- 2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents, under the orders of the Director of Army Remount Operations for India.
- 3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 15th September to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th August. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.
- 4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.
  - 5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.
- 6. The average price for a Waler remount has been fixed at £5t sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the current rate of exchange. The average price for all other remounts is Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed the above limits.

HEREAS it has been reported that an infectious or contagious disease of a malignant nature, to wit, Pleuro-pneumonia, has broken out amongst cattle in the district of East Kimberley on the Ord River, and whereas the Governor-in-Council has power under the 4th Sub-section of the 3rd Section of the 43rd Victoria, No. 23, in such case, to make an Order, published in the Government Gazette, authorising some person or persons to be named in such Order to make such orders and give such directions as may seem to him or them necessary under the circumstances of the case: Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do by this Order made in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, order and direct that the Government Residents in East and West Kimberley and the Warden of the Goldfields do make such orders and give such directions as may seem to them or any one or two of them to be necessary to prevent the spread of pleuro-pneumonia amongst cattle.

## A BILL for the Amendment of "The Postage Stamp Ordinance, 1854."

THEREAS at the Postal Congress holden at Lisbon in the year of our Lord 1885, a Resolution was unanimously passed the effect that the various Postal Administrations should mutually assist each other in prosecuting frauds in respect of counterfeit Postage Stamps, which frauds should be punished according to the laws of the countries in which such Stamps were issued.

And whereas, in pursuance of the said Resolution, the French and German Post Offices thereupon introduced into their respective Legislatures laws for the punishment of persons found engaged in the manufacture or issue of counterfeit Postage Stamps.

And whereas it is expedient that the United Kingdom and its Colonial Dependencies should take steps similar to those taken by the Republic of France and the Empire of Germany for carrying out the said Resolution.

And whereas "The Postage Stamp Ordinance, 1854," provides only for the punishment of forgery and fraud in respect of the Post Office of this Colony:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THAT if any person shall forge or counterfeit, or cause or procure to be forged or counterfeited, any die, plate, or other Felony to forge instrument, or any part of any die, plate, or other instrument which hath been or shall or may be provided, made, or used by or under the direction of any competent person, authority, department, or Government in or of the United Kingdom or any of its Dependencies, India, or any Foreign Country or State, or which said die, plate, or other instrument shall on the face thereof appear or purport to have been provided, made, or used by or under such direction for the purpose of expressing or denoting any of the rates or duties which are or shall be directed to be charged under or by virtue of the authority contained in the said recited Ordinance; or if any person shall forge, counterfeit, or imitate, or cause or procure to be forged, counterfeited, or imitated, the stamp, mark, or impression, or any part of the stamp, mark, or impression of any such die, plates, or other instruments upon any paper or other substance, or material whatever; or if any person shall, without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on the person accused), have in his possession any such false, forged, or counterfeit die, plate, or other instrument, or part of any such die, plate, or other instrument as aforesaid; or if any person shall stamp or mark, or cause or procure to be stamped or marked, any paper or other substance, or material

whatsoever, with any such false, forged, or counterfeit die, plate, or other instrument as aforesaid; or if any person shall use, utter, sell, or expose to sale, or shall cause or procure to be used, uttered, sold, or exposed to sale, or shall knowingly, and without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on the person accused), have in his possession any paper or other substance or material having thereon the impression, or any part of the impression, of any such false, forged, or counterfeit die, plate, or other instrument as aforesaid, or having thereon any forged, false, or counterfeit stamps or impressions, resembling or representing, either wholly or in part, or intended or liable to pass or to be mistaken for the stamps, marks, or impressions of any such die, plate, or other instrument which hath been or shall or may be so provided, made, or used as aforesaid, knowing such false, forged, or counterfeit stamp, mark, or impression to be false, forged, or counterfeit; or if any person shall with evil intent privately or fraudulently use, or cause or procure to be privately or fraudulently used, any die, plate, or other instrument so provided, made, or used as aforesaid, or shall, with such intent, privately or fraudulently stamp or mark, or cause or procure to be stamped or marked, any paper or other substance, or material whatsoever, with any such die, plate, or other instrument as last aforesaid; or if any person shall knowingly, and without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall be on the person accused), have in his possession any paper, or other substance or material, so privately or fraudulently stamped or marked as aforesaid: then, and in every such case, every person so offending, and every person knowingly and wilfully aiding, abetting, or assisting any person in committing any such offence, and being thereof lawfully convicted, shall be adjudged guilty of felony, and shall be liable, at the discretion of the Court, to be kept in penal servitude for any term not less than seven years, or be imprisoned for a term not exceeding four years nor less than two years, with or without hard labor, as the Court shall award.

