THE CHIEF INSPECTOR OF STOCK, WESTERN AUSTRALIA. SIR

I have the honor to direct your attention to the fact that the disease Tuberculosis in cattle has, by an Order of the Governor in Council, dated 25th January, 1887, been placed on the second schedule to the Regulations, dated 19th March, 1880, under the Diseases in Stock Act, 1872, of this colony.

The result of this step will be that cattle suffering from tuberculosis will be dealt with in Victoria in the same manner as cattle suffering from pleuro.

You will perhaps deem it advisable to disseminate this information amongst stockowners in Western Australia.
