PROCLAMATION

ddistern Anstralia,) 10 (vit.) (L. s.) F. NAPIER BROOME, *Governor*.

By His Excellency Sir FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

HEREAS by the Ordinance of the 9th Victoria, No. 4, it is made lawful for the Governor by Proclamation from time to time to appoint the times and places when and where the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace for the various districts of this Colony may be holden. AND WHEREAS a Court of General Sessions of the Peace has been duly appointed to be holden at Geraldton on the 1st day of June instant. AND WHEREAS I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers by the said Ordinance in me vested in that behalf, did on the 10th day of May last announce and proclaim that the holding of the said Court was to be postponed from the said 1st day of June to the eighth day of June then and now next ensuing, and such announcement and proclamation, duly published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 12th day of May last, required all persons to take notice and govern themselves accordingly: AND WHEREAS, by the 15th Section of the Act of the 35th Victoria, No. 8, it is enacted that jurors for the trial of issues at meetings of General Sessions of the Peace shall be summoned by virtue of a precept under the hands of two Justices directed to the Sheriff, Bailiff, or other Officer of the Court : AND WHEREAS no such precept has been issued for the summoning of jurors for the trial of issues at the Court of General Sessions of the Peace, to be holden at Geraldton on the eighth day of June next ensuing : AND WHEREAS it is now too late to issue the said precept in due time for the summoning of jurors for the trial of such issues at the said Court : Now THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers by the said Ordinance in me vested in that behalf, do hereby announce and proclaim that the said Court is further postponed to the *fifteenth day of June next ensuing*, and all persons are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Government House, Perth, this 4th day of June, 1887, under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony.