Fixing on letters stamp once before used.

THAT if any person shall fraudulently get off or remove, or cause or procure to be gotten off or removed, from any letter or cover, or any paper or other substance or material, the stamp or impression of any die, plate, or other instrument so provided, made, or used, or hereafter to be provided, made, or used as aforesaid, with intent to use, join, fix, or place such stamp or impression for, with, or upon any other letter, cover, paper or other substance or material; or if any person shall fraudulently use, join, fix, or place for, with, or upon any letter or cover, or any paper or other substance or material, any such stamp or impression as aforesaid which shall have been gotten off or removed from any other letter, cover, paper, or other substance or material; or if any person shall fraudulently erase, cut, scrape, discharge, or get out of, or from, or shall cause or procure to be so erased, cut, scraped, discharged, or gotten out of or from any letter or cover, or any paper or other substance or material, any name, date, or other matter or thing therein written, printed, or expressed, with intent to use such stamps or mark then impressed or being upon such letter, cover, paper or other substance or material, or that the same may be used for any fraudulent purpose, every person so offending in any of the several cases in this clause mentioned shall, upon summary conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

Construction.

- 3. THAT this Act may be read and construed with "The Postage Stamp Ordinance, 1854."
- 4. THAT this Act may be cited as "The Postage Stamp Ordinance, 1854, Amendment Act, 1887."

#### BILL to empower Coroners to make $\mathbf{A}$ inquiry into the Causes of Fires.

E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

THAT every Coroner and every person entitled to act and acting as Coroner shall have, by virtue of his office, jurisdiction to Jurisdiction of Corinquire into the cause and origin of any fire whereby the life of oner to make inquiry into the causes of man or beast has been lost or endangered; or whereby any building, fires. ship, or merchandise, or any stack of corn or hay, or any growing crop, or any trees, saplings, bushes, shrubs, plants, grass, stubble, or scrub has been destroyed or damaged.

THAT such Coroner and every such person may issue his warrant for the apprehension and commitment of any person who coroner may issue shall be found by the jury upon such inquisition to have wilfully warrant. set on fire any building, ship, or other property in the first section of this Act mentioned.

3. THIS Act may be cited as "The Fire Inquiry Act, 1887." Short Title.

## A BILL for the establishment of a Copyright Register.

WHEREAS the Imperial Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland has enacted the "International Copyright Act, 1886:" Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows: -

THAT a Copyright Register be established in this Colony, in manner following:

Registration of Copyright.

A Book of Registry wherein may be registered, as hereinafter enacted, the proprietorship in the copyright of books and assignments thereof, and in dramatic and musical pieces, whether in manuscript or otherwise, and licenses affecting such copyright, shall be kept by the Registrar General at his office, and shall at all convenient times be open to the inspection of any person on payment of One shilling for every entry which shall be searched for or inspected in the said book; and the Registrar General shall, whenever thereunto reasonably required, give a copy of any entry in such book, certified under his hand and impressed with his stamp, to any person requiring the same, on payment to him of the sum of Five shillings; and such copies so certified and impressed shall be received in evidence in all Courts and in all summary proceedings, and shall be premá facie proof of the proprietorship or assignment of copyright or license as therein expressed but subject to be rebutted by other evidence, and in the case of dramatic or musical pieces shall be primâ facie proof of the right of representation or performance, subject to be rebutted as aforesaid.

2. THAT if any person shall wilfully make or cause to be Making false entry a made any false entry in the said book of registry, or shall wilfully produce or cause to be tendered in evidence any paper falsely purporting to be a copy of any entry in the said book, he shall be guilty of an indictable misdemeanor, and shall be punished accordingly.

