HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legisla-tive Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on THURS-DAY, THE SIXTEENTH DAY OF JUNE NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

# NOTICE TO MARINERS.

 $No. 8 \ of 1887.$ ALTERATION IN LIGHT, GOODE ISLAND, TORRES STRAIT. NOTICE is hereby given, that on and after the 22nd instant, the Temporary Light, formerly exhibited at the Old Signal Station on Goode Island, will be done away with, and a 4th order Dioptric

Light will be exhibited from the New Tower, built on the Western Hill of that Island, the elevation of which is shown on the chart as being 327 feet. The Light is visible from a N.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. to a S.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W.bearing when it is shut in by the high land of Hammond Island. While the light is in sight from the westward, vessels will be clear of the Gerard

Banks. The Light stands at an elevation of 345 feet, and will be visible in fine weather from a distance of 24 miles. The Signal Station is also moved to the same hill.

2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents, under the orders of the Director of Army Remount Operations for India.

3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 15th September to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th August. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and marcs of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III remounts three years old and marcs in foal will not be purchased.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

The average price for a Waler remount has been fixed at £50 sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the current rate of exchange. The average price for all other remounts is Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separ-ately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed the above limits. (Signed) E. H. H. # Order in Council.

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under the 39th Victoria, No. 13.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of the Second Section of "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Act, 1875," it is lawful for the Governor, in Council, from time to time to make regulations with regard, *inter alia*, to the provisioning of the ships employed in connection with diving for pearl shells: Now THEREFORE I, Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do make this Regulation in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, namely:—

- There shall be supplied to every person engaged in diving for or otherwise collecting pearl shells, who shall have been at sea for ten (10) days, as part of the provisioning of such persons, a daily ration of lime juice.
- Such lime juice shall be inspected and approved by a Collector of Customs or by a Government Resident or by the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, or by some person deputed by a Collector of Customs or by a Government Resident, and after such inspection and approval there shall be added, in the presence of the approving officer, so much proper and palatable proof spirit as to amount to fifteen per centum of the whole.
- For every five persons there shall be mixed five ounces of such lime juice and spirit with five ounces of sugar and three pints of water, to be served to and taken by the men at dinner.
- Should any man refuse or neglect to drink the said mixture of such lime juice, spirit, sugar, and water, every such refusal or neglect must be entered in the official log book of the ship.


