Order in Council.

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under the 39th Victoria, No. 13.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of the Second Section of "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Act, 1875," it is lawful for the Governor, in Council, from time to time to make regulations with regard, *inter alia*, to the provisioning of the ships employed in connection with diving for pearl shells: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do make this Regulation in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, namely:—

There shall be supplied to every person engaged in diving for or otherwise collecting pearl shells, who shall have been at sea for ten (10) days, as part of the provisioning of such persons, a daily ration of lime juice.

Such lime juice shall be inspected and approved by a Collector of Customs or by a Government Resident or by the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, or by some person deputed by a Collector of Customs or by a Government Resident, and after such inspection and approval there shall be added, in the presence of the approving officer, so much proper and palatable proof spirit as to amount to fifteen per centum of the whole.

For every five persons there shall be mixed five ounces of such lime juice and spirit with five ounces of sugar and three pints of water, to be served to and taken by the men at dinner.

Should any man refuse or neglect to drink the said mixture of such lime juice, spirit, sugar, and water, every such refusal or neglect must be entered in the official log book of the ship.

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under 43rd Victoria, No. 23.

WHEREAS it has been reported that an infectious or contagious disease of a malignant nature, to wit, Pleuro-pneumonia, has broken out amongst cattle in the district of East Kimberley on the Ord River, and whereas the Governor-in-Council has power under the 4th Sub-section of the 3rd Section of the 43rd Victoria, No. 23, in such case, to make an Order, published in the *Government Gazette*, authorising some person or persons to be named in such Order to make such orders and give such directions as may seem to him or them necessary under the circumstances of the case: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by this Order made in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, order and direct that the Government Residents in East and West Kimberley and the Warden of the Goldfields do make such orders and give such directions as may seem to them or any one or two of them to be necessary to prevent the spread of pleuro-pneumonia amongst cattle.
