THE said Governor do hereby, by virtue of the Ordinance 21 Victoria, No. 12, entitled "An Ordinance to extend and enlarge the provisions of an Ordinance passed in the twelfth year of the reign of Her Present Majesty, intituled 'An Ordinance for the regulation of Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction in the Colony of Western Australia, and for other purposes relating thereto,'" notify, declare, and direct that the houses, buildings, erections, and enclosures now used and occupied at and in the Townships of Derby, and Wyndham (East Kimberley), for the confinement and reception of prisoners, shall henceforth be Legal Public Gaols and Prisons of and belonging to the said Colony, for the purposes mentioned in the said Ordinance.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH-WEST COAST—
HAMELIN BAY.

The following information has been received from Staff Commander J. E. Coghlan, R.N., in charge of the Admiralty Survey of Western Australia, the result of a recent examination of Hamelin Bay on the South-West Coast of Australia :—

[All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation 5° 50' West-
erly in 1887.]

SOUTH ROCK.—A depth of only 13 feet (instead of 18 feet) has recently been found on this danger, which lies in the fairway of Hamelin Bay.

A black buoy with red staff and ball has been moored over South Rock, with the following marks :—Knobby Head (North extreme of Cape Hamelin) in line with East extreme of Peak Island, South; Mushroom Rock in line with cranes on inner end of jetty, S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; and Edith Ledge summit W. by N.

White Cliff Point in line with East end of Peak Island, S.S.E., leads Westward of South Rock, and is a good leading mark into Hamelin Bay from the Northward.

Moorings.—Heavy moorings ($2\frac{1}{2}$ ton anchors, and $2\frac{1}{4}$ inch chains) have been laid down by Messrs. Davies & Co. for the convenience and safety of vessels calling at the Bay. The outer moorings, in 6 fathoms, are distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables Northward from Peak Island, with the East extreme of Hamelin Island in line with the West extreme of Peak Island, S.S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. Similar moorings have been laid down in the Inner Harbor (Southward of Peak Island).

Jetty has been lengthened to 1,800 feet, enabling vessels using the inner moorings to haul alongside.

Beacons have been erected on Hamelin Island to guide vessels into the Inner Harbor. The front beacon is painted *white*, and the back one *red*, with triangular heads 16 feet above the ground, and when in line bear S. 51° W. and N. 51° E.

Inner Harbor.—Owing to the heavy moorings and other improvements Inner Harbor may be considered a secure haven for vessels of less than 15 feet draught. In addition to the beacons on Hamelin Island the channel into the harbor from the Northward is also marked by *black* buoys. Sailing vessels from the Southward making use of the Inner Harbor are recommended to pass through Lisle Channel (between Old Man Rock and Edith Ledge), and to anchor in 5 fathoms abreast of the outer moorings, with the beacons on Hamelin Island in line (S. 51° W.), when the pilot attached to Messrs. Davies & Co.'s Timber Station will board them.

I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do hereby, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested by “The Private Bonded Warehouses Act, 1883,” license the private warehouse, building, or place of security hereinafter described, that is to say, two rooms, each measuring thirty-nine feet in length and twenty-nine feet in width, on separate floors, also, one cellar eighty-five feet long by twenty-nine feet wide; the whole of the said compartments being part of warehouse and offices situate in Henry Street, Fremantle, —and do appoint the same to be a Private Bonded Ware-

WHEREAS it has been reported that an infectious or contagious disease of a malignant nature, to wit, Pleuro-pneumonia, has broken out amongst cattle in the district of East Kimberley on the Ord River, and whereas the Governor-in-Council has power under the 4th Sub-section of the 3rd Section of the 43rd Victoria, No. 23, in such case, to make an Order, published in the *Government Gazette*, authorising some person or persons to be named in such Order to make such orders and give such directions as may seem to him or them necessary under the circumstances of the case: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by this Order made in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, order and direct that the Government Residents in East and West Kimberley and the Warden of the Goldfields do make such orders and give such directions as may seem to them or any one or two of them to be necessary to prevent the spread of pleuro-pneumonia amongst cattle.

Report of the Registrar General on the Vital Statistics of Western Australia for the year 1886.

BIRTHS.

There were registered during the year 1886, 1466 Births,—787 males and 679 females. This is an increase of 266 on that of 1885.

DEATHS.

There have been 806 Deaths registered during 1886,—525 males and 281 females. The number of Deaths in 1885 was 600.

It will be seen that 36.60 per cent. of Deaths were children under the age of 5 years; and 28.16 per cent. were children under 1 year. The large percentage of infant mortality is due to an epidemic of Whooping Cough, which made its appearance in the latter part of 1885. The deaths stated from this cause were 61, or 7.56 of the total deaths.

The following Meteorological information is furnished by the Government Reporter :—

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Perth Observatory was 109°, on the 15th February; and the lowest 34°, on the 28th June.

The greatest range of temperature took place on the 26th April, 1st May, and 17th December.