Entries of Copyright in book of registry.

THAT after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for the proprietor of copyright in any book heretofore published, or in any book hereafter to be published, to make entry in the book of registry of the title of such book, the time of the first publication thereof, and the name and place of abode of the proprietor of the copyright of the said book or of any portion of such copyright, in the form in that behalf given in the Schedule to this Act annexed, upon payment of the sum of Five shillings to the Registrar General; and that it shall be lawful for every such registered proprietor to assign his interest or any portion of his interest therein by making entry in the said book of registry of such assignment and of the name and place of abode of the assignee thereof, in the form given in that behalf in the said Schedule, on payment of the like sum; and such assignment so entered shall be effectual in law, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, without being subject to any stamp or duty, and shall be of the same force and effect as if such assignment had been made by deed.

Persons aggrieved by any entry in the book of registry may apply to the Supreme Court or Judge.

THAT if any person shall deem himself aggrieved by any entry made under color of this Act in the said book of registry, it shall be lawful for such person to apply by motion to the Supreme Court, or if such Court be not sitting to apply by summons to any Judge of such Court, for an order that such entry may be expunged or varied; and that upon such application by motion or summons to the said Court or to a Judge as aforesaid, such Court or Judge shall make such order for expunging, varying, or confirming such entry either with or without costs as to such Court or Judge shall seem just; and the Registrar General shall, on the production to him of any such order for expunging or varying any such entry, expunge or vary the same according to the requisitions of such order.

THAT the forms in the Schedule to this Act be used for the purposes respectively indicated.

# A BILL to amend the Law respecting Quarantine.

WHEREAS it is expedient to determine questions that have arisen in respect of Quarantine: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. IN case it shall be deemed necessary by the Governor to appoint any medical officer to take charge of any of the crew and Liability of passengers of a vessel placed in quarantine, the Governor may fix owner as to services the amount of remuneration to be paid to such medical officer for of Medical Officer for quarantined persons. his services, and cause the same to be paid by the Colonial Treasurer; and the amount so paid shall be repaid to the Colonial Treasurer by the owners or agents of such vessel before she shall be permitted to clear out and leave the port in which she shall then be.

IT shall be the duty of the owners and agents of any vessel placed in quarantine to supply the crew and passengers thereof with Liability of ship owner as to supply such wholesome and suitable provisions and medicines as shall be

of food and medicine to quarantined persons.

required by the medical officer in charge; and if such provisions and medicines are not forthwith supplied accordingly, the same may be provided under the order of the Governor, and the cost thereof, including the conveyance of the same, shall be paid by the said owners or agents into the hands of the medical officer, as agent for the Colonial Treasurer, before such vessel shall be permitted to clear out or leave the port in which she shall then be.

Liability of ship owner as to pilotage.

3. THE owners and agents of any vessel placed in quarantine shall be liable to pay all charges incurred in and about the piloting or towing of such vessel into or out of port, or from one place to another in port; and shall pay such charges into the hands of the Harbor Master, as agent for the Colonial Treasurer, before such vessel shall be permitted to clear out or leave the port in which she shall then be.

Of persons in quarantine unable to support themselves.

- 4. ANY person detained in quarantine on land, or in any vessel other than that in which he was a passenger to this Colony, who is unable to support himself and those, if any, who being with him are dependent on him, who at any time during such detention:
- (1.) Shall make a declaration in the Form A in the Schedule to this Act, shall be entitled, in the discretion of the medical officer in charge, to be supplied either with food for himself and those, if any, who being with him are dependent on him, or with money at the rate of five shillings per diem for each person above the age of twelve years, two shillings and sixpence per diem for each person not above the age of three years, and one shilling per diem for each person not above the age of three years. But if the supply be of food, each day's supply to each person shall, in computing the amount due to the Colonial Treasurer, be reckoned in each case as equivalent to so much money as would have been payable had the supply been in money.
- (2.) Shall make a declaration in the Form B in the Schedule to this Act, shall be entitled, in the discretion of the medical officer in charge, to be supplied either with food for himself and those, if any, who being with him are dependent on him, or with money at the rate of three shillings per diem for each person above the age of twelve years, one shilling and sixpence per diem for each person not above the age of three years, and ninepence per diem for each person not above the age of three years.

