WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; NOW THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on THURSDAY, THE SIXTEENTH DAY OF JUNE NEXT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

A BILL to amend the Laws relative to Juries.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. THAT in lieu of the payment in the 23rd and 24th Sections of "The Jury Act, 1871," mentioned, there be allowed and paid to jurors who travel or can travel by railway no more than the amount of the railway fare in respect of such part of the journey as they travel or can travel by railway.

Railway fare payable to jurors.

2. THAT in all criminal cases, not capital, in which a jury shall have been discharged without giving a verdict after twenty-four hours of confinement, it shall be lawful, on the case being again tried, for the Judge to accept a verdict stated by the foreman of the jury in open Court to have been agreed to by not fewer than nine of the jury.

Verdict by majority.

3. THAT this Act may be cited as "The Jury Amendment Act, 1887."

Short title.

A BILL to extend the Jurisdiction of Magistrates.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. TRIBAL murder is hereby constituted a felony under the criminal law of this Colony, and shall mean and be the killing of an aboriginal native by another aboriginal native in pursuance of a native custom or superstition.

Tribal murder.

2. WHEN an aboriginal native is charged before Justices with the murder of an aboriginal native, such Justices may, if they be of opinion that the case is one of tribal murder, commit the prisoner for trial at the nearest District Court of Quarter Sessions on a charge of tribal murder, and such prisoner on conviction thereof shall be sentenced to penal servitude for life, or for any term not less than five years.

Punishment for tribal murder.

Larceny of property
not exceeding £10 in
value.

3. IN any case of larceny, where the property stolen does not exceed Ten pounds in value, two Justices in petty sessions may convict the prisoner, unless in their discretion they think the ends of justice would be better served by committing him for trial. Should they convict they may sentence such prisoner to a period of imprisonment with hard labor not exceeding twelve months. Provided always, that if a previous conviction for larceny, embezzlement, or obtaining money by false pretences be proved against such prisoner, the said Justices may sentence him to any period of imprisonment with hard labor not exceeding two years.

4. NOTWITHSTANDING the 5th section of the Act 47 Victoria, No. 6, the Crown Solicitor shall have the power of filing informations and acting as a Grand Jury as and being a public prosecutor, but only in cases committed for trial before District Courts of Quarter Sessions.

Appointment of
Public Prosecutors.

5. THE Governor may appoint, temporarily or otherwise, any member of the bar of this Colony, of five years standing, to be a public prosecutor in any District Court of Quarter Sessions. Such public prosecutor shall have the power of filing informations on behalf of the Attorney General, under the Act 47 Victoria, No. 6.

N O T I C E .

THE question having arisen as to the course to be pursued under the 42nd Section of "The Customs Ordinance, 1860," with regard to *samples* imported into this Colony by Commercial Travellers and others, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the following instructions, which are accordingly issued for the guidance of the Sub-Collectors of Customs at the Outports, and of all Officers and others concerned.

2. Commercial Travellers and others will be allowed to pass their samples on deposit of the duty due, the amount of duty to be decided by examination of the samples when entered inwards, a list of the goods being then taken. When entered outwards for drawback, the shipment is again to be examined and compared with the list, the full duty deposited on importation being refunded *pro rata* on any balance of the shipment, *provided it be exported within two months from date of entry inwards*. The deposit, or the balance thereof after any refund, will be carried to the credit of the Government immediately the goods, or the balance thereof, shall have been exported. If no refund be claimed within two months from date of entry, the whole of the deposit will be carried to the credit of the Government. No refund of duty can be allowed on samples chargeable on importation with an *ad valorem* duty, when such samples are of a less total value than £50.

3. The duty on Jewellery and Watches must be paid in the first instance, or the goods must be bonded.

4. In no case will any refund of duty be allowed, except when samples are exported in original packages, and when the consignment exported exceeds £50 in value.

BY-LAWS.

1. The Local Board of Health shall have power to give notice—30 days—to all owners of property in this district to fill in all Cesspits, and cause Earth-Closets to be substituted in their place.

2. It shall be the duty of all owners of property, in accordance with By-Law No. 1, to furnish at least two galvanized pails not less than five gallons each; also a wooden box for containing sand for the use of the Earth-Closets, the pattern to be subject to the approval of the Health Officer. The one to be in use whilst the other be taken away by the Scavenger for the purpose of being emptied and cleaned.

3. It shall be the duty of all owners of property to furnish to each house and keep in thorough repair a receptacle—subject to the approval of the Inspector of Nuisances—for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which shall be of portable dimensions, and which shall be periodically removed by the Scavenger.

4. It shall be within the power of the Local Board to summon any owner of property who has not complied with the above By-Laws to whom such notice has been given, and the owner of property not complying shall be liable to a penalty of a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such notice is not complied with, and the said Local Board may, if they think fit, subsequently to or in lieu of prosecuting for such non-compliance, execute the works referred to, and the expenses incurred by them in so doing shall be paid by the owners in default, and shall be recoverable in any Court having jurisdiction.

5. No Scavenger shall remove any Night Soil within the limits of the town except between the hours of 11 o'clock, p.m., and 5 o'clock, a.m. Any one found infringing this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

6. All carts used for the purpose of removing such Night Soil, Filth, Rubbish, or any Refuse shall be so constructed that no nuisance shall be caused by the transport, such as leakage, or the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia. All carts must be subject to the approval of the Inspector of Nuisances. Any one not complying with this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
