1886, which I have the honor to enclose, this August, 1886, which I have the honor to enclose, this Government refuses to allow persons to land in the territory unless they can show that they are in possession of sufficient means of livelihood, and that for the present they reserve the right of refusing permits to Europeans, Australians, or Americans to reside or work in the Segama Goldfields District.

PROCLAMATION

BY WILLIAM HOOD TREACHER, ESQUIRE, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of North Borneo

WILLIAM HOOD TREACHER, [L.s.]

WE do hereby direct and proclaim that any person arriving in any of the ports of the Territory of North Borneo may, at the discretion of the Officer-in-charge at the Port of arrival, be refused permission to land unless he can show that he is in possession of sufficient means of livelihood, or can produce a landing ticket from some recognised agent of the North Borneo Government at the Port of departure.

And we do further direct and proclaim that the master of any vessel bringing to Ports in the said Territory persons who are so refused permission to land and for the above mentioned reasons, may be required to keep such persons on board at the risk and charge of the ship during her stay in any North Borneo Port, and to take away with him the said persons on departure, under a penalty of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS in each case.

WHEREAS by section three of an Act passed in the forty-eighth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Imported Stock Act Amendment Act of 1884," it is enacted that the term "Stock" shall, in addition to cattle and sheep, include goats, swine, dogs, and such other animals as the Governor may, by Proclamatical States of the Control of and such other animals as the Governor may, by Proclamation, published in the Government Gazette, declare to be subject to the provisions of the said Act, and of "The Imported Stock Act of 1871:" And whereas by section ten of the said last-mentioned Act the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas there is reason to believe that both And whereas there is reason to believe that both infectious and contagious diseases in stock at the present infectious and contagious diseases in stock at the present time exist throughout Furope, Asia, Africa, and America, and all other parts of the world except the Australian Colonies: Now, therefore, I, Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, prohibit the importation or introduction of any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine from Europe, Asia, Africa, or America, or any place not being within the Australian Colonies, as defined by the said last mentioned Act, for a further period of twelve months, from the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Proclamation by His Excellency the Right Honourable Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

W HEREAS by section ten of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, published in the Supplementary Government Gazette of 8th January, 1885, pursuant to the provisions of "The Imported Stock Act of 1871," amongst other things Scab in Sheep was declared to be an infectious or contagious disease: And whereas there is reason to believe that Scab at the present time exists in sheep both in the Colony of New Zealand and also in the Colony of Western Australia: Now, therefore, I, CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that no sheep, fodder, or fittings used for sheep shall be imported or introduced into this Colony for a further period of twelve months from 5th instant, from either of the Colonies of New Zealand or Western Australia.