In counting the number of days, a broken day shall be

reckoned as a whole day.

Any person making a declaration in Form A or B and stating therein anything false to his own knowledge shall be liable, on summary conviction before two Justices of the Peace, to be imprisoned with or without hard labor for any period not shorter than one nor longer than six calendar months.

Of persons in quarantine able to support themselves.

5. NO person not making a declaration in the Form A or B in the Schedule to this Act shall be entitled to receive any supply of food or of money, but shall pay to the medical officer, as agent for the Colonial Treasurer, for the maintenance of himself and those, if any, who being with him are dependent on him, such an amount of money as shall in the opinion of the medical officer be equivalent to the food and other necessaries supplied at his actual or implied request to him, and to those, if any, with him and dependent on him. Should such person refuse to pay such money or any part thereof to the medical officer, the Resident Magistrate at the port at or near to which such person was quarantined shall, at or near the

time of the expiration of such quarantine, issue a warrant to be served on such person, and on such person being brought before him on such warrant shall adjudge him to pay such sum as to him shall, under the circumstances, seem just, and in default of such payment such person shall be imprisoned with or without hard labor for not more than six calendar months; such imprisonment shall not extinguish the debt, but such person may be sued for the same by the Colonial Treasurer. Provided always, that if before the termination of such imprisonment the said sum be paid by or on behalf of such person, such imprisonment shall cease and determine.

6. THIS Act may be cited as "The Quarantine Act, 1887."

# A BILL for the purpose of protecting certain Policies of Life Insurance from Creditors.

WHEREAS it is expedient to protect small Life Insurance Policies from Creditors: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Protection of certain Life Policies from creditors. 1. THE property and interest of any person, to the extent of One thousand pounds in the whole of the sum or sums assured together with bonus additions, in any policy or policies of assurance on his own life issued after the passing of this Act shall not be subject to be seized or taken in execution under the process of any Court, and in the event of the bankruptcy of such person shall not vest in the trustee of his estate unless such bankruptcy occurs within Two years after the date of the policy, and on the death of such person shall not be assets for the payment of his debts; but if he dies within Two years after the date of the policy a portion of the sum so protected, equal to the amount of premiums actually paid, shall be assets for the payment of his debts. In this section the term "Bankruptcy" includes liquidation by arrangement or composition with creditors under any Act now or hereafter to be in force.

Election of policy or part of policy to be protected.

IF any policy holder entitled to protection under the last 2. preceding section shall be the holder of two or more policies assuring a greater amount in the whole than One thousand pounds, he, or in the case of his death his personal representatives, shall be entitled after the happening of the event by reason of which the necessity for the protection arises, by notice in writing left at the offices of the company or companies liable under such policies respectively, to elect which of such policies or what parts thereof respectively up to the said sum of One thousand pounds in the whole shall be protected as aforesaid. If such policy holder or his personal representatives shall fail so to elect, within fourteen days after being requested so to do by the person who would be entitled to such policies but for the said protection or by any creditor by notice in writing served upon him or them personally or left at or posted to his or their last known place of residence in Western Australia, then the person otherwise entitled as aforesaid may, or in default of such person the said creditor on behalf of himself and the whole body of creditors may, elect in like The said person or the said creditor, as the case may be, may thereupon proceed to have his title registered to such policy or policies, or such part or parts thereof respectively as he by such election becomes entitled to; and where the interest in any policy is divided under this or the preceding section the bonus additions, if any, to such policy shall be divided in the same proportions as the amount of the policy, and be disposed of in the same manner.

Title to policy to be registered.

- 3. THE registration in the last preceding section mentioned shall be in a book to be kept for the purpose of registering titles to policies by the principal officer or agent managing the life assurance business of the company in Western Australia.
- 4. THIS Act may be cited as "The Life Policy Protection Act, 1887."
